JAMMU: 25th June 2022 will be observed as Black Day in the history of Democracy as former PM Indira Gandhi imposed emergency after her election was declared illegal on 12th June, 1975 by Allahabad High Court, said BJP Senior leader & former MLC Advocate Ramesh Arora. BJP will felicitate all "Loktantra Senani (sufferers of MISA)" by presenting them with mementos in a programme to be organized on 25th June, Saturday in J&K BJP headquarter, Trikuta Nagar, Jammu, he added. Ramesh Arora accompanied by Adv. Chander Mohan Sharma and Sat Paul Singh Rathore in presence of J&K-BJP Media Incharge Dr Pardeep Mahotra briefed the media about the oppressive policies of former PM Indira Gandhi during period of Emergency. While addressing, Ramesh Arora said "J.P. moment in Bihar and Murarji Desai movement in Gujarat were against Congress government. Press censorship was imposed, fundamental rights were snatched. Courts were not having powers to challenge the same." He said, "RSS leaders were arrested including leaders arrested in Jammu and Kashmir. Numerous were tortured. People were kept under MISA (Maintenance of Internal Security Act) and DIR Nasbandi was done by force." He further said that former PM Indira Gandhi was defeated and a new era started. 12 states recognized sacrifices of Loktantra Senani, announced different schemes for them, and disclosed that L.G. Manoj Sinha is also asked to declare and recognize the Loktantra Senani. He added that Satish Sharma (All India Loktantra Senani) from Delhi will also address on the occasion.

Lateral placement of agniveers in CAPF defence PSUs and corporate world may not succeed as there will be resistance for obvious reasons and intake will be minuscule.

Armed Forces were considered best option by the youth, new scheme due to its inherent drawbacks and insecurity will force youth to choose CAPF and police forces thus adversely affecting the quality of youth joining Armed Forces. National security is of utmost importance and must not be influenced by the economical factors. Reforms should only be carried out if absolutely essential and bring positive changes. Indian armed forces are one of the best in world and proved their mettle in numerous wars and disaster management, hence nothing experiments or reforms are called for. Moreover combined threat of China and Pakistan, needs to be factored, while carrying out such reforms. Few recommendations are made to the government, for their consideration.

Firstly, cut down standing army strength by 2 lacs and bring it to 11 lacs, secondly, introduce new pension scheme in armed forces too, thirdly, enhance your defence period to seven years.

Our defence budget as compared to USA and China is woefully less and must be increased to maintain the status of an emerging super power.

Pathania urged the government to roll back or review the policy and start it as pilot project with a feedback mechanism.

He also urged the government to start the fresh recruitment on old pattern for affected youth who missed their selection due to no recruitment not done for last two years.
