"The National Education Policy seeks to position India as a knowledge hub in today's knowledge economy. It seeks to make our youth equipped for the world of the 21st century while preserving our ancient values which remain relevant even today," Kovind said in his address at the fifth convocation of the Indian Institute of Management (IIM) Jammu. The President also inaugurated a

diversity cell at the institute. "For India to become a global knowledge hub, our institutes of learning have

to be globally comparable. "I am happy to note that the number of Indian institutions in the global rank-

# Centre plans third chopper route SI Written Exam Scam: LG orders inquiry for Amarnath pilgrims

NEW DELHI: The Centre is contemplating to start a new helicopter service from Srinagar to Panchtarni, which is the last drop-off point for pilgrims visiting holy cave shrine Amarnath, in addition to the two already existing chopper routes for the pilgrimage, officials said.

The move came in view of the anticipated rush of the pilgrims to the shrine dedicated to Lord Shiva located at an altitude of 3,888 metres in the upper reaches of Himalaya in Jammu and

The pilgrimage is sched-

uled to begin on June 30 and will continue for 43 days.

As of now, helicopter services are available for the pilgrims from Baltal and Pahalgam to Panchtarni. From this drop-off point, pilgrims either walk or ride a mule or travel in a palanquin to the Amarnath shrine 6 km away. Both Baltal and Pahalgam are about 90 km from Srinagar.

A new helicopter route is being planned this year --Budgam (near airport) Srinagar to Panchtarni, an official said.

The Shree Amarnath Shrine Board (SASB), which

manages the pilgrimage, has also been asked to check if it would be feasible to land the choppers at the foothill of the Amarnath cave.

As of now, only the choppers which ferry high level dignitaries land near the

To express resentment over the post, members of a particular community including large number of women, a protest in Bhadarwah. Moreover, Section 144 of CrPC has also been imposed in Sub Division Gandoh with immediate effect. "I appeal to all media fraternity not to post any objectionable material in the social media, as it can

damage communal fabric. Also if someone has posted some objectionable thing, it is requested to delete it. Your insensible post can cost much to the society. If any material found irrational and blasphemous may please be brought into the notice of administration so that proper and legal action under rules can be initiated," urged DM Doda.

Besides Baderwah, curfew has also been imposed in the Ramban district. The Commissioner Deputy Ramban said that Section 144 Code of Criminal Procedure has been imposed in the district for safety and security of the general public.

# Two hybrid LeT terrorists arrested in Sopore


JAMMU: Jammu and Kashmir Police on Thursday arrested two hybrid terrorists linked with proscribed Lashkar-i-Toiba (LeT) terror outfit with incriminating materials, arms and ammunition in Gurseer area of North Kashmir's Sopore, police said.

"Based on specific input about movement of terrorists, a joint Naka was established by PC Sopore along with 52 RR at Gurseer in the jurisdiction of Police Station Tarzoo. During checking, the joint party intercepted two persons coming from Darpora Delina towards Seer who on seeing joint Naka party tried to escape but were apprehended," a police officer said.

"The arrested duo have been identified as Faizan Ahmad Paul, son of Fayaz Ahmad Paul, resident of Pinjoora, Shopian and Muzamil Rashid Mir, son of Abdul Rashid Mir, resident of Aarihal Pulwama," officer said adding that incriminating materials arms and ammunition including two pistols, two magazines and five pistol rounds were recov-

ered from their possession. "Preliminary investigation has revealed that the arrested persons are hybrid terrorists of proscribed terrorist organisation LeT (TRF) and were in constant search of an opportunity to carry out attacks on security forces
