### Assassin of police...

information regarding the movement of terrorists, a joint checkpoint was established near Juhama crossing in Baramulla by police and 52 RR of the Army at about 4 pm on Tuesday, a police spokesman said.

During checking, the movement of a suspicious person was noticed and after seeing the security forces, he tried to flee. However, the alert joint party apprehended him, he said.0

The spokesman said the arrested person was identified as Shahid Ahmad Parray, a resident of Kathpora in the Hajin area of Bandipora district.

"On his personal search, incriminating material, arms and ammunition including one pistol, one pistol magazine, seven pistol rounds and two hand grenades were recovered from his possession," he said.

The spokesman said preliminary investigation revealed that the accused was working as a hybrid terrorist linked with the LeT. He was trying to carry out terrorist activities in Baramulla town and adjacent areas.

In Budgam district, security forces busted a terror module of the LeT by arresting three terrorist associates.

"They have been identified as Ashiq Hussain Hajam, Ghulam Mohi-ud-Din Dar and Tahir Bin Ahmed, all residents of Chadoora, the spokesman said.

"Preliminary investigation revealed that the arrested trio was involved in facilitating transportation of terrorists, arms/explosive materials and providing logistic support to the active terrorists of proscribed terror outftt LeT in Budgam district," he said.

Incriminating material, arms and ammunition including one Chinese pistol, two pistol magazines, 22 pistol rounds, one AK magazine and 30 AK rounds have been recovered from their possession, the spokesman said, adding one motorcycle used in terror crimes has also been seized.

Accordingly, a case vide FIR No.114/2022 under relevant sections of law was registered at police station Chadoora and further investigation is in progress, he said.

stayed away from the opposition meet, welcomed the announcement.

"Congratulations Smt DraupadiMurmu on being announced as candidate of NDA for the country's highest office. I was delighted when Hon'ble PM Narendra Modi ji discussed this with me. It is indeed a proud moment for people of Odisha," BJD chief and Odisha Chief Minister Naveen Patnaik tweeted.

Murmu said she was surprised as well as delighted by the announcement.

Incidentally, her name was also doing the rounds for the BJP's likely choice for the top constitutional post in 2017.

As a tribal woman candidate of the ruling combine, her candidature may persuade many regional parties, not aligned to either the NDA or the opposition, to back her; BJP sources said. Even some opposition parties will not be seen to be opposing her; they added.

Opposition leaders, who gathered at the Parliament annexe for the meeting convened by NCP chief Sharad Pawar to decide on a common candidate for the much-discussed presidential election, unanimously agreed on Sinha's name.

"He is eminently qualified to uphold the secular and democratic character of the Indian Republic and its Constitutional values," the joint statement said.

The veteran politician, who has been an MP from Jharkhand, stepped aside from the Trinamool Congress before the announcement of his name and will file his nomination papers on June 27.

"We regret the Modi government made no serious effort to have consensus on a presidential candidate," Congress leader Jairam Ramesh said reading out the statement. He noted that the initiative to have a consensus candidate for the highest office of the Republic should have been taken by the government. "We are happy to announce that we have unanimously chosen Yashwant Sinha as the common candidate of the opposition parties for the presidential election, which will take place on July 18, 2022," Ramesh said. The leaders also announced that a committee has been formed to steer Sinha's presidential campaign. Sinha, who has been vocal on a range of issues, is in his 80s. Pawar told reporters that he has personally spoken to a cross-section of leaders from various parties. These included Delhi Chief Minister Arvind Kejriwal from the Aam Aadmi Party (AAP) and Telangana's K Chandrashekar Rao from the TRS who stayed away from the meeting. "We will also try to convince the BJD and YSR Congress," Pawar said when asked whether they are on board. The parties that attended the meeting included the Congress, NCP, TMC, CPI, CPI-M, Samajwadi Party, National Conference, AIMIM, RJD and AIUDEF Five regional parties considered nonaligned - TRS, BJD, AAP, SAD and YSRCP - stayed away. The ruling BJP-led combine has over 48 per cent vote share in the electoral college to pick the new president, and its candidate has a clear advantage over the opposition. Reading out the joint statement, Ramesh said the parties have appealed to all political parties to support Sinha as president so the country could have a worthy 'Rashtrapati' elected unopposed. His party colleague Mallikarjun Kharge said Defence Minister Rajnath Singh had called him and a few other leaders to ask whether they had a name for the top constitutional post. "This was just for the sake of contacting, This cannot be termed a serious effort," Kharge said. Sinha's name came up after Pawar, Gopalkrishna Gandhi and Farooq Abdullah declined the opposition's offer to be their joint candidate for the top post. The presidential election would be held on July 18 to elect a successor to incumbent Ram Nath Kovind and the result would be out on July 21.

## ACB books Naib...

during verification it came to fore that Government of J&K had issued circular No. 502/Circular/23/1347-80 dated 22.07.2006 with the directions that 'No change in the kind of soil can be done by any officer below the rank of Collector'. Subsequently, the Government had made policy regarding change of land use vide order No. 138-Reg (s) of 2016 dated 07.10.2016 for both and Urban & Rural areas. As per said policy, the district level committee under the chairmanship of Depty Commissioner shall process the case and forward it to Divisional Commissioner who in turn shall forward the same to Administrative Department along with his recommendations. Moreover, High Court of J&K vide order dated 10.07.2014 passed directions that 'construction in the areas of water body or abutting the water body shall remain stayed and further directed that the sale of land concerning the bed of river and the land recorded in the revenue record as Khad also remained stayed'.

The verification conducted so far prima facie established that accused officers/offcials have illegally and with dishonest intention fabricated and manipulated the revenue record by abusing their official position for pecuniary gains to confer undue benefits upon beneficiaries and corresponding loss to state exchequer. ## Bank robbery case...

bank robbery case by arresting one accused and recovered stolen cash of Rs 1,53,86,290 within 24 hours," Senior Superintendent of Police (SSP), Kathua, R C Kotwal told reporters. Ashok Kumar, Branch Manager of HDFC Bank in Kathua, filed a complaint with the police alleging that two unidentified persons entered the bank branch from a terrace door; tied the security guard and stole money, he said. Approximately, Rs 1,65,00,000 was missing from the branch, Kotwal said. A case was registered and investigation set into motion, he said. A Special Investigation Team (SIT) under Additional SP of Kathua Suresh Kumar Chib was constituted, the SSP said. The team succeeded in arresting one person, identified as Jagandeep Singh, from Kathua, he said. During questioning, he disclosed the location where the stolen cash was stashed as well as the name of another accused namely Sukhvinder Singh of Kathua, the SSP said. In the presence of Executive Magistrate Tehsildar Bikram Kumar and HDFC Bank Manager Kumar; Jagandeep Singh confessed his involvement in the robbery and on his disclosure the police team recovered Rs 1,36,87,250 from his residence and Rs 16,99,040 from the residence of another accused Sukhvinder Singh, he said. "The search for Sukhvinder Singh is on," Kotwal said. The case was solved within 24 hours by the police, he said, adding the involvement of the accused in other cases cannot be ruled out.

the shelter was voluntarily and knowingly given by the member or members of the house.

"Many attacks on civilians, security forces were conspired and planned by terrorists while using these houses as hideouts," the statement said.

While two houses have been attached in jurisdiction of Parimpora police station, one house each was attached under Nowhatta, Pantha Chowk and Zakura police stations.

"Some more such houses have been identified and any wilful harbouring will be dealt with full force of law.

"Citizens are once again requested not to harbour or give shelter to terrorists, failing which we will be forced to take resort to attachment proceedings," the police statement said.

It said in case of any forced or coercive entry by terrorists into any house, the matter should be brought to the notice of police immediately.

## Kashmir's ailment still...

over the same period. Did New Delhi's special financial treatment win over Kashmir or Kashmiri leadership? Sadly, the answer is a big NO.

That the nation suffered huge socio-political and economic losses and witnessed reigns of senseless brutalities and attacks on the Indian state and its symbols in J&K at regular intervals and also witnessed demographic changes on a massive scale not only in Kashmir but also in Jammu and Ladakh before 2018 is not a secret. Everything, including the circumstances leading to the forced exodus of the miniscule and hapless minority of Kashmiri Hindus in 1990 and demographic changes in and around Jammu city and elsewhere in Jammu province and the trans-Himalayan Ladakh, is in public domain. Hence, it's hardly necessary to reflect on all this.

It was only from June 2018 that the Central Government started asserting its authority in J&K to protect and promote further the country's paramount sovereign interests. Mehbooba Mufti-led PDP-BJP coalition government was brought down. Almost all top-ranking secessionists and terrorists were put behind bars. Radical outfits like Jamaat-e-Islami were banned. Hurriyat Conferences brought to the knees. Cases against those involved in hawala business aimed at promoting the cult of terror were registered and action also being initiated against them. Article 370 was read down and Article 35A scrapped. Ladakh was separated from J&K and granted UT status. J&K itself was reduced to the UT status. All the 890 Central laws made applicable to J&K. All or nearly all so-called mainstream Kashmiri leaders, including three former Chief Ministers, were put under detention. All these definite actions produced positive results. Kashmir witnessed peace for one year: Things started worsening after

August 2020, when those responsible for communal unrest and secessionist violence in Kashmir; including three former Chief Ministers, were freed. Almost all Kashmiri parties joined hands to form Gupkar platform with a view to playing the kind of politics these parties had played in Kashmir independently or in alliance with the ruling elite in New Delhi. The results are there before our eyes: spurt in terror related incidents, target killings, attacks on paramilitary forces, open threats to Kashmiri Hindus and all non-Kashmiris, murder of innocent government employees inside their offices, recommencement of process of migration from Kashmir; to mention only a few. The whole point is that the powers-that-be in New Delhi and official think-tanks, policy-planners and trouble-shooters have hardly tried to diagnose what ails Kashmir or will-fully ignored the hard realities. They continue to tread the same old path in Kashmir that promoted the forces inimical to democracy. They continue to blame Pakistan for the ills inflicting Kashmir conveniently overlooking the fact that while Pakistan came into being only in August 1947, Kashmir has been consistently witnessing troubles with the rise of Shahmirs since 1339. They have to review their whole policy based on the ground realities as they exist in this region. It was not for nothing that Congress veteran and former President R Venkataraman had urged PM Indira Gandhi to grant statehood to Jammu and UT to Ladakh and treat Kashmir separately (My Presidential Years). The Modi Government did exceedingly well to grant UT status to Ladakh in 2019. It should also treat Jammu like Ladakh so that the area of strife is limited to Kashmir Valley. Similarly, the Modi Government has to devise and apply a definite policy that induces the internally-displaced Kashmiri Hindus to return to Kashmir and live a peaceful, secure and prosperous life in an area that they prefer.

questioning him over multiple sessions and recording his statement under the Prevention of Money Laundering Act (PMLA).

He has not been issued fresh summons and it is understood that his questioning has ended, at least for now.

Gandhi, 52, took a half-hour break around 8 pm and re-joined the session that started in the morning at 11.30 am. He finally left the agency office at 11:30 PM.

He was questioned for three consecutive days last week, beginning June 13, and after Monday's questioning, he was asked to rejoin the session and complete the recording of his statement.

Gandhi left the agency office after midnight on Monday.

The probe relates to alleged financial irregularities in the Congress-promoted Young Indian Private Limited, which owns the National Herald newspaper.

The ED is understood to have asked Gandhi about the incorporation of Young Indian Private Limited, operations of the National Herald, the loan given by the party to the newspaper's publisher Associated Journals Limited (AJL), and the transfer of funds within the news media establishment.

It is understood that Gandhi stuck to his position that there was no personal acquisition of assets by himself or his family as Young Indian was a "not-for-profit" company and that despite he being a majority shareholder, various financial decisions taken to revive the National Herald newspaper was taken collectively by senior Congress party leaders.

The ED, sources indicated, wanted to understand how the loan was extended to AJL by the Congress party and if the provisions of the Companies Act and the anti-money laundering law were contravened in this AJL-Congress-Young Indian deal.

Gandhi is understood to have faced a set of at least 20 questions during the five days of questioning.

The move to question Gandhi was initiated after the ED recently registered a fresh case under the criminal provisions of the PMLA after a trial court here took cognisance of an Income Tax department probe against Young Indian on the basis of a private criminal complaint filed by BJP MP Subramanian Swamy in 2013.

## Shooting stones disrupt...

traffic officials said. They advised people not to travel on the highway without confirming the status of the road from traffic checking units.

"Jammu-Srinagar highway was blocked due to continuous shooting stones at Panthlhal," an official said.

Incessant rains continued in many parts of Jammu and Kashmir; including Ramban and Udhampur districts, causing a threat of more landslides on the highway, the officials said. Men and machinery have been deployed to clear the highway of the debris but shooting stones are acting as a hindrance, they said.

Meanwhile Jammu and Kashmir; especially the capital cities of Jammu and Srinagar witnessed incessant and intermittent rains for the past three days, resulting in the fall in mercury. In Srinagar, the mercury stood around 14 notches below the normal for the month of June in Srinagar even as an independent weather forecaster claimed that the city recorded its coldest June day in nearly 48 years.

According to the India Meteorological Department (IMD) Srinagar, the city recorded a maximum temperature of just 15 degrees Celsius.

"This is 14.2 degrees below normal for the month of June in Srinagar," an official of the IMD Srinagar told PTI.
