of voters due to anger over nonperformance of its candidates in the two Jammu seats, the BJP decided to avoid direct contest with INDIA bloc for fear of drubbing by the voters", Ajay Sadhotra said, adding that this is admission of the lack of genuine grassroots presence in the region.

Tremendous response of the people to National Conference and its Parliamentary Candidates shows that people are also anxiously waiting for Jammu and Kashmir Assembly Elections to teach BJP a lesson.
