NEW DELHI: Foreign Secretary Vikram Misri told a parliamentary committee on Monday that the conflict between India and Pakistan was always in the conventional domain, and there was no nuclear signalling by the neighbouring country, PTI

reported quoting sources. The sources said Misri reit-

erated the government's stand that the decision to stop military actions was taken at a bilateral level, as some opposition members questioned US President Donald Trump's repeated assertions about his administration's role in stopping the conflict.



"Investigations revealed that Abdul Aziz carried out the grenade attack on instructions received from Nazir Ahmed, who is currently operating from Pakistan. Nazir Ahmed had exfiltrated to Pakistan in 2001, where he joined the proscribed terror outfit Hizbul Mujahideen (HM) and later became associated with the Jammu Kashmir Gaznavi Force (JKGF)," official said. Towards the end of 2022,

Ahmed re-established contact with Abdul Aziz, his relative, through encrypted messaging applications Pakistan-based numbers. During this time, official

said, Nazir radicalized and recruited Aziz into HM/JKGF, instructing him to carry out grenade attacks in District Poonch to further the terror outfit's agenda and ideology.

Nazir Ahmed not only indoctrinated and recruited Abdul Aziz but also supplied him with hand grenades and detailed instructions for the execu-

New e-Zero FIR will help nab cyber criminals

NEW DELHI: The Indian Cybercrime

Coordination Centre (I4C), which comes under the Ministry of Home Affairs, introduced the new e-Zero FIR initiative to nab cybercriminals with unprecedented speed, Union Home Minister Amit Shah said on Monday. Started as a pilot project for Delhi, the new system will automatically convert into FIRs cyber financial crimes filed on the National Cybercrime Reporting Portal (NCRP) and helpline number 1930, initially above the threshold limit of Rs 10 lakh, he said. The minister said the process of issuing FIRs electronically, irrespective of territorial jurisdiction, will soon be extended to the entire

This initiative will enable easy restoration of money lost by victims and facilitate punitive action against cyber criminals. It leverages the provisions of the recently introduced criminal laws, an official statement said

MHA's Indian Cybercrime Coordination Centre (I4C) introduced the new e-Zero FIR initiative to nab any criminal with unprecedented speed.

"Launched as a pilot project for Delhi, the new system will automatically convert cyber financial crimes filed at NCRP or 1930 to FIRs, initially above the threshold limit of Rs 10 lakh. The new system, which will drive investiga-

criminals, will soon be extended to the entire nation," Shah wrote on 'X'. The home minister said the Modi gov-

ernment is bolstering the cybersecurity grid to build a cyber-secure Bharat. The I4C was established by the MHA

in New Delhi to provide a framework and ecosystem for law enforcement agencies to deal with cybercrime in a coordinated and comprehensive manner. The I4C is envisaged to act as the nodal point to curb cybercrime in the

This is a significant step to achieve Prime Minister Narendra Modi's vision of a 'Cyber Secure Bharat', the official statement said.

The home minister had given instructions for the implementation of this initiative in a recent review meeting of the I4C, keeping in view the difficulties faced by victims of cyber financial crimes in the recovery of the money lost. The National ■ CONTD ON PAGE 9
