69 bovines rescued, 3 vehicles seized **STATE TIMES NEWS**

SAMBA: Tightening noose on bovine smugglers and their propagators, Police has today foiled a bovine smuggling attempt in the jurisdiction of Police Station Ghagwal, rescued twelve bovines from the clutches of bovine smugglers and seized vehicle used in the transportation of bovines.
