JAMMU: President, Apni Trade Union, Ajaz Kazmi has demanded a probe against the lathicharge on the peacefully protesting NHM employees and demanded that they should be regularized in the Govt service.

Expressing his solidarity with the NHM employees, he said that "It was injustice that the NHM employees who were protesting peacefully in support of their demands were dragged and beaten up by the police with no justification in this democratic society."

He said that the use of force against the NHM employees including some women was highly condemnable and it must be investigated who had ordered the lathicharge on the innocent people.

"The Govt and the police must understand that they are our people and the state's machinery should not work

against its own people. Protesting in a democratic manner for their genuine demands is not a crime, but it's a constitutional right guaranteed to them," he said.

He said that the young generation was disheartened with the lathicharge on the protesters.

"These NHM, contractual workers, and daily wagers had hoped that one day Govt will frame a policy for their regu-

larization in the Govt service after recognising their services. However, it did not happen but the NHM employees were disengaged in an unfortunate manner without considering their demands on humanitarian grounds," he said.

He extended support to the daily wagers and all other temporary workers in different departments and assured that the Apni Party's struggle will continue for them.

Elder abuse is a sensitive subject amongst most Indian families and the report throws up sharp contrast on the perception of the existence of abuse to admitting the experience of abuse personally. 59% elders feel that elder abuse is prevalent in society, while only 10% elders admitted to being a victim of elder abuse, with relatives (36%), Son (35%) & Daughter-in-law (21%) being the top 3 perpetrators. Disrespect (57%), verbal abuse (38%), neglect (33%), economic exploitation (24%) and an alarming 13% elders experienced physical abuse, in the form of beating and slapping. Today team Helpage India conducted meet & greet programme, theme was bridge the gap where few young children tie wrist bands on elder's wrist to express their love for them to 'unite the generations.'
