
Successful J&K polls success of Modi Govt policy; next step Assembly polls, statehood: Amit Shah

NEW DELHI: Union Home Minister Amit Shah has said that the Modi government's Kashmir policy has been vindicated by the successful polling in Jammu and Kashmir, where even separatists have voted "overwhelmingly", as he assured that the assembly elections in the region will be held before September 30.

Once the elections are over, the government will start the process of restoring statehood to the Union Territory, Shah said in an interview to PTI late Saturday.

"I have said in Parliament that we will give the statehood after the assembly elections," he said, adding that everything is going according to plan, such as the surveys of the backward classes and delimitation exercise of the Assembly and Lok Sabha constituencies.

NEW DELHI: Union Home Minister Amit Shah has slammed the INDIA bloc's criticism of the Election Commission as a ploy to cover up for its impending loss in the Lok Sabha polls, asserting that the BJP will score a bigger win in opposition-ruled states due to a "positive mandate" for Prime Minister Narendra Modi.

In an interview with PTI, Shah claimed that his party has not resorted to any religion-based campaign but insisted that f canvassing against reservation for Muslims, and reaching out to voters on the abolition of Article 370 and implement ing a Uniform Civil Code is religion-based campaign, then the BJP has done it and will continue doing so.

GHOSI/DEORIA/MIRZAF UR (UP): Prime Minister Narendra Modi on Sunday said INDIA bloc parties want to turn the country's majority community into second-class citizens and also alleged that "jihadis" across the border are supporting the Samajwadi Party and the Congress.

He attacked the parties of the opposition bloc, alleging they are planning to rewrite the Constitution to provide reservation on the basis of religion.

The prime minister was in Uttar Pradesh's Purvanchal region to address rallies in Ghosi, Deoria and Mirzapur in support of BJP and NDA Lok Sabha poll candidates contesting in the seventh and last phase of the general elections on June 1.

'Opposition alliance will give reservation to Muslims'

MIRZAPUR (UP): Prime Minister Narendra Modi on Sunday branded the opposition INDIA bloc as communal and casteist, and claimed they have decided to change the Constitution to give reservation to Muslims.

While the SP-Congress is dedicated to vote bank, Modi is dedicated to rights of backwards and the poor, he said addressing a poll meeting here in support of NDA alliance partner Apna Dal's candidate from Mirzapur Lok Sabha seat Anupriya Patel and Robertsganj Lok Sabha seat Rinki Kol.

"People of the country have identified the people of 'INDI alliance'. These people are staunch communal, casteist and dynast (parivar wadi). Whenever their government is formed they take decision on this basis, ■ CONTD ON PAGE 9

border are supporting them. The SP and the Congress are making an appeal for 'vote jihad'," Modi said in an apparent reference to a remark by an INDIA bloc candidate.

"This (INDIA bloc) group is saying that if they come to power, they will reimpose Article 370 in Kashmir. They will repeal the CAA (Citizenship (Amendment) Act) which gives citizenship to the victims of Partition. Whose agenda is this... this is what these anti-India forces want?" he said.

Hitting out at the bloc, Prime Minister Modi claimed the "INDI jamaat" has been abusing him for his opposition to reservation on the basis of religion.

The prime minister listed "big conspiracies" of the opposition bloc and said, "First, the people of INDI alliance will change

In rare move, Govt extends tenure of Army Chief by one month

NEW DELHI: Army Chief Gen Manoj Pande will continue to serve in the post till June 30 with the government on Sunday extending his tenure by one month, in a rare and unusual move that came amid the Lok Sabha polls.

Gen Pande was to retire from service on May 31. The Appointments Committee of the

Cabinet approved one-month extension in service of Gen Pande, the defence ministry said.

The extension to Gen Pande came nearly five decades after the then Indira Gandhi-led government extended the tenure of Army Chief Gen G G Bewoor by one year in early 1970s in first such

In view of extension given to Gen



Bewoor, the next in line Lt Gen Prem Bhagat, known to be a fine military officer, retired from service without becoming the Army Chief, according to military experts.

"The Appointments Committee of Cabinet on May 26 approved the extension in service of Chief of the Army Staff Gen Manoj C Pande for a period of one month, beyond his normal age of superannuation (May 31) that is up to June 30 under Rule 16 A (4) of the Army Rules 1954," the defence ministry

Lt Gen Upendra Dwivedi, currently serving as the Vice Chief of Army Staff, is the senior-most official after Gen Pande. The senior-most official after Lt Gen

Dwivedi is Lt Gen Ajay Kumar Singh, the Southern Army Commander. Both Lt Gen Dwivedi and Lt Gen

Singh are course mates. Lt Gen Dwivedi, who has vast operational experience along the frontiers with China and Pakistan, assumed charge as Vice Chief in February suc-

NDPS Act dismissed in Reasi Substances Act at Jammu's

Constable booked under

REASI: A police constable booked last year under the Drugs Narcotic Psychotropic Substances Act was dismissed from service in Reasi district, an official said on Sunday.

Senior Superintendent of (Reasi) Mohita Police Sharma ordered the dismissal of selection grade constable Tariq Hussain Shah for his prolonged unauthorised absence from duties and alleged involvement in drug trafficking, a police spokesperson said.

Shah was booked under sections of the Narcotic Drugs and Psychotropic Bakshi Nagar police station last year. In her detailed factual

report, Sharma observed that the charges of violations of police rules and regulations, absenteeism, grave misconduct, indiscipline and negligence were proved against the constable, making him unfit to serve the department.

The stern departmental action of dismissal has been taken after the delinquent cop did not pay heed to series of signals, attendance notices and show cause notices which were served upon him," the spokesperson said.

Seven newborns die in hospital blaze in east Delhi; owner arrested


STATÉ TIMES NEWS NEW DELHI: Seven newborns were killed and five injured in a massive fire at a private neonatal hospital in east Delhi's Vivek Vihar that was allegedly operating illegally with an "expired" licence and no clearance from the fire department.

according to officials. Police said on Sunday they arrested the hospital's owner Dr Naveen Khichi and Dr Aaksh, who was on duty at the time of the incident on Saturday night.

According to a report submitted by the District Magistrate (Shahdara) to the Delhi Divisional Commissioner, there were 12 babies admitted in the hospital at the time of the incident. While one died on the spot, 11 were shifted to a hospital in the vicinity where six were declared dead on

The deceased children included four boys and three girls. All were 15 days old except one boy aged 25 days. The bodies have been

Pakistan using terrorism against India as instrument of state policy: Union Minister

CHANDIGARH: minister Hardeep Singh Puri on Sunday accused Pakistan of using terrorism against India as an "instrument of state policy" and said under the Modi government, India has sent a clear message to the neighbouring country that it will eliminate terrorists in its territory.

"Pakistan is a country which has consciously and continuously practised the use of terror as an instrument of state policy," said Puri while speaking to reporters here.

"Ever since Modi ji came

(to power), those who were into cross-border terrorism have got a message," he said. Puri also held the Congress responsible for the anti-Sikh

riots in 1984. It was not a riot, it was a massacre, he said.

Puri said the Congress is yet to seek a "proper apology" for the 'Operation Bluestar'. Operation Bluestar was a

military operation carried out in 1984 to flush out militants from the Golden Temple. Puri said that in 2014

RAJOURI : After trekking for a day, a polling party reached here Sunday evening to deposit electronic voting machines at a designated strongroom, having successfully conducted polling in Hill Kaka - a village in Poonch that was infested with foreign terrorists over two decades ago.

Poonch is part Anantnag-Rajouri Lok Sabha constituency which went to polls on Saturday, completing the voting exercise in all five seats in Jammu and Kashmir.

Hill Kaka, which has 377 eligible voters, is the one of remotest villages in the Pir Panjal region and has a
