Their dream seems within reach when Khemu, an elderly, one-handed farm worker, offers to help them buy land. However, a tragic accident shatters this dream, highlighting the unpredictability and harsh realities of life. The play beautifully explores themes of friendship, aspiration, and the fragile nature of human dreams, reflecting how fate often entraps the innocent,

much like a mouse caught in a trap.

The lead role of Jaggu was convincingly portrayed by Neeraj Sethi, who brought depth and sharpness to the character with his controlled expressions and mature stage presence. Sunil Sharma delivered a heartfelt performance as Lori, capturing the character's innocence, emotional vulnerability, and physical presence with great sincerity and nuance.

Pradeep Sharma played the role of Khemu, the wise and compassionate one-handed worker, and impressed with his calm, grounded performance that anchored the moral core of the play.

Kumar also addressed the historical context of World Press Freedom Day, reminding the audience of the 1991 Windhoek Declaration and the role of UNESCO and the United Nations General Assembly in establishing this day in 1993. He reiterated that press freedom is not

only essential for democracy but also for safeguarding human rights, promoting transparency, and ensuring informed public discourse.

The event witnessed participation from the entire faculty, including Dr. Snobar, Prof. Sandeep Kumari, Prof. Braham Dutt, Dr. Shivali Panjgotra, Priya Sharma, Anjali Devi, Dr. Susheel Kumar and Sayema.

A large number of students actively participated in the session, expressing their deep interest in the topic and their appreciation for the role of media in shaping society. The session concluded with a renewed commitment to uphold press freedom, combat disinformation, and foster media literacy among the youth in an AI-driven world.

IGP Jammu conducts comprehensive security review of NH, critical installations

JAMMU: Inspector General of Police (IGP), Jammu Zone, Bhim Sen Tuti, accompanied by DIG Jammu-Samba-Kathua Range, Shiv Kumar Sharma, conducted an extensive review of security arrangements along the National Highway (NH) and critical installations.

The IGP was joined by Shobhit Saxena, SSP Kathua; Joginder Singh, SSP Jammu; and Virender Singh Manhas, SSP Samba, during the inspection.

The security assessment covered key locations,

including Gangyal, Samba city, Kathua, Lakhampur, Police Post Basantpur, Mahampur, Police Post Rampur, Majalta, Police Post Manwal, Jindrah, and Domel.

The IGP evaluated existing security measures, identified vulnerabilities, and directed necessary enhancements to ensure the safety of commuters and vital infrastructure.

The IGP instructed increased deployment of personnel, enhanced surveillance, and improved inter-agency coordination to mitigate potential threats.

The IGP issued directives for heightened security measures, including intensified patrolling, random checkpoints, and the use of modern surveillance tools like CCTV monitoring. He also stressed upon the importance of community policing and regular mock drills to ensure swift crisis response.
