JAMMU: In a strongly worded statement, Chaudhry Rashid Azam Inqlabi appealed to the Chief Minister and the Lieutenant Governor, Manoj Sinha, to direct the concerned authorities to immediately assess the damage caused to civilian properties in the border areas of District Rajouri and Poonch.

He emphasized that both districts have suffered significant human casualties and extensive property damage due to unpro-

voked firing from across the border. Hundreds of cattle have perished, yet the government has not issued any instructions to assess the extent of the damage or provide



Inglabi demanded immediate construction of individual and community bunkers for the safety of civilians living in border areas or near military establishments, to mitigate future risks.
