

DC Poonch meets shelling victims, inspects shelling hit areas

POONCH: Deputy Commissioner Poonch Vikas Kundal, along with Additional Deputy Commissioner Tahir Mustafa Malik, today visited District Hospital here to meet and inquire about the well being of civilians injured in the cross border shelling. The officers interacted with the injured individuals, offering words of assurance and support in this difficult time.

Chief Medical Officer, Dr. Parvaiz Khan, briefed the Deputy Commissioner about the current medical arrangements, including availability of essential medicines, presence of medical staff, and the readiness of ambulance services. He informed that doctors are attending to patients

round the clock extending all necessary care to them.

The Deputy Commissioner instructed hospital authorities to ensure the injured receive the best possible treatment without delay. He also appreciated the dedication of the medical teams working under challenging circumstances.

The visit reflects the

administration's ongoing commitment to the welfare of affected citizens and its prompt response in ensuring quality healthcare and support.

DC accompanied by a team of officers of the district administration, conducted a comprehensive city tour to inspect areas affected by recent cross border shelling

and to oversee the administrative response to public safety and infrastructure restoration.

During the tour, the Deputy Commissioner visited Mohalla Shankar Nagar, one of the affected localities in the cross border shelling. He interacted with local residents and assessed the ground situation firsthand.

Expressing concern over the extent of damage caused to residential properties and public infrastructure, he instructed the revenue officials to carry out an immediate and thorough assessment of all losses. He further directed them to submit a consolidated report at the earliest to facilitate prompt relief and rehabilitation measures.

The Deputy Commissioner assured the affected families that the administration is fully committed to ensuring their safety and well being, and all necessary resources will be mobilized to support them during this difficult time. He emphasized that timely compensation, repair of damaged structures, and relocation where necessary would be taken up on priority.

Later, the DC visited the Divisional Forest Office building, which had also sustained damage due to shelling. He inspected the affected sections and directed concerned officers to begin restoration and renovation work without delay to restore normal functioning of the department.

Inqlabi demands compensation for shelling-affected areas

JAMMU: In a strongly worded statement, Chaudhry Rashid Azam Inqlabi appealed to the Chief Minister and the Lieutenant Governor; Manoj Sinha, to direct the concerned authorities to immediately assess the damage caused to civilian properties in the border areas of District Rajouri and Poonch.



He emphasized that both districts have suffered significant human casualties and extensive property damage due to unprovoked firing from across the border. Hundreds of cattle have perished, yet the government has not issued any instructions to assess the extent of the damage or provide

relief to the affected families.

Inqlabi demanded immediate construction of individual and community bunkers for the safety of civilians living in border areas or near military establishments, to mitigate future risks.

Furthermore, Ch. Rashid Azam Inqlabi strongly condemned the derogatory remarks made by Madhya Pradesh Minister Shri Vijay Shah, particularly targeting Colonel Sophia Qureshi. He demanded that an FIR be lodged against the minister and that strict action be taken to uphold the dignity of the Indian Armed Forces and maintain communal harmony.
