disbursed. To mark the occasion at the UT level, the Lt Governor inaugurated 100 Amrit Sarovar sites and Grih Pravesh Programme for 27,000 Pradhan Mantri Awas Yojna (Grameen) beneficiaries. The Lt Governor expressed gratitude to Prime Minister Narendra Modi on behalf of the people of J&K, for connecting the UT of J&K to the mainstream of development and ensuring progress, social equality and social justice for all. It is a matter of great pride that in eight years of PM Narendra Modi's good governance, the people-centric policies have empowered the most disadvantaged sections of our society, said the Lt Governor. The Lt Governor termed 'Garib Kalyan Sammelan' as a significant initiative to highlight the stories of positive change in the lives of common citizens. The last eight years have witnessed a record growth, and it was ensured that the fruits of growth are equitably distributed for social inclusion, education, health, rural development, agriculture and improving rural and urban infrastructure, added the Lt Governor. Jammu & Kashmir and its people were deprived of the development for seven decades. Now, the Constitutional provisions to provide equal rights to common people are being implemented on the ground, he added. We have kept the aspirations of people at the heart of government policies and schemes, and we are committed to ensure financial inclusion and that the last man in the queue

receives equal opportunity. Under PM's guidance, our aim is to make development a powerful people's movement in J&K, the Lt Governor said. Highlighting the progress achieved in various welfare schemes, the Lt Governor said that the government machinery at all levels is working with greater dedication and commitment. The speed of execution of projects and saturation of schemes has increased five times as compared to what the government used to achieve earlier, he added. J&K has performed better in Pradhan Mantri Awas Yojana - Rural and Pradhan Mantri Awas Yojana - Urban. Farmer-centric reforms introduced by the government in the last three years have increased the income of the farmers of J&K manifold. The UT of J&K is now among the top five States/UTs in terms of farmers' income with a monthly income of Rs 18,918 per farmer. We have also achieved notable success in our endeavour to end malnutrition in Jammu and Kashmir. Similarly, 2.7 lakh beneficiaries were covered under Pradhan Mantri Matru Vandana Yojana till last financial year and more than Rs 107 crores have been distributed among them. In the current financial year till April 2022, 5458 beneficiaries were linked to the Pradhan Mantri Matru Vandana Yojana and an amount of Rs 2 crore 76 lakh has been directly transferred to their account, said the Lt Governor. Rural sanitation coverage in Jammu and Kashmir is another sector where, as a result of the efforts of the central government, we have registered remarkable progress with 100% saturation. Jammu and Kashmir has performed well in the Swachh Bharat Urban Abhiyan. Today, 100% of waste is being collected from every household and by November this year, we will also be successful in processing 60 to 70 % of the

waste. Further, an amount of Rs 648 crore has been sanctioned for waste management in all 78 urban local bodies, added the Lt Governor. Speaking on the achievements registered under Jal Jeevan Mission, the Lt Governor said the UT Government is working on a mission mode to achieve the ambitious goal of 100% piped water (Har Ghar Nal se Jal). We have achieved 57.82% household coverage achieved so far, which is much higher than the national average of 49.23%. Today we have succeeded in providing tap water connection to 10.61 lakh households. Apart from two districts- Ganderbal and Srinagar, all rural schools, Anganwadi centers and hospitals have also been connected with tap water connections, he added. J&K has secured 8th position in Atal Mission for Rejuvenation and Urban Transformation (AMRUT) scheme implementation. Similarly, the UT has secured second rank in the list of Union Territories and Small States under the Prime Minister's SVANidhi Program. Under the scheme, the government is providing assistance to 24,000 street vendors and to-date, loan has been disbursed to 14,078 beneficiaries. J&K has also improved the ranking under MUDRA Yojana which has enabled enable small traders to start new businesses or to expand the existing ones. Altogether more than 2.62 lakh accounts have been opened, and Rs 5696 crore has been disbursed to small and micro-entrepreneurs under the scheme. Under the Pradhan Mantri Garib Kalyan Yojana, more than 5.47 lakh metric tonnes of food grains have been distributed till last month, the Lt Governor further added. Sectors like Health, Infrastructure, Road Connectivity and Industries have witnessed a massive transformation in the last three years, the Lt Governor observed. Now, J&K has become

one of the leading States/UTs in the healthcare sector and medical education. Two AIIMS, two cancer institutes, seven new medical colleges, 15 new nursing colleges, and thousands of health and wellness centers, besides universal health insurance coverage for up to Rs 5 lakh under Ayushman Bharat-SEHAT without any discrimination have ensured Affordable and accessible healthcare to all segments of society of J&K. At present 69.60 lakh beneficiaries are registered under Ayushman Bharat-SEHAT and about 76% of the families have at least one beneficiary registered, added the Lt Governor. Earlier, only six km of road was constructed daily in Jammu and Kashmir, but today we are building 20 km of road every day. J&K has improved its ranking to fourth position in the Pradhan Mantri Gram Sadak Yojana, the Lt Governor said. He further observed that industrial development in J&K could not take a leap as only Rs 15,000 crores worth investment was received since Independence till last year. Under the guidance of Prime Minister, within one year, industrial investment of Rs 38,000 crore was approved in the UT and it will increase to Rs 75,000 crore in the coming days. North India's first Industrial Biotech Park at Kathua has been inaugurated recently and within a year a similar park will be ready in Handwara which will provide support to start ups and other industries in Jammu and Kashmir, informed the Lt Governor. Rajeev Rai Bhatnagar, Advisor to the Lt Governor; Dr Arun Kumar Mehta, Chief Secretary; Atal Dulloo, Financial Commissioner (Additional Chief Secretary), Agriculture Production Department, besides Administration Secretaries, senior officers of UT administration and hundreds of beneficiaries were present on the occasion.

CRIME REPORT

Notorious fraudster arrested by Cyber Police Kashmir from New Delhi

■ **STATE TIMES NEWS** SRINAGAR: Cyber Police Kashmir has arrested a Srinagar-based notorious con-man involved in dozens of online cheating and fraud cases. A team of Cyber Police Kashmir apprehended one Haroon Fayaz Bazaz, son of Fayaz Ahmad Bazaz, resident of Alamgari Bazar, Srinagar from New Delhi. The accused has duped dozens of people on pretext of selling online clothes and cheap airline tickets, and was mainly operating from Delhi and Goa. Cyber Police Kashmir received a complaint from one Ishfaq Ahmad, son of Gh Mohd Bhat, resident of Bandipora stating that on September 25, 2021, while using Facebook, he saw a post uploaded by another user having a Facebook page 'Craft Core Exports' dealing with winter clothes collection. Accordingly, he contacted the aforesaid user on given mobile number, who introduced himself as wholesale dealer of clothes, presently running a shop in the name of Haroon Bazaz & Co, located at 8/21 Jangpur Extension, South Delhi. The complainant ordered some clothes and electronic items from him online, for which he transferred an amount of Rs 3,61,000 into bank account of accused. After that, the aforesaid Facebook user switched-off his phone. Later, the complainant realized that he is a notorious cheater /fraudster who impersonated as businessman via social media platform. On the receipt of s information, case FIR No 25/2021 under relevant sections of law was registered and investigation taken up. During investigation, this Police Station came to know from different sources and various media channels that this online fraudster has not only duped the complainant, but also dozens of other innocent people in Kashmir on the pretext of providing cheap airline tickets. The Modus Operandi of the accused was to create fake social media profiles to impersonate as authentic travel agencies and then post advertisements for cheap air tickets with best offers. People, in an urgency to travel by Air, search low price travel tickets on social media sites and used to get trapped in fraud. Gullible customers shared personal details and make online payments to the fraudster's bank account. After paying money online, the fraudster never provided tickets to customers and when customers called him, his used to switched off mobile. Almost a dozen complaints of such nature were received from different persons and accordingly, another case FIR No. 27/2022 under relevant sections was regis-

tered by Police Station Cyber. Strenuous efforts were made to arrest the accused, however, he evaded arrest by frequently changing his locations. Utilizing technical expertise and investigative acumen of Cyber Police team, the accused was traced in New Delhi. Keeping in view the sensitivity and nature of offences committed by accused, on the directions of Inspector General of Police, Kashmir Zone, Srinagar a special team of Cyber Police Kashmir was deputed to New Delhi and with assistance of Delhi Police, accused was arrested from Paharganj area of New Delhi.

Notorious drug-peddler arrested; contraband recovered

■ **STATE TIMES NEWS** BUDGAM: Continuing its efforts to curb the menace of drugs, Police arrested a notorious drug peddler in Budgam and recovered contraband substance from his possession. As per the details, Police Station Magam received a specific information through reliable sources that one Abdul Rashid Parray, son of Abdul Ahad Parray, resident of Naidpora Bon Makhama has indulged in drug peddling and hoarded a huge quantity of narcotics in his house. On receipt of information, a party from Police Station Magam raided the location and recovered 25 Kg Poppy straw. The accused was arrested and shifted to Police Station where he remained in custody. Accordingly, FIR No. 74/2022 under relevant sections of law was registered at Police Station Magam and further investigation started.

38 bovines rescued, smuggler arrested

■ **STATE TIMES NEWS** RAJOURI/KATHUA: Acting tough against bovine smuggling, Police on Tuesday rescued 38 bovines in Kalakote and Kathua. Police said that teams led by SHO Kalakote Deepak Pathania along with PSI Amit Radhay and HC Rajesh Sharma laid a Naka and intercepted a bovine smugglers moving on foot. On seeing police, the smugglers although managed to escape from the spot but police successfully rescued 18 bovines. Meanwhile, a police team headed by Insp Amit Sangra SHO Rajbagh under the supervision of SDPO Border Pankaj Soodan while on Naka/checking duty at NHW opposite to Police Station Rajbagh noticed two Mahindra Load Carriers (JK08L-8127 & JK08L-5795) which were signaled to stop for checking. On thorough checking, 5 bovines were recovered from a Mahindra Vehicle ( JK08L-8127) which was driven by one Kalu, son of Feroz Din, resident of Pathankot Punjab while 6 bovines were recovered from another vehicle (JK08L-5795), driven by an unknown person, who managed to flee. FIR No. 116/2022 under sections 188 of IPC, 11 of PCA Act was registered at Police Station Rajbagh and further investigation started. While in another instance, a team of Police Station Rajbagh under the supervision of SDPO Border Pankaj Soodan and Insp Amit Sangra SHO Rajbagh while on Naka checking duty near NHW Rajbagh noticed two suspicious vehicles (JK02CT-7104 & PB35U-7704). On thorough checking, 4 more bovines were rescued from vehicle PB35U-4506 while 5 were rescued from another vehicle (JK02CT-7104).

FIR No. 117/2022 under sections 188 of IPC, 11 of PCA Act was registered at Police Station Rajbagh and further investigation started. Overall 20 bovines were rescued, a person was arrested and 4 vehicles were seized.

Patient missing from GMC Jammu

■ **STATE TIMES NEWS** JAMMU: A patient went missing from GMC Jammu on Tuesday. As per details, a man who came to GMC Jammu for check-up went missing. His family has lodged a missing complaint with police, which has started manhunt to trace him.

Man arrested with empty gun shells

According to information, police got information that a person is in possession of empty shells of 105 mm of Indian Field Gun. Acting on this, a police team conducted a raid and recovered shells. He was arrested and taken to the police station. During investigation it was found that he had taken shells from Nowshera. Two more persons were detained in this regard for questioning.

Bootlegger nabbed with illicit liquor

■ **STATE TIMES NEWS** JAMMU: Police on Tuesday nabbed a bootlegger and recovered illicit liquor from his possession at Gadkhal area. As per details, acting on a tip-off, police conducted a raid and nabbed a person with 10 bottles of illicit liquor. The accused was identified as Avtar Chand, resident of Gadkhal.

Clash between people & Gujjars at Chinore Farm over land dispute

■ **STATE TIMES NEWS** JAMMU: A clash erupted between locals and Gujjars living there over possession of 256 Kanals of grass grazing land of Chinore Farm in Kanachak, after which Gujjars attacked the locals who were cutting grass for cattle. The locals somehow saved their lives. According to the information, Agriculture and Farmers Welfare Development floated an online tender for grazing grass in 256 acres of land of farm, which was taken by BJP leader Dharamvir Singh Jammwal for Rs 4.55 lakh. Dharamveer further gave the land to local people namely Sunil Singh, Khajur Singh and Ajay Singh to cut grass and when they were grazing cattle there and cutting grass, members of some Gujjar families, including women, reached there and started after arguing with people, attacked them and drove them away. Gujjar families also damaged the fencing done by the department. On getting information, senior police officers reached the spot and after hearing both the parties, called them to SDM Jammu's office to resolve the dispute.
