17 bovines rescued, 3 vehicles seized

JAMMU: Jammu police tightening noose against bovine smugglers under operation Kamdhenu, Police team of Police Station Nagrota foiled 02 bovine smuggling bids in which 13 bovines were rescued and 02 vehicles Truck bearing Registration No. JK14C/6067 driven by Manzoor Ahmed, son of Mohd Salman, resident of Mansar Channa Tehsil Majalta District Udhampur arrested on Spot and a Vehicle Tata Mobile bearing registration No. JK02CR/6093 driver of the vehicle fled away from the spot by taking advantage of darkness.

In this regard two Cases FIR No.160 &161 /2024 under section 188/IPC 11 PCA Act 50/52/54/56 Transport of animals Rule stands registered in Police station Nagrota.

A team of Police Station Nagrota foiled bovine smuggling bids in which 04 bovines were rescued and seized one vehicle Tata Mobile bearing registration No. JK020B/6146 driver of the Tata Mobile fled away from the spot. In this regard a Case FIR No.162/2024 U/S 188/IPC 11 PCA registered in this Police Station Nagrota and investigation of the case is in progress.

Cybercrime Investigation Unit Kishtwar recovers online defrauded amount of RS 6,06,000

JAMMU: The Cybercrime Investigation Unit of District Police Kishtwar has successfully recovered Rs. 6,06,000.00 (Six Laes Six Thousand) that was fraudulently obtained through online scams.

Upon receiving multiple complaints about online fraud involving mobile recharge scams, third-party mobile app installations, and malicious Telegram links promoting Dream 11 teams, the Cybercrime Investigation Unit promptly initiated an investigation. Utilizing advanced technical skills and relentless efforts, the team was able to recover the defrauded amount of Rs. 6,06,000.00. Efforts are ongoing to recover any remaining amounts, with promising leads identified.

Since its establishment, the Cybercrime Investigation Unit Kishtwar has addressed numerous online scam reports, successfully recovering a total of Rs. 14,86,906.00 (Fourteen Laes Eighty-Six Thousand Nine Hundred Six).

J&K Police urges the public to remain vigilant against online fraud. Avoid clicking on suspicious links, refrain from installing unauthorized apps, and be cautious when sharing personal information online. Missing person traced, reunited with family

UDHAMPUR: A missing person was traced and reunited with his family by Udhampur Police in Rehambal area.

An information was received at Police Station Rehambal about the missing of one person namely Joginder Singh, son of Sansar Singh resident of colony No.03, Chopra Shop Udhampur whose missing report was entered at PS Rehambal on 16-04-2024 vide DDR No.03.

Acting upon this, a police team of PS Rehambal led by SHO PS Rehambal was constituted and raids were conducted at different suspected locations utilizing human

and technical intelligence and finally the missing person was traced out by Police team from Jadserkote area and after completing all legal formalities the said person has been handed over to his legal heirs.

Accordingly missing report has been closed as traced.

Doda Police arrests two long-evading absconders

DODA: In a determined effort to apprehend wanted criminals, Doda Police have successfully arrested two individuals who had been evading arrest for an extended period. According to Doda Police, Mohd Saleem, son of Kaka Din Caste Gujjar resident of Ranipur, and Mohd Yaqoob, son of Gh. Rasool, a resident of Khanpur Mandi, Tehsil & District Pathankot, were involved in FIR No. 131/2021, registered at Bhaderwah Police Station.

Following the completion of the investigation, the case was presented in court, and both accused were declared absconders, leading to the issuance of arrest warrants by the Hon'ble court. A dedicated police team from Bhaderwah Police Station, utilizing both human intelligence and technical resources, managed to locate and arrest the absconders. The arrested individuals have been produced before the court.

Poppy cultivation destroyed

DODA: Police on Friday destroyed poppy cultivation and registered 3 FIRs for illegal cultivations of opium poppy in Bhadarwah Doda District.

Based on a specific input regarding illegal cultivation of opium poppy in Puneja area of Bhaderwah, J&K Police District Doda has taken cognizance and registered 3 FIRs bearing regd No.87/2024, 88/2024 and 89/2024 under relevant provisions of NDPS Act in Police Station Bhaderwah.

In this major crackdown, Police teams from Police Station Bhaderwah made seizure of opium poppy cultivation on the spot in the presence of the Executive Magistrate, while the identification of the cultivators is being ascertained during the course of investigation.

Excavator, 6 Tractors involved in illegal mining seized; 7 drivers arrested

They were found involved in illegal extraction/ trans-

portation of minerals and accordingly case under relevant sections of law have been registered in respective police stations and investigations have been initiated.

Crackdown on illegal mining, 5 vehicles seized

JAMMU: In a drive against illegal mining and to tighten noose against the violators, Jammu Police has initiated strict action against the criminals involved in illegal mining & minting money out of the public resources.

In a surprise operation which was carried out at different locations in Rural zone of District Jammu.

PS Gharota detained one mini tipper bearing chasis No. MAT804732P21054 loaded with sand seized under illegal mining.

PS Nagrota detained one tractor trolley bearing chasis no WQTL30705020797, Engine No. 39.1350SNL1437S loaded with Sand without Form A.

After detaining of these vehicles District Mining Officer was informed for necessary legal actions.

In a surprise operation which was carried out at different locations in South Zone of District Jammu.

PP Gadi Garh detained one tipper bearing registration no. JK 02 CH 0340 loaded with sand seized under illegal mining. In another instance, PP Belicharana detained two dumpers bearing registration no. JK 02 CJ 7151, and JK 02 CB 5491 loaded with Sand without Form A. In all, 03 vehicles have been seized in jurisdiction of PS Satwari.

After detaining of these vehicles District Mining Officer was informed for necessary legal actions.

There were emotional scenes of the owners while collecting and reconnecting reconnecting with their lost mobile devices as the lost devices contained precious memories in the form of pictures and other personal information.

The traced smart phones were handed over only after re-verifying identity documents and Mobile bills.

SP South Sh. Ajay Sharma utilising the occasion gave the word of advice to take due care of communication devices such as smart mobile phones, which contain not only the Contacts, but a lot of personal information, including Photographs, Emails, Text messages and financial details. They were advised to implement strong security measures such as the use of strong passwords and PINs to lock phone screen, keep software updated, activate remote tracking and wiping features, enable two-factor authentication etc.
