SRINAGAR: In its continued efforts to support the welfare of serving, retired, and NoK of deceased police personnel, as well as Special Police Officers (SPOs), the Director General of Police (DGP), J&K, R.R Swain has sanctioned welfare loan/relief and financial assistance of over Rs 1.77 crore in favour of 180 of Police personnel.

As per an order of PHQ, DGP J&K has sanctioned welfare loan of Rs 1.10 crore in favour of 72 personnel for the purpose of medical treatment of themselves or

Additionally, 17 personnel have been provided a welfare loan of Rs 22 lakh for the purpose of self-marriage or their wards' marriage. Rs 1.5 lakh has also been sanctioned for the higher education of a police official's

Welfare relief of Rs 11.30 lakh in favour of 37 police personnel has also been sanctioned. It is noteworthy that welfare loans are refundable, while welfare relief is non-refundable.


