Gurdeep calls for assessment of losses, compensation for 2 Gujjar Huts gutted in fire

R.S. PURA: A devastating fire broke out on Wednesday afternoon due to an electrical short circuit in the village of Kool Kalan, Arnia area in which two Gujjar community huts completely engulfed in flames. Upon arrival, the firefighting team from the Department of Fire Control managed to contain the fire; however, by then, the homes were reduced to ashes along with all belongings inside. According to reports, around 1 PM on Wednesday, Farooq Hussian and Rasheed Hussian, sons of Joor Hussian, witnessed their homes catching fire suddenly due to an electrical malfunction. Despite the immediate efforts of locals to control the blaze, the intensity of the heat and strong winds exacerbated the situation. Family members trapped

inside the homes narrowly escaped, albeit with great difficulty. Local residents immediately informed the Fire Department, leading to their swift intervention and containment of the fire. Farooq Hussian said that all their belongings were completely destroyed by the fire. He expressed substantial financial losses, amounting to lakhs of rupees. Gurdeep Singh Saini, former Sarpanch urged the government and local administration to provide appropriate assistance to the affected families. He emphasized that families affected by the fire should receive timely support from the government, as many of them now lack shelter and sufficient food supplies. He called for an immediate assessment of the losses incurred by the affected families and urged the authorities to provide

appropriate compensation. He emphasized the urgent need for support to help these families rebuild their lives after such a devastating incident. Gurdeep Saini also informed the Deputy Commissioner Jammu and the SDM of R.S. Pura about the situation, highlighting the impoverished status of the Gurjar community and the significant losses incurred due to the fire.

69 bovines rescued, 3 vehicles seized

SAMBA: Tightening noose on bovine smugglers and their propagators, Police has today foiled a bovine smuggling attempt in the jurisdiction of Police Station Ghagwal, rescued twelve bovines from the clutches of bovine smugglers and seized vehicle used in the transportation of bovines. A Police party of Police Station Ghagwal headed by SHO PS Ghagwal during vehicle checking at NHW Naka Tapyal, intercepted a truck bearing registration No. JK21B-1314 for its checking. During vehicle checking, twelve bovines were found laden inside the vehicle which were tied in a cruel manner and were being transported illegally without any valid permission. All the rescued bovines have been shifted to safer place. A case FIR No. 69/2024 U/S 188 IPC, 11 PCA Act has been registered at Police Station Ghagwal and investigation started. Meanwhile, Police team of BPP Jogvan led by incharge PP foiled one bovine smuggling bid and rescued 04 bovines and 01 Mahinder load carrier bearing registration number JK11F-8451 seized from Thian Kamdani naka while driver of the said vehicle fled the spot. In this regard, FIR under relevant sections of law stands registered in Police Station Khour and further investigation of the case is underway. In another instance, Police team of Police Post PouniChak led by incharge PP foiled one bovine smuggling bid and rescued 05 bovines and seized 01 Mahinder bolero pickup bearing registration number JK19 A 2928 from Seora area while driver of the said vehicle fled from spot. In this regard, FIR under relevant sections of law stands registered in Police Station Domana and further investigation of the case is underway. Udhampur Police also rescued 48 cattle from the clutches of 02 bovine smugglers at Tikri. Team of Police Post Tikri led by Incharge Police Post Tikri foiled 02 bovine smuggling bids in which total 48 bovines were rescued from 02 bovine smugglers namely Mohd. Fareed, son of Ab. Gani, resident of Dharamkund, Ramban and Mohd. Latief, son of Gh. Hussain, resident of Javid Nagar Nikki Tawi, Jammu who were taking these bovines by foot towards Kashmir valley. All the bovines were rescued and both the smugglers got arrested on the spot. In this regard 02 different FIR cases under relevant sections of law stands registered in PS Rehambal.

Notorious drug peddler's property attached

Pertinently the said Drug peddler is involved in Case FIR NOs 92/2020 U/S 8/21/22/29 NDPS Act PS Bagh e Bahu Jammu; 40/2022 U/S 8/15/29 NDPS Act PS Bagh e bahu, Jammu; 120/2022 U/S 8/15/29 NDPS Act PS Bagh e Bahu Jammu and 90/2023 U/S 8/21/22/29 NDPS Act PS Bagh e bahu Jammu.

It is pertinent to mention here that in last month two more properties worth crores were also freedzed in Rajeev Nagar area of PS Bahu fort by jammu police.
