Chitra also scored two back to back centuries and a fifty in the four innings of the first of its kind JKCA Women's League held recently.

"I accredit my success to the facilities being provided to the players by JKCA at home and the pat and promote attitude of the Administrators and the officials, besides sheer-dint of hardwork by my parents. My job is to perform and wait for the opportunities," maintained Ms Chitra.
