LNT Machine seized at Gossi Gulabgarh for illegal mining

KISHTWAR: The enforcement teams on Thursday seized an LNT machine involved in illegal mining in Gossi area near the Chandrabhaga River bed of Gulabgarh Paddar. The operation was conducted by a team from the

National Cyber Crime Portal and one offline complaint at CCIU Samba involving a total amount of Rs.1,20,398/- that was defrauded through various online scams and fraudulent activities by the fraudsters. The team of Cybercrime Investigation Unit under DySPHqrsheaded by Inspector rank officer displayed relentless efforts and advanced technical skills, leading to the successful refunding of Rs.59,500/- and liening the defrauded amount of Rs.60,898/- in above said cyber complaints. Further investigation is going on.

It is worthwhile to mention here that a dedicated Cybercrime Investigation Unit has been established in the premises of Police Station Samba to deal exclusively with cybercrime complaints which includes online financial frauds, social media frauds, etc.

Samba Police has appealed to the general public to remain vi lant and not to share credentials online /offline with anybody, not to click unknown lurking links and promptly report any suspicious online activities to the National Cybercrime Helpline Number 1930. Samba Police urged upon citizens to lodge cyber complaints online at www.cybercrime.gov.in and for lost or stolen mobile phones at www.ceir.gov.in.

Cyber online financial fraud amounting to Rs1,59,192 solved STATE TIMES NEWS

JAMMU: Cyber Cell of DPO Jammu solved three separate online cyber crime complaints.

A complaint was received regarding financial fraud of Rs.95,759.The complainant joined a trade market group(Bitcoin) and invested money. After investment of total amount of Rs.95,759 fraudsters blocked victim from telegram as well as from WhatsApp.One complaint was received regarding financial fraud in which the complainant received a message on Facebook from a friend that his sister is in serious condition at Ludhiana hospital and requested some money to save his sister and defrauded an amount of Rs. 27000.In another complaint of financial fraud in which victim ordered some items from Instagram page and shared OTP with the Instagram page admin and lost an amount of Rs.36,433/-During the investigation, the Cyber Cell DPO Jammu, acted swiftly and exhibited hectic efforts which ultimately led to put on hold an amount of Rs 1,47,989/- out of 1,59,192/- in these three separate online cyber crime complaints . Further investigation is underway.

Rs 2.18 lakh penalty imposed on traders for FSS Act violation STATE TIMES NEWS

KATHUA: The Adjudicating Officer and Additional District Magistrate (ADM) Kathua, Ranjit Singh, has imposed Rs 2.18 lakh penalty on erring Food Business Operators (FBOs) operating in the district.

The penalties were imposed for the sale of misbranded and substandard food items, in violation of the Food Safety and Standards Act-2006

This enforcement action targeted multiple manufacturers, wholesale dealers and retailers found to be contravening the provisions of the FSS Act-2006. The ADM, acting as the Adjudicating Officer, emphasized the necessity of compliance with the legal standards governing the food industry.

Ranjit Singh issued strict warnings to the erring FBOs, urging strict adherence to the Food Safety and Standards Act and its associated regulations. He warned that future violations would attract even harsher penalties.

The ADM instructed the Enforcement Agency to take decisive actions against the violators under the directives of the FSS Act-2006

Four Poultry farms gutted in Pangiari, Akhnoor

AKHNOOR: Four poultry farms in the Pangyari area of Akhnoor were completely destroyed by fire on Friday afternoon. The estimat-

ed loss runs into lakhs. The exact cause of the fire is ye to be determined.

Poultry farm owner Pawan Sharma reported



him, while one farm belonged to his associate Ram Ratan. Pawan Sharma mentioned that due to the intense heat wave in recent day, there were no chickens in the farms, but the maintenance equipment and feed stored there were completely destroyed.

He further stated that as soon as he received information about the fire on Friday afternoon, he rushed to the site and, with the help of the fire department, managed to extinguish the fire. However, due to the extreme heat, the fire had spread extensively, and by the time it was brought under control, everything had been reduced to ashes

Two bovine smuggling bids foiled, 12 bovines rescued, two vehicles seized STATE TIMES NEWS

JAMMU: In a significant crackdown under Operation Kamadhenu, Jammu Police have dealt a severe blow to bovine smugglers in the region. Demonstrating unwavering commitment and vigilance, the police team from Nagrota Police Station successfully intercepted a bovine smuggling attempt, rescuing 4 bovines and seizing a Mahindra vehicle (Registration No. JK19A-3092) at Ban Toll Naka. The driver, Ashraf Gojar Bhat, son of Mohd Jamal Gojar Bhat from Kokernag, Anantnag, was promptly apprehended. Simultaneously, another determined effort by PP Manwal led to the foiling of a second smuggling bid. The operation resulted in the rescue of 8 bovines and the seizure of a truck (Registration No. JK03G-4477), which was en route from Battal Morh to Udhampur: The driver, Altaf Hussain, son of Haze Fareed from Hiranagar, Kathua, was arrested on the spot.

The following FIRs have been registered in this connection FIR No. 148/2024 at Police Station Nagrota under relevant sections of law and FIR No. 122/2024 at Police Station Jhajjar Kotli under relevant sections of law.

Most wanted absconder arrested after three decades

KISHTWAR: In a significant breakthrough, the Jammu and Kashmir Police have successfully apprehended a fugitive who had been evading arrest for the past three decades (33 years).
