## Medical shop sealed for illegal drug possession STATE TIMES NEWS

law. In light of the findings, the said medical shop was sealed under Section 22 (d)of the drugs and Cosmetics Act, 1940 for the unauthorized sale and possession of habit-forming drugs.

On this occasion, the scientists who contributed to the research of both varieties, DRR Rice 100 (Kamla) and Pusa DST

Rice, were also honoured. While addressing the participants, Union Minister Shivraj Singh Chouhan said that the scientists of ICAR, inspired by the Prime Minister's vision of a developed India, have made extraordinary achievements

innovating new varieties of rice.He added that the new varieties will enhance rice vields by 20-30 per cent, conserve water and reduce greenhouse gas emissions from rice cultivation.Both of these varieties exhibit superior drought tolerance and high nitrogen-use efficiency. The minister said DRR Dhan 100 (Kamala) matures about 20 days earlier (130 days) than its parent, enabling earlier harvests and potential for crop rotation or multiple cropping cycles.

Chouhan also stated that we need to work on adopting the minus 5 and plus 10 formula. The meaning of this formula is to reduce the area of rice cultivation by 5 million (50 lakh) hectares while increasing the production of 10 million (one crore) tons of rice in the
