I&K Govt to hold special cabinet meeting in Pahalgam today

SRINAGAR: The Jammu and Kashmir government, under Omar Abdullah's leadership, will hold a special cabinet meeting in Pahalgam on Tuesday, a move intended as a powerful message against terrorism and violence in the Union territory, officials said.

This is the first time the cabinet meeting will take place outside the usual summer capital, Srinagar, or winter capital, Jammu, during this government's tenure.

The choice of Pahalgam also aims to show solidarity with the residents of the tourist town, which has experienced a sharp decline in tourist footfall since the deadly April 22 terror attack that resulted in the deaths of 26 people, mostly tourists.

Although the meeting's agenda is not yet public, officials stressed that the gathering's significance lies more in its symbolic communica-

anti-social elements that violence has no place in Jammu and Kashmir.

Abdullah, during his first stint as the chief minister of erstwhile state of Jammu and Kashmir from 2009-14, had held cabinet meetings in remote areas like Gurez, Machil, Tangdhar of north Kashmir and Rajouri and Poonch areas of Jammu region.

The decision to hold a special cabinet meeting comes two days after Abdullah on Saturday proposed a dual approach to resuscitate Jammu and Kashmir tourism sector, impacted by the Pahalgam terror attack, urging the Centre to mandate PSUs to hold meetings in Kashmir and to convene parliamentary committee meetings

He had made this appeal at the Governing Council meeting of the NITI Aayog under the chairmanship of Prime Minister Narendra Modi.

The chief minister believes that these concerted efforts by the government will significantly alleviate public fears, foster a renewed sense of security and trust, and ultimately pave the way for the revival of tourism in the Kashmir valley, bringing much-needed economic relief

and a return to normalcy. During a special day-long assembly session in Jammu on April 28, the Jammu and Kashmir government had unanimously passed a resolution against the Pahalgam attack and resolved to fight resolutely to defeat the nefarious designs to disturb communal harmony and hinder progress.



India embraces tourism, Pakistan sees 'terrorism as tourism': Modi

Narendra Modi on Monday asked the people of Pakistan to raise their voices against terrorism, asserting while India believes in tourism, "Pakistan considers terrorism as tourism," a mindset he warned was not only ruining their nation, but also posing a grave danger to the world. Speaking at a rally in Bhuj, Gujarat, on his first visit to the state since Operation Sindoor, India's military response to the April 22 Pahalgam terror attack, in which tourists were targeted, Modi warned that if Pakistan's citizens do not choose peace, they would face the wrath of the Indian

"Those who promoted terrorism ruined your future," Modi said to the gathering in



Bhuj, a town in Kutch district that shares both land and maritime borders with Pakistan, in a message directed at the citizens of the neighbouring country. "While India believes in

DAHOD (GUJ): Prime Minister Narendra Modi on Monday said Pakistan's only aim is to hate India and think of ways to harm it, while our nation has set goals of removing poverty and bringing about economic development. Addressing a rally in Dahod in Gujarat, the PM hailed

Operation Sindoor and said it was not merely military action, but an "expression of India's ethos and feelings"
