BJP leader Sahil Mahajan also eulogised such occasions as an epitome of communal harmony and brotherhood.

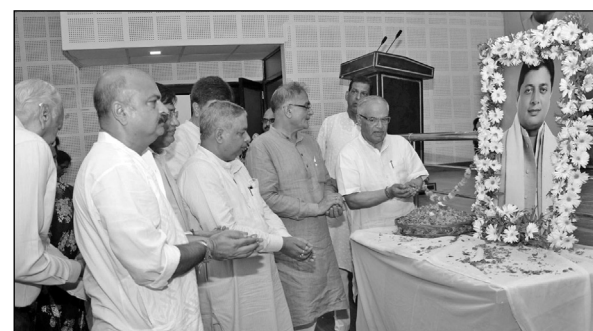

## CRIME REPORT

### Three theft cases solved; juvenile among two arrested, stolen items, cash recovered

JAMMU: Police on Tuesday solved three theft cases by arresting accused persons involved in commission of the crime and recovered the stolen mobile phones, accessories and cash. The police said that on May 23, 2022, Police Post Bathindi Jammu received a complaint about theft of 6 Mobile phones, accessories along with some cash from a mobile shop. Accordingly, FIR No. 143/2022 under sections 457/380 IPC was registered and an investigation started. After this, a team of Police Station Bahu Fort under the supervision of SDPO East Syed Zaheer Abbas Jafari led by SHO Bahu Fort Insp. Nayat Ali assisted by Incharge Police Post Bathindi PSI Mohd Younis Khanday, after putting in strenuous efforts and with help of several CCTVs of the area, along with timely human intervention finally rounded up a suspect identified as Muzamil Butt, son of Mohd Sadiq Butt, resident of Phagsoo Thathiri, at present staying at Azad colony near Army Gate Sunjwan Jammu. During intensive questioning accused confessed his involvement in crime and on his disclosure, all the stolen mobile Phones along with accessories and cash was recovered.

On further questioning, accused disclosed his involvement in theft case at J&K Grameen Bank Malik Market Narwal Jammu which took place on March 9, 2022 and FIR No. 75/2022 under sections 457/380/511 of IPC was registered at Police Station Bahu Fort. In the theft case, he has committed crime along with a juvenile associate, who was also apprehended by the Police. Further, he has confessed his involvement in theft of cash from a shop at Doogyan Bathindi for which FIR No. 102/2022 under sections 457/380 of IPC is already registered.

The arrest and recoveries were done under the supervision of SP South Manta Sharma. Further investigation is going on to ascertain his involvement in other cases.

### 9 vehicles seized for illegal mining

JAMMU: In a major crackdown on menace of illegal mining, a multi-pronged strategy was devised by Jammu Police in which police teams of Police Stations Nagrota , Akhnor, Police Posts Chatha, Pomi Chak and Jourian acted stringently on the specific inputs and raided at different locations in their respective areas and seized 9 different vehicles involved in illegal mining on third consecutive day. The seized vehicles included a Dumper (JK02CR-9192), a tractor without registration number and 2 Tipppers (JK02CS-3771 and JK02CW5489) seized by Nagrota police; a tipper without registration number seized by Akhnor police; a tractor-trolley bearing Chassis No MBNGAALU2NRA00428 seized by Chatha Police; 2 tractor-trolleys without Registration numbers seized by Pomi Chak Police and a tractor trolley bearing engine number 803505D938-267354DX and chassis no. 2904H seized by Jourian Police. The recoveries were made by SHO Nagrota Insp. Vishva Partap Singh, SHO Akhnor Insp. Hilal Azhar, Incharge Police Post Chatha SI Ranjit Singh, Incharge Police Post Pomi Chak PSI Nitish Khajuria and Incharge Police Post Jourian PSI Karnail Singh in their respective jurisdictions.

### Drug peddler nabbed with 1.5 Kg Ganja

JAMMU: Continuing its drive against drug trafficking and substance abuse, police on Wednesday nabbed a drug peddler and recovered 1.5 Kg Ganja from his possession.

Rampura, Odisha. He was arrested and FIR under relevant sections of law was registered against him at Police Station Bahu Fort.

### Bootlegger nabbed with 23 bottles of illicit liquor

### Two narco smugglers nabbed with heroin

NOWSHERA: Police on Wednesday foiled a narcotics smuggling bid by arresting two narco smugglers and recovered heroine like substance from their possession.

Police said that in drive against drug menace, patrolling party of Police Post Lamberi while checking duty at Lamberi area, apprehended two suspects namely Rajinder Kumar alias Raghu, son of Puran Singh, resident of Kot Morah, Akhnor in Jammu and Vishal Singh alias Vishu, son of Karan Singh, resident of Akhnor Jammu. During checking, 8 gm heroine like substance was recovered from Rajinder Kumar and 7 gm same contraband was recovered from possession of Vishal Singh. The duo have been arrested and FIR No. 135/2022 under sections 8/21/22/25/29 of NDPS Act was registered against them at Police Station Nowshera. The arrest and recovery took place by special efforts of PSI Arun Singh, SHO Nowshera. Rajesh Jasrotia and SDPO Nowshera Tussif Ahmed under the supervision of Additional SP Nowshera Amit Verma.

### Kidnapped minor girl recovered within 24 hours; accused arrested

RAMBAN: Police on Wednesday recovered a kidnapped minor girl within 24 hours and arrested an accused. After hectic efforts, Ramban police finally recovered the minor girl within 24 hours from Punjab with active assistance of cyber team of Ramban Police. The accused was also arrested. ### Fake bovine permission racket busted; woman among 12 smugglers arrested, 68 bovines rescued

RAMBAN/POONCH: Police on Wednesday busted a fake bovine permission racket and rescued 68 animals at Ramban and Poonch.

As per details, acting on the specific inputs regarding illegal smuggling/transportation of bovines, a party from Police Post Jawahar Tunnel intercepted vehicles including a Tata 407 (JK08M-1372) loaded with 4 bovines, truck (JK02CN-4520) loaded with 13 bovines, Truck (JK02AD-2747) loaded with 11 bovines, Truck (JK14A-4277) loaded with 7 bovines and a truck (JK21C-7214) loaded with 11 bovines. During verification, drivers along-with other accomplices produced permissions issued by Sub-Divisional Magistrate, Hiranagar. However, police got suspicious and aforesaid permissions were verified with concerned authority, after which it came to fore that the permissions are forged. On this, FIR Nos 141, 142, 143, 144, 145/2022 under sections 188, 420, 34 of IPC, 11 of PCA Act were

registered and accused namely Mohd Sadiq, son of Abdul Gani, resident of Garah Kumar Tehsil Hiranagar District Kathua; Rashida Bano, wife of Farooq Ahmed, resident of Mela Tehsil Hiranagar District Kathua; Ashiq Hussain Bhat, son of Mohd Saleem Bhat, resident of Karmail Tehsil Assar District Doda; Sajad Hussain, son of Junaid Ali, resident of Garah Kumar Tehsil Hiranagar District Kathua; Mohd Naseer, son of Abdul Salam, resident of Batote, District Ramban; Sarfaraz Ahmed, son of Mohd Masood, resident of Garah Kumar Tehsil Hiranagar District Kathua; Mohd Mansha, son of Mohd Sharief, resident of Jandrah Tehsil Dansal District Jammu; Mohd Farooq, son of Abdul Rehman, resident of Mela Tehsil Hiranagar District Kathua; Jaffar Ali, son of Nizam Din, resident of Selkodi, Tehsil Majalta District Udhampur and Amjad Ali, son of Khalid Hussain, resident of Behaiya Tehsil Hiranagar District Kathua (Absconder) were arrested. The involved vehicles were also seized and investigation started. The overall rescue, arrest and seizure were made by the police team under the supervision of PSI Harish Kumar, Incharge Police Post Jawahar Tunnel, Insp. Muneer Khan SHO Banihal, Nissar Ahmed Khoja SDPO Banihal and under the overall Supervision of Mohita Sharma, SP Ramban. During further investigation, it was revealed that a well-established organized gang of bovine smugglers are issuing fake permissions on behalf of Sub Divisional Magistrate, Hiranagar. Further arrests and recovery in the matter are expected besides role of any Government official is also being ascertained in this regard. Poonch Police also rescued 22 bovines from the clutches of bovine smuggler and foiled smuggling bids in Surankote area.

On direction of SSP Poonch Rohit Baskotra, teams headed by DySP Surankote Tanveer Jeelani, SHO Police Station Surankote Insp. Niaz Ahmed, Incharge Police Post Behramgalla ASI Mahroof Ahmed established Nakas at Behrangalla and Baffiaz areas. 2 bovine smugglers were apprehended and 2 vehicles (JK12B 0223 & JK03F 6428) were also seized. Two FIRs No 159 & 160 under section 188 of IPC, 11 of PCA Act were registered at Police Station Surankote.

### 3 drug peddlers arrested; contraband recovered

SRINAGAR: Police in its recent action against drug dealings in Budgam & Anantnag arrested 3 drug peddlers and recovered contraband substance from their possession.

In Budgam, acting on specific information that one Mohammad Altaf Malik, son of Ghulam Mohammad Malik, resident of Haripora Haran has indulged in drug peddling and hoarded narcotic substance in his house, a party from Police Station Budgam headed by PSI Mohammad Adil Tak raided the spot. During search, 3 Kg Poppy Straw, 125 gm Charas along with cash amounting to Rs 13,500, believed to be proceeds of narcotic crime were recovered. The accused was arrested and shifted to Police Station where he remained in custody.

In Anantnag, a police party from Police Station Anantnag during Naka checking intercepted 2 suspects, identified as Haamid Nisar Shah, resident of Reshi Colony Mir Dantar Anantnag and Suhail Ahmad Sheer Gojri, resident of Brienty Batapora Dalgam. During search, 6.5 Kg Poppy Straw and 28 Codeline Phosphate bottles were recovered from their possession. Both were arrested and shifted to police station where they remained in custody. Accordingly, cases under relevant sections of law were registered in respective Police Stations and investigation started.

### Criminal booked under PSA, lodged in Kot Bhalwal Jail

KATHUA: A team of District Police Kathua under overall supervision of SSP R C Kotwal and led by Inspector Amit Sangra SHO Rajbagh under supervision of SDPO Border Pankaj Soodan on Wednesday apprehended a notorious criminal namely Roshan Din, son of Sher Wani, resident of Hande Chak Tehsil Marheen, who was evading arrest from last two months and against whom a detention warrant under Section 9 of Jammu and Kashmir Public Safety Act 1978 was issued by the District Magistrate Kathua. In order to prevent his illegal activities, a dossier was prepared against him and sent to District Magistrate Kathua for his detention under Public Safety Act (PSA). Accordingly District Magistrate Kathua issued a detention warrant against him, which was executed. The accused has been lodged in Central Jail, Kot Bhalwal Jammu.
