Bus rolls down into gorge; 22 Shiv Khori pilgrims dead, 57 injured President, PM, LG express grief, announces ex-gratia

JAMMU: At least 22 pilgrims were killed and 57 injured after a bus carrying pilgrims skidded off the road and rolled down into a gorge in Chowki Chora near Kalidhar on Jammu-Rajouri highway on Thursday, officials said.

The accident took place at the Tungi-Morh in the Chowki Chora, the officials said, adding that the bus plying from Kurukshetra to Shiv

Khori with devotees rolled around 150 feet down into

A magisterial probe has been ordered into the incident, the Jammu district magistrate informed on X. He also said 22 pilgrims have lost their lives and 57 sustained injuries in the tragedy.

Lieutenant Governor Manoj Sinha has expressed his deep anguish on the loss of lives in the tragic bus accident in Akhnoor, Jammu.

In a condolence message, the Lt Governor has said, "The Bus accident in Akhnoor is heart-rending. I condole the loss of lives and pray to the almighty to give the bereaved families the strength to bear the irreparable loss. Praying for the speedy recovery of the

The administration is providing all possible assistance to the bereaved families and is also extending medical facilities to those who have been injured".

The Lieutenant Governor has also announced an exgratia of Rs. 5 Lakh to be given to the next of kin of each deceased and Rs.50,000 for those injured in the tragic bus accident.

A police spokesperson said at about 12:35 pm, the bus bearing registration number UP81CT-4058 fell into the

The bus was carrying devofromHarvana's Kurukshetra and was headed towards Shiv Khori in the Pouni area of Reasi district. It had started its journey from Uttar Pradesh.

The bodies have been shifted to the Akhnoor Sub-District Hospital, the police spokesperson said, adding that the injured have been taken to the Government Medical College (GMC) Hospital in Jammu.

DM Jammu orders magisterial inquiry into mishap

JAMMU: A bus accident occurred near Kalidhar on Thursday, involving a bus carrying pilgrims from Uttar Pradesh heading towards Shiv Khori.

District Magistrate Sachin Kumar Vaishya said that 22 perons have died in this mishap.

Presently, 57 injured are under treatment at GMC Jammu and at SDH Akhnoor. Furthermore, the District Magistrate has initiated a magisterial inquiry to investigate the cause of the accident. ADM Jammu shall submit a report within 7 days in this regard. The district administration is closely monitoring the treatment of the injured and is in communication with the authorities of Hathras and Aligarh, the native places of the passengers.

HC upholds PSA of lady running sex racket **STATE TIMES NEWS**

JAMMU: Justice Sanjeev Kumar of Jammu Kashmir and Ladakh High Court upheld the detention under Public Safety Act (PSA) of Swarna Devi who was allegedly involved in running sex racket.

The impugned order of detention has been passed by the Detaining Authority in the exercise of power vested in it under Section 8 (1) (a) of the Jammu and Kashmir Public Safety Act, 1978. The detention of Swarna Devi was ordered primarily on the ground that she notorious and habitual of pushing young girls into forced prostitution, in that, six FIRs (i)

FIR 01/2016 under Sections 341/323/34 RPC, (ii) FIR 02/2016 under Section 332/353/147 RPC, (iii) FIR 94/2016 under 376/120-B RPC, (iv) FIR 88/2022 under Sections 3/4/5/7 382/341/323/504 IPC, (v) FIR93/2022 under Sections

452/323/382/504/506 IPC and (vi) FIR 32/2023 under Sections 366-A/342/344/34 IPC, Section 4/6/16 of POCSO Act and Section 5/6/7/18 ITPA, stand registered in Police Stations, Bagh-e-Bahu and Channi Himmat, Jammu and final reports in respect to four FIRs have already been presented before the competent courts of law after investigation, whereas investigation with regard to two FIRs is

still going on. Justice Sanjeev Kumar after hearing both the sides observed that it is thus trite that a mere disturbance of law and order leading to disorder is not necessarily sufficient for placing an individual under preventive detention. However, the disturbance which affects the public order comes within the scope of the Act. The difference between 'public order' and 'law and order' is similar to the distinction between public and private crimes in the realm of

Modi begins 'Dhyan' at Vivekananda Rock Memorial in Kanyakumari

KANYAKUMARI: Prime Minister Narendra Modi began his 45-hourlong meditation at the famed Vivekananda Rock Memorial here on Thursday evening, following completion of his two-months long highpitch poll campaign across the country. After arriving from nearby Thiruvananthapuram by a helicopter, Modi worshipped at the Bhagavathi Amman temple and reached the rock memorial by a ferry service and started meditation that is scheduled to go on till June 1.

Clad in a dhoti and a white shawl, Modi prayed at the temple and circumambulated the 'garbhagriha'. Priests performed a special 'arthi' and he was given temple 'prasad' that included a shawl and a framed photograph of the presiding deity of the temple.

Later, he reached the rock memorial by a ferry service operated by the state government-run shipping corporation and began his meditation at



the 'dhyan mandapam.' Before he embarked on the dhyan exercise, for a while, Modi stood on the stairs leading to the mandapam that offers breathtaking views of the sea that surrounds the memorial from all

ers on the portraits of Ramakrishna Paramahamsa, mother Sri Sarada Devi and also paid floral tributes to Swami Vivekananda, whose life-size

statue on a high pedestal adores the

the sadhana (spiritual practice) in

the mandapam.

Speaking to reporters at Sivaganga, Tamil Nadu BJP president K Annamalai termed PM Modi's visit to the memorial as an out-and-out 'private' visit. "It is Prime Minister's personal visit," he said, adding that was why his party leaders and cadres did not take part in the event.

Ahead of his departure on June 1, Modi is likely to visit the Thiruvalluvar statue, next to the memorial. Both the memorial and 133-ft statue were built on tiny islets, that are separate and mound-like rocky formations in the sea.

While outfits including Thanthai Periyar Dravidar Kazhagam staged a black flag demonstration in Madurai opposing Modi, social media platform 'X' also witnessed a flood of #GoBackModi posts, amid political opposition to the broadcast of his meditation in view of the final (seventh) phase of voting for the Lok mandapam. Modi later commenced Sabha elections on June 1.


Court grants 10 days police custody of revenue official who caught red-handed by CBI case diaries that accused per-

Cases Jammu Bala Joyti granted 10 days police remand of Mohd Ishaq Bhatt who was caught red-handed by CBI while accepting bribe of Rs

Special Judge CBI Bala Joyti after perusal of the application and CD file transpires that accused was arrested on May 27, 2024 in case FIR No. RC0042024A0003 dated May 26, 2024 for offence under section 7 of P.C. Act 1988 (as amended in 2018). As per the Medical certificate, accused person is medically examined and found fit. Moreover accused person has not complained about any physical discomfort or any mental illness. He is apprised of grounds of arrest by Investigation Officercer I.0 as revealed in 2024, case diaries transpires that investigation of the case is at its infancy, statements of material witnesses are yet to be recorded by I.0 besides accused person is involved in a serious offence, he is remanded to judicial custody for a period of 10 days only. He is to be lodged in District Jail 'Amphalla; Jammu with a direction to LO to expedite the investigation. He shall be subjected to regular medical examination under rules. He is also apprised of his right to engage Advocate. Accused person shall be produced in the Court by I.0 after the expiry of period of remand through virtual mode. I.0 is directed to complete the investigation process within remand period only.
