preparedness in ensuring qual-Court rejects bail in Rs 250 Crore Heroin Smuggling Case

■ STATE TIMES NEWS JAMMU: Special Judge NDPS Court Jammu, Yash Pal Sharma, rejected the bail application of Ravinder Singh, alleged to be the key mastermind behind an inter-state narcotics smuggling racket involving the recovery of over 50 kg of heroin worth approximately ?250 crores.

Represented by advocates Ravinder Sharma and Prince Khanna, the accused had sought bail, which was strongly opposed by Special Public Prosecutor Ajay Singh Manhas appearing for the Narcotics Control

Bureau (NCB). The court noted that Ravinder Singh is allegedly the kingpin of the drug syndicate and had been in constant touch with co-accused Gurjit Singh, both telephonically and through personal meetings-even while being lodged in Central Jail in connection with a murder case under

Significantly, although Singh was not taken into custody during the initial investigation, his involvement

Section 302 RPC.

emerged from call detail records (CDR), tower location data, jail visitation records, and statements recorded under Section 67 of the NDPS Act. The NCB has alleged that despite being in judicial custody, Singh continued to direct and conspire in the smuggling operation, qualifying him as a conspirator under Sections 29, 8/21(C) of the NDPS Act.

Judge Sharma highlighted that the commercial quantity of heroin recovered and Singh's criminal background, along with the severity of the offence and its harmful impact on society, particularly the youth, weigh heavily against granting bail. The court also emphasized the applicability of Section 37 of the NDPS Act, which imposes stringent conditions for bail in drug-related offences.

Stating that the offences alleged are of a serious nature and impact society at large, the court concluded that the petitioner does not deserve judicial discretion of bail. The bail application was accordingly dismissed as devoid of merit.
