

## LG Mathur reviews progress of Forest & Wildlife Department

LEH: The Lieutenant Governor of Ladakh, RK Mathur, chaired a meeting to review the progress of the Forest & Wildlife Department, at Raj Niwas on Saturday.

Principal Secretary, Forest, Ecology and Environment (FEE), Dr Pawan Kotwal and Chief Wildlife Warden, Mufti Sajjad Hussain, attended the meeting. LG Mathur stressed on the need to target saturation coverage of individual-oriented benefits such as chain-link fencing, Corral pens, solar lights & heaters, etc.

He emphasised on 100% upgradation of home stays in Ladakh. He suggested that the Forest & Wildlife Department may procure organic waste composters in large numbers from the Compensatory Afforestation Fund Management and Planning Authority (CAMPA) fund and Special Development Package (SDP) to address the issue of feral dogs.

LG Mathur suggested that cafeterias with telescopes and waste disposal facilities be developed along with the installation of watch towers in

Tsomo Riri and Pangong Lakes. He stressed on the need to plant sea buckthorn and Sanjeevani herbs on a large scale in Ladakh. He advised that a Tissue Culture Lab may be set up in Ladakh on the public-private partnership (PPP) model to produce superior quality plants using this technique. LG Mathur advised the Forest & Wildlife Department to conduct the census of wild animals, birds and water bodies in Ladakh by engaging research scholars to determine their numbers and varieties. He said the data collected from the census would enable them to draft the management plan efficiently. He suggested that the Forest & Wildlife Department may seek assistance from Zoological

Survey of India, Botanical Survey of India and Bombay Natural History Society also for the implementation of various projects in Ladakh.

LG Mathur advised the Forest & Wildlife Department to conduct training on wildlife for guides and stakeholders from local tour operators to build their capacities and enhance their knowledge of the wildlife found in Ladakh. He further advised the Department to draft a policy that includes guidelines on livelihood options from Forest/Wildlife activities for the people of Ladakh and the protection/preservation of wildlife and forests. He stressed on the need for the development of new pastures and maintenance of existing

pasture land for the benefit of the livestock.

LG Mathur inquired about the CAMPA Fund, the appointment of collectors for the settlement of rights in protected areas, the progress in the implementation of the 5-year Carbon-Neutral Plan, enumeration of water bodies, status of distribution of satellite phones in remote areas for emergencies, Forest/Wildlife Management Plan, setting up of Butterfly Park, the status of the installation of the seencer, development of flowers on walls around KBR Airport, the upgradation of the Choglamsar Forest Park, etc.

Earlier, Chief Wildlife Warden, Mufti Sajjad Hussai, gave a detailed presentation on the rationalisation of boundaries, feral dogs issue, land diversion cases, the appointment of collectors for settlement of rights, status of rescue centres and watch towers, revised homestay policy, updates on CAMPA fund, plantation of juniper saplings as a part of sacred grove plan in monasteries in Leh and Kargil along with plantation of medicinal and aromatic plant

nurseries, Saw Mill and Timber Sale Depot Rules, steps taken by Ladakh Pollution Control Committee, viz. grant of consent given to hotels, the release of fund by Central Pollution Control Board for installation of air quality monitoring stations in Leh and Kargil, procurement of dust samplers and noise-monitoring equipment, etc.; promotion of new wildlife tourism destinations in the form of Rong Valley ecotourism and Himalayan Bear Tourism in Drass; Hanle Dark Sky Sanctuary; setting up o International Snow Leopard Centre (ISLC) and Mountain Research Institute (MRI); mitigating Human-Wildlife Conflict through the use of Animal Intrusion Detection and Repellent Systems (ANIDERS), compensation for wild animal attacks, etc.

Chief Wildlife Warden, Mufti Sajjad Hussain also provided updates on the Wildlife Management Plan for Hemis National Park, Changthang Wildlife Sanctuary and Karakoram Wildlife Sanctuary.

## India moving from women-specific to women-led projects: Dr Jitendra

NEW DELHI: Union Minister, Dr Jitendra Singh on Saturday said that in the Biotech Start-ups sector, India is moving from women specific to women-led projects. He said, India today is looking at a growth of the Biotech sector from \$80 Billion to \$150 Billion in the next 4 years and added that this cannot be accomplished without the active participation of women.

After releasing a book based on "Compendium of 75 Women Biotech Entrepreneurs" at Biotech Start-up Expo held at Pragati Maidan here, Dr Jitendra Singh was addressing the session "The Way Forward".

He said, in the past 8 years of Modi Government, the number of female entrepreneur-owned Biotech companies has seen an exponential rise and this can be

aply described as women-led empowerment, rather than only the women empowerment.

The Minister said that women scientists have carved a niche for themselves in Space, Nuclear Science, Drone and Nano-technology and added that many of the big scientific projects including that of the most ambitious manned mission Gaganyaan to be launched in 2023 are being led by women

scientists. He said, one of the key pillars of Prime Minister Narendra Modi's New India is the success story of women innovators in the country.

Dr Jitendra Singh said, the DST and DBT in the Union Ministry of Science & Technology have special schemes to attract women scientists and to provide employment opportunities to the unemployed women scientists.

The Minister said, market conditions, access to varied business opportunities, and female entrepreneurs' readiness to jump into the world of business ownership create a winning trifecta.

Dr Jitendra Singh revealed that the number of Biotech Start-Ups in the country has increased from 50 to over 5,000 in the last 8 years, because of the support and enabling milieu provided by Prime Minister Narendra Modi ever since he took over in 2014.

It is expected to cross the figure of 10,000 by 2025, he added. Dr Jitendra Singh released two publications, "75 Biotech products developed during 75th year of Independence" and "Compendium of 75 Women Biotech Entrepreneurs" on the occasion.
