The meeting was held here in the Conference Hall Directorate of Agriculture Krishi Bhawan.

The review session was Project Grounding and Monitoring Committees. Directors of Horticulture, Agriculture. Animal Husbandry, Fisheries, Sericulture and Sheep Husbandry from both Jammu and Kashmir divisions, alongside representatives from SKUAST-Jammu and SKUAST-Kashmir. Officers

from the Kashmir division joined the proceedings virtual-

Key agenda items included a review of the action taken on decisions from previous meetings, submission of training calendars, and the status of farmer training initiatives. Progress updates were also shared regarding the Daksh Kisan Portal and the Kisan Sathi Portal, particularly in relation to course completion and farmer registration, respectively.

the meeting. During Sandeep Kumar directed all departments to fast-track the implementation of assigned tasks and ensure robust interdepartmental coordination for effective execution of developmental projects under HADP.

A detailed review of all ongoing projects under HADP was conducted. The Mission Director instructed concerned officers to adhere strictly to projects timelines and objectives. He particularly emphasized the need to strengthen the agricultural marketing system to enhance the sale and distribution of produce, including infrastructure development for marketing fruits and vegetables.

In the livestock sector the Mission Director stressed the importance of improving animal health, breeding programs, and value addition through various schemes and initiatives under HADP.

Special focus was given to the area expansion of millets under the Promotion of Nutri-Cereals (Millets) project. Sandeep Kumar highlighted the significance of Research & Development (R&D) in this domain and called for the conservation of traditional landraces and indigenous vari-

The meeting concluded with a discussion on organizing farmer-centric workshops under HADP, particularly on themes such as organic farmand beekeeping. Progressive farmers will be invited to share their experiences during these events, fostering peer learning and community engagement. Sandeep Kumar further stressed the need for documentation of success stories, which will serve as motivational case studies for the wider farming community.

### Commissioner State Taxes reviews functioning of department in Jammu

JAMMU: Commissioner State Taxes Department, P.K. Bhat on Wednesday chaired an extensive review meeting of the State Taxes Department. Jammu Division and assess ongoing activities and streamline strategies for improved tax compliance and revenue augmentation.

The meeting was attended Additional Commissioner State Taxes Administration Enforcement,

Namrita Dogra and State Taxes Officers from all circles of Jammu Division. During the meeting, sev-

eral key issues were discussed, including deemed registrations, TDS mismatch, high-risk cases, return compliance and audit cases. The discussions were held to streamline strategies for improved tax compliance and revenue augmentation.

Commissioner The emphasized the need for ensuring returns compliance and directed the officers to keep a close watch on taxpavers to prevent any tax evasion. He stressed on ensuring nearly 100% return filing compliance and creating deterrence

among the defaulters. The Commissioner emphasized the importance of raising awareness among taxpayers about return filing requirements, particularly the necessity of filing returns with proportionate liability in cash to meet their tax liabilities. He also directed officers to engage with the taxpayer fraternity and provide guidance to improve compliance.

The meeting also discussed other key issues like identification of Fake ITC Suppliers, monitoring of TDS Payments, action on Intelligence Reports, Audit and Verification of E-Way Bills and other issues.

Addressing the meeting, the Commissioner State Taxes J&K emphasised the pivotal role of the State Taxes Department in ensuring financial discipline and highlighted prior-

ate attention. With regard to specific issues, the Commissioner directed the officers to ensure proper and efficient monitoring of all deemed registration cases, ensuring proper scrutiny of E-Way Bills as it was identified as a critical component of preventing revenue leakage and ensuring compliance. The officers were advised to check e way billson a regular basis the flow of inward and outward supplies so that revenue due is

The Commissioner also highlighted the importance of using various tools like (Management Information System), GST Prime. He elaborated on the functionality of GST Prime, emphasizing its potential to provide actionable insights, saving time and energy while enhancing revenue collection.Officers were encouraged to maximize the use of these tools for effective monitoring and compliance.

Bhat also stressed the need to focus on areas such as cement, iron besides other components used un construction works, where potential revenue leakages may occur due to non-compliance or violations. Officers were directed to ensure strict enforcement of GST laws in these sectors and plug any loopholes.

The Commissioner directed the officers to work with renewed vigor and dedication to achieve the department's goals. The meeting concluded with a commitment from the officers to implement the directives and work towards improving the tax administration in Jammu division.
