## AJBRCEA delegation meets BJP J&K leadership to address transfer policy for Jammu-based reserved category employees

JAMMU: A delegation from the All Jammu Based Reserved Category Employees Association Kashmir (AJBRCEAK), led by its President, Anil Radhey, today met with the BJP J&K State President, Shri Sat Sharma Ji, to discuss the critical and long-standing issue of transfer policy for Jammu-based reserved category employees serving in the Kashmir Division. This lack of rotation contributes significantly to employee distress.

Other executive members of the delegation included Lovely Devi, Ravinder Kumar, Surjeet, Joginder, Sahil, and Manoj Kumar.

AJBRCEAK expressed its sincere gratitude for the encouraging and supportive response from the BJP J&K leadership and looks forward to concrete actions and the swift implementation of a fair and equitable transfer policy in the coming days. The association remains committed to advocating for the welfare and rights of its members.

The Legal Aid Defense Counsel System (LADCS) has been implemented across all 20 districts of the UT of J&K to provide effective, professional, and accessible legal services to underprivileged and disadvantaged communities, in accordance with Section 12 of the Legal Services Authorities Act, 1987.

Due to the inadequate number of eligible candidates and the vacancies arising from the engagement of Deputy LADCs as Chief LADCs, a fresh advertisement is hereby issued, inviting applications from eligible lawyers possessing the requisite qualifications for full-time engagement on a monthly honorarium basis."

- The Notification/Advertisement of LADCs should be prominently displayed on the notice boards at the District & Sessions Judge's office, Secretary's office (DLSA), and the Bar Rooms. Additionally, the notification must be shared on relevant WhatsApp groups and legal professional networks to further enhance the participation of qualified candidates.
- Candidates with experience at the Bar must attach a certificate attested from the concerned District & Sessions Judge verifying their actual practice. This certificate is necessary to authenticate their experience and confirm their eligibility for the position.
- The Secretaries, DLSAs are requested to actively engage with Bar Associations at the District Headquarters to spread awareness about the selection process and to motivate qualified lawyers to apply and participate, ensuring a strong pool of candidates for the position.
- The engagement of LADCs will be on a **monthly honorarium basis** initially for a period of one year only, extendable by another year based on performance, availability of funds and further instructions from NALSA.
- Completed application forms, along with the required self-attested documents, must be submitted personally to the respective District Legal Services Authority (DLSA) office against a proper receipt in the office of the Secretary, DLSA concerned. Any application submitted after the specified date and time will not be entertained or considered.

Selection Criteria for Engagement of LADC

The selection shall be made on the basis of experience, practice, professional skills, knowledge, personality, IT knowledge and higher qualification. The criteria for the selection of LADCs is as under:

Selection Criteria for Chief LADC

Total 62 Marks

Practice in Criminal Law

(Maximum 15 marks)

The marks are awarded based on the candidate's years of experience:

• Requirement is minimum 10 years of practice in Criminal Law at the bar or above

Points Distribution:

o Minimum marks (10 years): 10 marks

o Additional marks: 1 mark for each additional year of experience beyond 10 years, up to a maximum of 15 marks (for 15 years or more of experience).

Example:

• 10 years of experience → 10 marks

• 11 years of experience → 11 marks

• 15 or above years of experience → 15 marks
