21 vaccinated, 1,326 samples collected in Ramban

Unchecked wild-fire destroying green gold, Forest Deptt acting as mute spectator

JAMMU: In ongoing summer season, when the mercury is reaching record heights, several incidents of wild-fire are being reported from several parts of the Union Territory, especially in vast forest belt along Jammu - Rajouri National Highway, commencing from Tanda to Bhamla. Due to these fire incidents, not only wild animals are facing a life threat, but the precious green gold of J&K is getting destroyed to a great extent. It is really surprising that J&K Forests Department, which has been bestowed with the responsibility of taking care of these precious natural resources, despite equipped with adequate equipments and man-force, is totally mum over this major issue and has not taken any effective measures to put a check on such incidents. The

department officials, who should always remain present on spot to avoid occurrence of such incidents, are most of the times absent from their duties and can be observed only performing a formality of assisting personnel of Fire & Emergency Services in dousing the fire, after it had caused huge damages. One really finds it hard to understand that despite repeated occurrence of wild-fire incidents, especially during summers, the department has still not formulated some effective strategy to contain the threat, for safeguarding the precious wild wealth of J&K. The need of the hour is to put in some effective measures for devising a strategy for avoiding such incidents for safeguarding the green gold, which at present is at great risk due to lackadaisical attitude of Forests department.


