NAGBOTA. Pitching for strong sction against the terror eco-system in the hin-terland and on the border, Lieutenant Governor Manoi Sinha on Monday said better coordination by security agencies is needed to deal with continuous attempts by outside forces to foment

trouble in the union territory. Sinha said the government has a clearcut policy on dealing with terrorism -"not to spare any terrorist and not to touch any innocent". The LG said that terrorists and their

supporters should be handed out the same punishment

"Attempts by outside forces (to forcent trouble in Jammu and Kashmir) are continuing

"There is a need for strong action in the hinterland as well as on the bor-ders", Sinha told army personnel at a function organised in connection with the golden jubilee of the Indian Army's 16 Crops here.

He said that apart from dealing with (infiltrating) terrorists on the borders, troops have to be ready to crush them in the hinterland

"They (terrorists) are out to cause destruction in the society at the behest of the neighbouring country. To deal

them, you have to increase our potential and vigilance along with better coordination with all sacurity agencies",
