JKTMA demands DPC of Teachers/Masters

JAMMU: The Jammu Kashmir Teachers Masters Association (JKTMA) held its monthly meeting in Jammu, presided over by UT President Rakesh Singh Chambial. The meeting focused on pressing concerns faced by Teachers and Masters, with a special Departmental Promotion Committee (DPC) procedures for these educational professionals

In his address, Rakesh Singh Chambial highlighted the discrepancy between the authorities' claims of implementing the National Education Policy (NEP) 2020 and the ground reality. He pointed out that the implementation of NEP 2020 is hindered by a severe shortage of Lecturers and

the absence of various subject streams in numerous higher secondary schools. This lack forces students into helpless situations, unable to pursue their preferred academic paths due to the unavailability of subject-specific Lecturers and the inflexibility in subject combinations. He asserted that the solution lies in filling all vacant Lecturer positions by promoting Teachers and Masters through the DPC process, especially in Science subjects, and introducing new subjects in higher secondary schools to offer students a diverse range of study options.

UT General Secretary Vivek Gupta expressed his frustration with the School Education Department's (SED) decision regarding a one-time exemption for regu-

larization and DPC processes. He criticized this move as a futile exercise that delays the regularization of In-Charge (IC) Lecturers and the DPC process. Gupta questioned the necessity of obtaining one-time exemption from the Administrative department when concerned Teachers and Masters have already secured pre-facto and post-facto permissions for higher studies through the proper channels. He argued that if such an exemption is essential, it should be applied to fresh inservice teachers after the issuance of the relevant

UT Vice President Vikram Gupta praised the reform measures taken by the Director of School Education (DSEJ) and Jammu Administrative Secretary Dr.

Piyush Singla. He urged them to expedite the DPC process by implementing a 100 percent promotion quota per $_{
m the}$ State Administrative Council's (SAC) decision. Filling all vacant Lecturer positions, particularly in rural higher secondary schools, is crucial for the academic progress of students who rely heavily on their Lecturers.

Chambial also the issue of fraudulent distance learning degrees in the science stream, obtained through offline study centers and "tuck shops." He strongly urged the Commissioner Secretary to exclude such degrees from seniority lists, emphasizing that these degrees compromise the quality of education in the Education School Department (SED). He noted that even the Jammu and Kashmir Public Service Commission (JKPSC) does not recognize these degrees for regularization and recruitment purposes.

The association passed several resolutions with a twothirds majority, including issuing orders for earned leave for teachers who worked during summer vacations for various schemes; creating regular posts for Sarva Shiksha Abhiyan (SSA) Head Teachers; establishing a Teachers Welfare Fund; and enhancing the pay grade of teachers to be on par with other Union Territories

Other notable speakers at the meeting included Parveen Singh, Rajesh Kumar, and Ankush Sharma, who also shared their insights and
