"I had a productive meeting with the Director General of the ASI and his high-level team. We discussed in detail some of the ongoing and future conservation initiatives ShreeJagannatha Temple," Padhee said in a post

The meeting also focused on critical restoration work to be taken up in the 'Garbha Griha' (sanctum sanctorum) during the upcoming Ratha Yatra from June 27.

Deliberations were held on the remaining conservation and repair work of the 'Ratna Bhandar' (temple treasury), and early completion of the ramp system for facilitating aged and specially abled devotees. Provision for air-conditioning in the 'Nata Mandapa' (dance hall), facade lighting of the temple and conservation work at the 'Jagamohana'

ing of the Jammu Kashmir Teacher Master Association (JKTMA) was held under the chairmanship of veteran trade union leader Rakesh Singh, and attended by a large number of teachers, masters, and executive members from various districts.

During the Rakesh Singh expressed strong resentment over the inordinate delay in the Departmental Promotion Committee (DPC) for promoting teachers to the posts of masters and lecturers. He emphasized that the delay, coupled with the vacant posts of lecturers in higher secondary schools, is severely affecting the academic interests of students in government schools.

He further pointed out that the successful implementa-Education Policy (NEP) 2020 at the ora is being hindered due to this issue. Singh reiterated that the DPC should be conducted based on 100% DPC quota as a one-time exemption, as per the decision of the State Administrative Council (SAC).

Highlighting the plight of "hanging" Higher Secondary Schools. Singh Education Minister Sakina Itoo to sanction posts of principals and lecturers in these institutions. Currently, senior classes in these schools are being managed by regular teachers, which is putting an additional teaching burden on them.

Raising another significant concern, Singh drew attention to the issue of fake postgraduate science degrees obtained through off-campus study centres without attend-

ing regular classes or practicals. He argued that such degrees cannot be equated with those earned through full-time on-campus programs, and there is an urgent need to review the recognition of such degrees for the ofthrough DPC.

He proposed that fixing seniority for DPC based or the date of obtaining PG and B.Ed degrees, rather than the date of joining, would discourage the acquisition of fake degrees, particularly in science subjects.

Addressing the media,

Singh also appealed to Minister Sakina Itoo to complete the Annual Transfer Drive (ATD) of teachers and avoid mid-term transfers, which disrupt academic continuity.

The forum also commended the various reformative steps taken by Minister Sakina Itoo for the betterment of students and teachers, and for creating a positive environment for teaching and learning.

Several other key resolutions were passed during the meeting, including Enhancement of House Rent

Allowance employees; Provision of rural allowance for general line teachers posted in remote areas; Incentives for teachers and masters serving in high schools and higher secondary schools; and Educational allowance for teachers holding advanced qualifications such as M.Ed and Ph.D.

The association reaffirm its commitment to continue raising teachers' issues and urged the government to address them in a timely and effective manner for the holistic development of the education system.

BSF launches all-women incense making venture along Bangla front

ion has engaged a Kolkata-based expert to impart training to the women folk in the village and is helping them source the raw material and prepare the final product, a senior BSF officer said.

More than 400 packets were sold on the inaugural day. The customers were local villagers and personnel of various BSF camps located in the area, he

Each packet costs Rs 25 and has 40 incense sticks. Officials said the women plough back the profit into purchasing raw material

and the cycle is expected to continue as a sustainable venture.

"The aim is to meaningfully engage the border population and ensure a sustainable source of income for the local women," Commanding Officer of the battalion Sujeet Kumar told PTI.

Another officer said the indigenous incense manufacturing project is aimed at not only facilitating financial inclusion of the locals but also curbing cross-border crimes by engaging them in sustainable livelihood opportunities.

Before initiating the project, a BSF team went around the villages in the area seeking to invite women who would like to learn the craft of incense sticks making and earn from the skill. The response was enthu-

siastic and that is how the venture came to life, the officer said. The border guarding forces undertake such initiatives as part of their

'civic action work' charter to create a goodwill with the local population and engage them as the eyes and ears of the forces to ensure security.
