The move will "safeguard the interests of crores of Indian mobile and internet users. This decision is a targeted move to ensure safety and sovereignty of Indian cyberspace", it added. The list included prominent names like TikTok (which has over 200 million users in India), SHAREit, WeChat, UC Browser, Helo, Likee and Cam Scanner, among others.

The Indian Cyber Crime Coordination Centre, Ministry of Home Affairs, has also sent an exhaustive recommendation for blocking these malicious apps, the statement said, adding that there has been a strong chorus in the public space to take strict action against apps that harm India's sovereignty as well as the privacy of citizens.

Likewise, there have been similar bipartisan concerns flagged by various public representatives, both outside and inside Parliament.

"On the basis of these and upon receiving recent credible inputs that such apps pose threat to sovereignty and integrity of India, the Government of India has decided to disallow the usage of certain apps, used in both mobile and non-mobile Internet enabled devices," it added.

Comments from these companies could not be immediately obtained.

"There have been raging concerns on aspects relating to data security and safeguarding the privacy of 130 crore Indians. It has been noted recently that such concerns also pose a threat to sovereignty and security of our country," the statement said.

previous two rounds of dialogue took place at Moldo on the Chinese side of the LAC.

On Tuesday, the two sides are expected to deliberate on moving forward in implementing the decision to disengage of the forces, the sources said, adding any significant breakthrough is unlikely to emerge from the talks.

The Indian delegation at the meeting will be headed by 14 Corps Commander Lt Gen Harinder Singh while the Chinese side is likely to be led by the Commander of the Tibet Military District Major General Liu Lin.

Following the Galwan Valley incident, the government has given the armed forces "full freedom" to give a "befitting" response to any Chinese misadventure along the LAC, the 3,500-km de-facto border.

The Army has sent thousands of additional troops to forward locations along the border in the last two weeks. The IAF has also moved air defence systems as well as a sizeable number of its frontline combat jets and attack helicopters to several kev air bases.

In a strongly-worded statement, the external affairs ministry last week held China responsible for the standoff saying it has has been amassing a large contingent of troops and armaments along the LAC since early May and that conduct of the Chinese forces is in complete disregard of all mutually agreed norms

The first round of the Lt General talks were held on June 6during which both sides finalised an agreement to disengage gradually from all the standoff points beginning with Galwan

However, the situation deteriorated following the Galwan Valley clashes as the two sides significantly bolstered their deployments in most areas along the LAC.

Tensions had escalated in eastern Ladakh after around 250Chinese and Indian soldiers were engaged in a violent face-off on May 5 and 6. The incident in Pangong Tso was followed by a similar incident in north Sikkim on May 9.

Prior to the clashes, both sides had been asserting that pending the final resolution of the boundary issue, it was necessary to maintain peace and tranquillity in the border areas.

Of the 380 new deaths reported, 156 are from Maharashtra, 65 from Delhi, 54 from Tamil Nadu, 19 from Gujarat, 16 from Karnataka, 12 from Andhra Pradesh, 11 from Uttar Pradesh, 10 from West Bengal, eight from Rajasthan, seven from Madhva Pradesh, five each from Haryana and Punjab, four from Telangana, three from Odisha and one fatality each was reported from Jammu and Kashmir, Assam, Goa, Uttarakhand and Bihar.

Of the total 16,475 deaths reported so far, Maharashtra tops the tally with 7,429 deaths, followed by Delhi with 2,623, Gujarat with 1,808, Tamil Nadu with 1,079, Uttar Pradesh with 660, West Bengal with 639, Madhya Pradesh with 557, Rajasthan with 399 and Telangana with 247 deaths.

The COVID-19 death toll has reached 223 in Haryana, 207 in Karnataka, 169 in Andhra Pradesh, 133 in Punjab, 94 in Jammu and Kashmir, 60 in Bihar, 38 in Uttarakhand, 22 in Kerala and 21 in Odisha.

Chhattisgarh has registered 13 deaths, Jharkhand 12, Puducherry and Assam 10 each, Himachal Pradesh nine, Chandigarh six, Goa three and Meghalaya, Tripura, Ladakh and Arunachal Pradesh have reported one fatality each, according to the health ministry.

They also filed CM No.2161/2020 for vacation of the direction dated June 15, 2020 under which the respondent Bank was directed to postpone the availability of the internet link for registration of candidature by the prospective candidates for the posts of Probationary Officers and Banking Associates.

When this case was taken up for consideration on June 26, 2020, D.C Raina, Advocate General, appeared before the court pursuant to the court's request made vide order dated June 15, 2020. He submitted that the issue whether the Jammu and Kashmir Bank Limited is a State within the meaning of Article 12 of the Constitution does not arise because the Bank has been declared as a public authority in terms of the erstwhile State Administrative Council (SAC) Decision No.148/20/2018 dated November 22, 2018. He further submitted that pursuant to the aforesaid SAC decision, the Jammu and Kashmir Right to Information Act, 2009 and CVC guidelines stand applied to the Bank and it was also made accountable to the State Legislature. The Advocate General in this regard produced photocopy of a communication purported to have addressed by the Principal Secretary to Government, Finance Department, to the Chairman/CEO of the Bank informing him about these decisions of the SAC. This communication does not bear any number and date. However, the Under Secretary to Government, Finance Department, has endorsed copies thereof to the Private Secretaries to the Governor, Advisor (S) and the Chief Secretary, under endorsement No. FD/BKG/2019/13 dated February 12, 2019 which indicated the roundabout date of the aforesaid communication. Sunil Sethi, Senior Advocate, representing two respondents did not contest this position.

Justice Ali Mohammad Magrey observed that having regard to the plea of the writ petitioners that the Bank was a State within the meaning of Article 12 of the Constitution, amenable to the writ jurisdiction of this Court, and the above facts brought to the notice of the Court by the Advocate General, admitting the plea of the writ petitioners, nothing more needs to be done on the issue. Consequently, the Full Bench decision of this Court in Firdous Ahmad Tanki versus the J&K Bank Ltd., 2006(1) S. L. J. 1, is no more attracted to the Bank. The issue is, therefore, deemed to be not arising anymore and closed as such.

The Advocate General simultaneously argued that now that the Central Administrative Tribunal Act, 1985 (CAT Act) is applicable to the Union Territory of Jammu and Kashmir, and the Bank having been declared as a Public Authority. this Court does not have the jurisdiction to entertain this writ petition. The Advocate General in this behalf referred to the Preamble and various provisions of the CAT Act, including Sections 2, 14 and 28 thereof. On this, the senior counsel for the petitioners sought time till today to argue the case on the point of jurisdiction of the Court to entertain the writ peti-

Senior Advocate Jehangir Iqbal produced a copy of Government order No.377-F of 2019 dated July 4, 2019 on the subjects of streamlining the procedure for procurement of Goods and Services and award of contracts by Public Sector Undertakings / Autonomous bodies / Societies and creation of posts and regulation of recruitment in Public Sector Undertakings / Autonomous bodies / Societies. This Government order contains certain directions to be observed by the Public Sector Undertakings / Autonomous bodies /Societies. In the last para, the communication reads, "These directions shall come into effect immediately with respect to Sector Undertakings/Autonomous Bodies/Societies, including those listed in Annexure A". In the Annexure 'A' to the aforesaid Government order, J&K Bank Ltd., figures at serial no 1 of the list of Public Sector Undertakings / Autonomous Bodies / Societies. This all is referred to at this stage herein for the limited purpose to show that the J&K Bank Limited has been deemed to be a Public Sector Undertaking / Autonomous Body / Society and State within the meaning of Article 12 of the Constitution. This issue stands already concluded and settled on the statement made by the learned Advocate General on the previous date, narrated hereinabove. However, the aforesaid supporting fact brought to the notice of the Court today is recorded

Justice Ali Mohammad Magrey observed that so far as the second issue raised by the Advocate General on the previous date of hearing, that since the CAT Act is applicable to the Union Territory of Jammu and Kashmir, and the Bank having been declared as a Public Authority, this Court does not have the jurisdiction to entertain this writ petition, this Court heard the arguments in this regard in some detail. The orders in that regard are reserved.

Justice Ali Mohammad Magrey observed that the argument raised on behalf of the Advocate General does not seem to be supported by Section 14 of the CAT Act. However, the issue would be dealt with in detail in the order.

Senior Advocate Sunil Sethi appearing for the J&K Bank has strenuously pressed for disposal of CM Nos.2161/2020 and 2160/2020. These civil miscellaneous petitions have been filed by the two respondents for vacation of the direction dated June 15, 2020 issued to the respondent Bank to postpone the availability of the internet link for registration of candidature by the prospective candidates for the posts of Probationary Officers and Banking Associates.

Justice Ali Mohammad Magrey observed that in the CM so filed by the aforesaid respondents it is, inter alia, stated that the functioning of the respondent Bank is suffering for nonavailability of sufficient staff on the advertised positions. It is further stated therein that in absence of such staff, the Bank is not able to provide adequate banking service to its customers, and that, resultantly loss would be caused to the customer confidence and business of the Bank.

Justice Ali Mohammad Magrey observed that the direction dated June 15, 2020 was passed by this Court with a view to securing the interests of the petitioners as well as to avoid any future inconvenience to the prospective candidates. Now the interests of the respondent Bank itself have been placed before the Court for its consideration. "This Court is of the view that interests of the Bank are of paramount importance and that delay in registration of candidature by the prospective candidates may prolong the selection process which may be injurious to the interests of the Bank. This Court would not wish the Bank to be put to any loss or injury by operation of any order of this Court. At the same time, the Court has to ensure that the writ petitioners are not non-suited" Justice Magrey observed.

"However, there is no denying the fact that the petitioners have only participated in the selection process. The law being that mere participation in the recruitment process does not confer any right of appointment on a candidate, the Court is of the opinion that even if candidature of prospective candidates pursuant to the fresh notification dated June 1, 2020 is registered and the selection process is allowed to be completed upto a certain stage, it would not confer any right of appointment on such candidates. Whether the ultimate selection process should be completed pursuant to the earlier advertisement notification or the subsequent notification would naturally be dependent on the final decision in the writ petition", the court observed.
