Know importance of education from Ambedkar's life: Balbir

JAMMU: Jammu and Kashmir BJP spokesperson and former vice chairperson of the Jammu and Kashmir SC, Development Corporation, Balbir Ram Rattan, emphasized that the life of Dr. Bhimrao Ramji Ambedkar stands as a timeless example of how education can become a powerful instrument of social transformation.

The delegation apprised the Minister of the pressing issues and demands concerning the safety, security, and working conditions of Jammu-based

reserved category employees posted in the Kashmir division.


