Magotra highlighted the dissatisfaction among residents, noting that despite the installation of smart meters by the PDD a few months ago, promised hassle-free power supply had not materialized. Instead, the town experienced irregular and unscheduled power cuts, especially during heat waves.

Magotra criticized the PDD for its lack of accountability, citing an instance where contacting a PDD AEE yielded no resolution, as the responsibility was shifted to the installing smart agency meters.

Expressing disbelief that a private contractor could shoulder the entire responsibility while permanent PDD employees collected revenue without delivering satisfactory services, Magotra warned the PDD authority to address their demands promptly. Failure to do so, he warned, would result in larger protests by the people of Udhampur, organized by the Congress


