He asked the department to make every possible effort to protect human life and property while maintaining the ecological balance. He said that multiple steps are being taken at various levels to create awareness among the locals about animal behaviour and the protective measures they could adopt to reduce the man-animal

"Wildlife Rescue Vehicle Fleet is expected to significantly reduce response department's ability to respond effectively to conflict situations, thereby safeguarding both," maintained the Minister.

Rana further highlighted the urgent need to balance conservation and development while ensuring coexistence. "We have to find sustainable solutions that protect both. While human lives must be safeguarded, the survival of wildlife is equally important," he

Rana asked the wildlife department for adoption of best practices from other parts of the country that have successfully managed human-wildlife conflicts.

Rana also appreciated the forest department in managing human-wildlife interactions effectively despite the challenges faced by the officials on ground.

District Development Commissioner and Mission Director JJM impressed upon all the officers of Jal Shakti Department to take responsibility of the execution of works under JJM and work with utmost dedication and sincerity, and provide FHTCs to the remaining 7251 households.
