

LG Mathur chairs 4th Ladakh Development Conclave

NEP-2020, JJM, Smart City Project, Land Allotment Policy discussed during meet

LEH: The Lieutenant Governor of Ladakh, RK Mathur, chaired the 4th Ladakh Development Conclave to discuss National Education Policy (NEP) 2020, Ladakh Smart City Project, Jal Jeevan Mission and Industrial Land Allotment Policy, in Leh on Friday. Chairman, LAHDC Leh, Advocate Tashi Gyalson; Chairman, LAHDC Kargil, Feroz Ahmed Khan and Member of Parliament, Ladakh, Jamyang Tsering Namgyal, attended the Conclave.

LG Mathur stressed on the need to focus on all schools, including government, private and also schools operated by the Centre and Army, while discussing the National Educational Policy-2020. He emphasised on the need for a holistic approach while developing residential schools in Ladakh.

LG Mathur stated that the rationalisation of schools should be done in a time-bound manner.

LG Mathur emphasised on the need to develop textbooks in local languages and introduce them in schools as per NEP 2020. He directed the concerned officials to ensure the availability of basic facilities such as power, internet

connectivity, etc. in government schools.

LG Mathur suggested that websites may be developed for all the government schools in Ladakh with relevant information such as the learning outcomes of the schools.

LG Mathur stressed on promotion of digital education through ICT labs, the issuance of tablets pre-loaded with educational content to students and community radio.

During the discussion on Ladakh Smart Cities project, LG Mathur suggested that the concerns of the stakeholders be addressed.

While discussing the implementation of the Jal Jeevan Mission (JJM) scheme in Ladakh, LG Mathur appreciated the efforts of the PHE Department.

He stressed on the need to ensure that the quality of the

work is not compromised despite the target set by the Administration to provide functional household tap connections (FHTCs) to all the households in Ladakh by August 15 this year:

He advised the concerned officials to exercise the opportunity provided in the JJM scheme to provide good quality and prescribed quantity of potable water to the beneficiaries and community radio.

LG Mathur stated that Small Industries Development Corporation (SIDCO) should take responsibility for the maintenance and development of existing and new industrial estates in Ladakh.

LG Mathur directed the concerned officials to conduct the audit of land allotted to beneficiaries and to insert a clause in the lease for the eviction of the beneficiary from the allotted

land in case the industrial unit start-up fails to start.

LG Mathur also handed over student kits procured under the Changthang package to Hill Council, Leh to be distributed to students in Changthang area.

He launched the e-Seva portal (<http://eseva.ladakh.gov.in>) with 14 e-services of various government departments for the convenience of the public. He also launched the Jal Jeevan Mission Grievances Redressal Portal (<http://jaljeevanladakh.in/>).

CISF to guard JSW Steel plant in coastal Maharashtra

NEW DELHI: The CISF deployed a contingent of over 70 armed personnel to provide counter-terrorist security cover to a major manufacturing plant of leading steel maker JSW Steel in Maharashtra's coastal Raigad

district on Friday.

An induction ceremony was held at the facility located in Dolvi village of the district for the induction of the paramilitary contingent, a Central Industrial Security Force (CISF) spokesperson said.

The security cover came about after the Union home ministry approved the cover, expenses for which will be borne by the company.

"JSW Dolvi is located close to the financial capital of

India, Mumbai, and it plays a vital role in the economic growth of not only the surrounding areas but also of the country.

"The proximity of the plant to the coastal area makes it

prone to various threats, and in the light of this perception,

security of JSW Dolvi is of

utmost importance as this vital installation is contributing in the national economy," the spokesperson said.

He said an armed contingent of over 70 personnel, headed by an inspector-rank official of the force, will provide security to the 1,500-acre campus and its employees, on a quick reaction team (QRT) pattern where troops are positioned at vantage positions and on vehicles.

The facility is a private five

million tonnes per annum integrated steel plant. It is located around 80 km from Mumbai by road and about 36 km from the Gateway of India by sea, the spokesperson said.

JSW Steel is the flagship business of the USD 13-billion diversified JSW Group, which has a presence in sectors such as energy, infrastructure, cement, paints, sports and venture capital.
