
Modi Govt democratised education, job opportunities for youth: Dr Jitendra

STATE TIMES NEWS NEW DELHI: Crediting the Modi government for having democratised education and job opportunities for youth, Union Minister Dr. Jitendra delivered a compelling keynote address at the "Education Tech Summit" organised by News18, showcasing India's meteoric rise as a global leader in innovation, entrepreneurship, and economic growth. He underscored the nation's transition from being one of the "Fragile Five" economies to "Top Four" now competing with the most developed nations on key global indica-

Dr. Singh highlighted India's dramatic improvein the Global ment Innovation Index, rising from Rank 80 to 39 in just a few years. "This index is a universal parameter - not developed by us, but by the global community," he



reflects international confidence in India's innovation ecosystem.

Citing the phenomenal impact of the Startup India initiative, Dr. Jitendra said India has surged from Rank 350 to Number 3 globally, with over 1.7 lakh registered startups. What started as a visionary call from the Red Fort has become a grassroots movement, driving job creation, technological advancement, and youth-led innovation. The "Make in India' initiative, he said, has sparked a nationwide sense

of self-belief and empowerment, particularly among the younger population. With a focus on domestic production and reduced dependency on imports, it has opened up new avenues for innovation and enter-

Dr. Singh praised the government's efforts in democratizing education and job opportunities. "Gone are the days of connections and under-the-table dealings," he With digitized stated. recruitment, outsourced testing, and interview-only qualification processes, meritocracy now defines career progression in India.

Pointing to India's 11,000 km coastline, the Minister highlighted the Deep Ocean Mission as a strategic step to country's untapped marine wealth including minerals, metals, fisheries, and biodiversity.

He emphasized that India

underscoring the nation's deep-rooted maritime legacy.

India's Himalayan region, long overlooked, is now being tapped for its vast ecological and economic potential. Dr. Singh lauded the emergence of agri-tech startups and drone-based farming, which are transforming agriculture into a high-tech, high-efficiency sector, ensuring both environmental sustainability and farmer prosperity.

Under the government's Aroma Mission, a new wave of Lavender Startups has taken bloom, particularly in the Union Territories. Over 3,000 youth entrepreneurs, without formal degrees, are earning Rs. 65 lakh or more annually - proving that innovation doesn't require a Ph.D., only a mindset and the right opportunity.

India is preparing to send an astronaut to the

moment that reflects global recognition of India's scientific and technological capabilities. "The world has started valuing Indian talent and expertise," Dr. Singh said, pointing to a new era of international collaboration in space exploration.

Concluding his address. Dr. Jitendra highlighted the far-reaching impact of the National Education Policy 2020, calling it a transformational roadmap that equips youth with critical thinking, digital skills, and a learner-first approach. NEP 2020, he said, is key to unlocking India's full potential by $2\bar{0}47$.

"From ocean depths to outer space, India is rising with confidence, powered by reforms, innovation, and the aspirations of its people," Dr. affirmed. Singh expressed firm optimism that India will reach the pinnacle of global leadership well before 2047, when the country celebrates 100 years of independence.

BJP high-level committee assesses border damage, recommends Bunkers, Jobs, and increased Compensation

STATE TIMES NEWS JAMMU: A high-level committee comprising senior BJP leaders visited the shelling hit villages to assess the damages to the life and property and outlined the party's assessment of civilian losses and ongoing relief efforts in border areas affected by Pakistan shelling. This was stated by Sunil Sharma, Leader of Opposition & General Secretary, J&K BJP, accompanied by Dr. Narinder Singh, BJP National Secretary & MLA, Sham Lal Sharma, BJP Vice President & MLA, and Adv RS Pathania, J&K BJP Spokesperson & MLA, was addressing a press conference at party headquarters, Trikuta Nagar, Jammu.

Dr. Pardeep Mahotra, Media Incharge, J&K BJP, was also present on the occasion.

Sunil Sharma expressed profound grief and condemnation over the inhuman Pakistansponsored terrorist attack in Pahalgam, where 26 innocent civilians were killed. The attack was particularly disturbing, as the terrorists targeted male family members after identifying them based on religion. This gruesome act, he said, stands as one of the most horrifying terror crimes committed in Jammu and Kashmir in the last 36 years of

In a resolute and strategic response to the Pahalgam attack. Indian security forces launched Operation Sindoor on the night of 6th and 7th May. Sunil Sharma clarified that the operation was meticulously designed to be non-escalatory, non-civilian, and nonmilitary in nature, focusing exclusively on neutralizing terrorist infrastructure. The operation resulted in the elimination of over 100 terrorists and dismantling of nine major terror hideouts.

Despite the targeted and controlled nature of the operation, the Pakistan Army retaliated unreasonably, launching indiscriminate shelling on civilian areas along the border. This led to significant loss of life, destruction of homes, live-

stock, and agricultural assets. Sunil Sharma briefed that in response to Pakistan's aggression. Indian forces undertook a historic counterstrike, which resulted in the destruction of 11 Pakistani airbases and military establishments. This

action compelled Pakistan to seek a ceasefire. strategic Demonstrating restraint, the Indian Army temporarily withheld further action under Operation Sindoor, placing a clear condition: any future act of terror will be treated as an act of war, and consequences will be far

more severe. The operation also represented a diplomatic victory for India, reinforcing its global position on counter-terrorism while avoiding full-scale military escalation.

To assess the extent of civilian loss and damage due to Pakistani shelling, a committee was constituted by the BJP's central leadership. The committee comprising Sunil Sharma, Dr. Narinder Singh, Sham Lal Sharma, Dr. Devinder Kumar Manyal, and Adv. R.S. Pathania, visited all major affected areas including Hiranagar, Suchetgarh, Arnia, RS Pura, Chamb, Pallanwala, Akhnoor, Rajouri, Nowshera, Poonch, Mendhar, Surankote, Uri, and Tangdhar.

Their findings included 14 civilian deaths in Poonch, 2 in Rajouri, 1 each in Uri and Nagrota and more lives were lost in the chaos. Widespread damage to property, with 690 houses damaged in Poonch, 534 in Uri, and over 1,500 to

2.000 houses affected overall. Sunil Sharma said that the local population, though grieving, expressed satisfaction with the swift and firm response of Indian forces. Many residents acknowledged that existing community bunkers helped save lives,

though there is now an urgent need to construct additional individual and community bunkers along the border.

Sunil Sharma shared that

the BJP delegation submitted the key demands to the Ministry of Home Affairs and the Lieutenant Governor of Jammu & Kashmir, which included Immediate construction of more bunkers to ensure civilian safety. Government jobs for families who lost a member due to shelling, Increased compensation for damaged homes beyond the existing limit of ?1.2 lakh under SDRF norms. The committee also recommended the dishureal through Direct Benefit Transfers (DBTs) to ensure efficient and immediate disbursal of aid.

The government has already disbursed Rs 6 lakh from the Ministry of Home Affairs and Rs 10 lakh from the UT Government as ex-gratia relief bereaved families. Assistance to the injured has also been provided. However, compensation for property damage remains inadequate. and the BJP has formally requested that revised guidelines be introduced to address

this gap. Sunil Sharma reiterated the party's commitment to the safety, security, and dignity of all residents living in border areas. They pledged to continue advocating for better infrastructure, stronger compensation mechanisms, and long-term policy solutions to deal with the persistent threat of cross-border terrorism and shelling.


