Bharat, and we have undertaken multiple key initiatives to establish a transparent system to attract capital and harnessing local entrepreneurial potential.

The meeting deliberated on enhancing ease of doing business and support to local industries.

Certain measures of business revival package-2020, yet to be saturated across industries will be implemented within a time-frame to cushion the shock of pandemic, said the Lt Governor.

He said development and blossoming of businesses is possible only in peace. Those trying to disrupt the peaceful atmosphere are the biggest enemies of industrial and socio-economic growth of J&K.

At the core of the government's industrial policy is providing opportunities and assistance to local industries, economic growth and generating employment for our youth, added the Lt Governor.

The government is sensitive to the issues of the Industries and Business sector and committed to provide all assistance. A committee comprising of Industries & Commerce department and entrepreneurs is being constituted as an institutionalized mechanism to hold regular interactions with the Industry representatives, Chambers of both the divisions to resolve the issues and challenges confronting the businesses, the Lt Governor said.

The Lt Governor highlighted the technological interventions and online services introduced for extending completely transparent and hassle-free government services to the business and industry sector.

The Lt Governor further informed that the administration is working out a policy for separate industrial estate for Startups.

A similar interaction will be held in Jammu with representatives of Chamber and Industries soon.

Pertinently, many representatives of Chamber and Industries Association from Jammu region were unable to attend today's meeting due to closure of Jammu-Srinagar Highway.

During the interaction, the representatives of various associations including FCIK, KCCI, PHDCCL, KPO, TAHAFUZ, KCC, Confederation of Indian Industry, Hydrel Power Association, Kathua Industrial Association, Industrial Estates etc projected their issues and concerns and sought Lt Governor's intervention for their early redressal.

presence of militants there, a police official said.

He said the search operation turned into an encounter after the militants fired at a search party of the forces, who retaliated.

The exchange of fire is underway. So far, there are no reports of any casualty on either side, the official said.

have also been set up to strengthen the border and highway grid.

Officials said the searches were also carried out in R S Pura sector in Jammu district and Hiranagar sector in Kathua district to keep an eye on any suspicious movement.

Meanwhile, security forces have made unprecedented security arrangements for Amarnath yatra as it apprehends a higher threat perception to the pilgrims this year; a senior Army official said in Srinagar.

The Army officer, who did not wish to be identified, said security personnel three to four times more in strength have been deployed around the yatra as there's a credible intelligence of a likely terror strike.

There is an increased threat perception to the Amarnath yatra this year. We generally receive inputs about terrorists targeting the yatra every year, but this year; there are more such inputs, the officer said.

He said the administration expects the number of yatris to go up this year especially since the pilgrimage is taking place for the first time in four years -- it was cancelled mid-way in 2019 with the Centre's revocation of J-K special status, and suspended in 2020 and 2021 due to the COVID pandemic -- and also because of the increased number of tourist arrivals.

The security preparations have also been made keeping these factors in mind, the officer added.

We are expecting almost two to three times increase in the number of yatris. A lot of preparations have been put into place. The number of security forces personnel deployed on the ground for the smooth conduct of the yatra is three or four times more than the previous years, he said.

The heightened security measures also come in the backdrop of a recent spurt in target killings, including those of workers belonging to the minority community.

Despite the administration's efforts to ensure a safe and secure yatra we cannot say that we have made it 100 per cent foolproof, the officer said.

Apart from the deployment, drone surveillance and RFID chips will also be part of the three-tier security arrangements for the pilgrims.

Inspector General of Police (IGP) Kashmir Vijay Kumar had on June 14 said that three Lashkar-e-Taiba (LeT) terrorists, who were killed in recent encounters, were sent from Pakistan to attack the annual Amarnath Yatra.

Of the three slain terrorists, two were Pakistanis and one was a local, he said.

On July 10, 2017, seven people were killed and 11 others injured when militants attacked a bus carrying Amarnath yatris in Botengo on the Srinagar-Jammu national highway. The Yatra is scheduled to start on June 30 and will culminate on August 11.

emphasise on the fact that Pandits were a part of the Kashmiri society and are its asset. Kashmiri Pandits are still protesting. When the situation was bad during my tenure (as CM), even then no Pandit was killed. We provided them a salary for 17 months while they were home. I appeal to our people, our maulvis (religious leaders) to announce that they (Kashmiri Pandits) are our assets," she said.

"Whenever something wrong happens here, the BJP uses this community (Kashmiri Pandits) to defame us, she added.

About the unprecedented security arrangements for this year's Amarnath Yatra, the former Jammu and Kashmir chief minister said the administration has created such an atmosphere as if some attacker is coming.

They are yatris, our guests. We have been caring for them for centuries. But, (this year), you (administration) have placed so many nakas (security checkpoints) that it seems the yatra is taking place for the first time, she added.

Referring to the revocation of Article 370 by the Centre in August 2019, Mehbooba said the endeavour is to take away our lands, jobs, mineral, water; assets, but do not let them take your courage .

They want to give us a sense of hopelessness and helplessness that nothing will happen now and what has happened, has happened. But, it is not like that. I do not accept that whatever has happened, has happened. We all have to get united.

If we lose hope and accept everything, then, God forbid, our position will become worse that the people in the Gaza strip who have certain rights... So, do not lose hope. We still have many things which we need to safeguard. Otherwise, a time will come when our situation will be worse than what Israel did to Gaza Strip, she said.

The PDP chief said if the people stand united and use their powers in a peaceful manner, democratically, constitutionally and politically, then we will succeed and get back what was taken from us .

On the ban on Falah Aam Trust (FAT) schools, followed by administration's direction that schools built on government land should be shut, she said, after 2019, attempts are being made to disempower the people of Kashmir.

Now, there is a latest attack on education. First, they targeted the 300 schools of FAT. They are accused of being affiliated to the Jamaat-e-Islami (JeI). Is JeI a criminal organisation? Does it provide arms training or trishul' (trident) or sword training to children which otherwise takes place at (RSS) shakas?

They provide modern education, have the same syllabus which other schools have. The only difference is that our poor children study there in minimal fees. Now, they are closing schools which are on government land, she said.

This, she added, will leave lakhs of students and thousands of teachers helpless.

On the situation in Maharashtra, she said the BJP has made a mess of this country .

The country was built with so much of blood and sweat by leaders like Jawahar Lal Nehru, over the years by the Congress party, Indira Gandhi, A B Vajpayee. The basic fundamentals of India were democracy and secularism. They are turning everything upside down.

They are the most corrupt system that I have ever seen in my life because (of) the way they are purchasing MLAs after the elections, be it in Rajasthan, MP; Goa or now in Maharashtra. There is no example of such corruption in the history of India for the last 70 years, she said.

On the Centre's Agnipath scheme, Mehbooba said it was against the pride, the hard work and the spirit of sacrifice of the army personnel.

(Veer) Savarkar wanted Hindus, the RSS people, to be trained so that tomorrow they are more brutal in their dealings with the minority community and others, she added.

150 terrorists ready...

The Army officer said terrorists are now focusing on other infiltration routes other

than those that have been identified.

I am not saying that we have put in place a system that ensures zero infiltration. Yes, there is a possibility of infiltration taking place here, but in recent years, the way we have made the fence stronger; the way the deployment has been made including the surveillance equipment, the success rate of infiltration has gone down.

As a result, what happens is that when there is pressure on one side, they try other sides, the alternate routes. They (terrorists) are now trying the Rajouri-Poonch routes, the areas of the south of Pir Panjal. The infiltration here (in Kashmir valley) has gone down compared to other routes, he said here.

He said the focus of infiltration has largely now shifted to the south of Pir Panjal. In fact, there are inputs that some people may have also tricked in via Nepal, he added.

The officer said the militant numbers were the lowest figure that we have in the last few years at all levels but the numbers will keep on changing. We have the kinetic domination on the ground.

We have eliminated more than 50 (terrorists) in the last 40-42 days. Their overall lifespan is negligible, but, yes, it remains a curse for the society. It remains a challenge and a security hazard. So, that is what we are working on.

Be it 100 or 150, these numbers will continue till the time the people do not understand the futility of what is happening, till the people do not understand what is right and what is wrong. Till there is the support base, they will remain, but once they (people) shun them, then they will have no way to go, and you will automatically find this entire concept getting eliminated or the numbers coming down, he added.

targeted killings in the valley, especially of members of the minority community, the Army officer said a person does such things when he comes under pressure, is pushed to the wall, and feels he is losing control.

"There are a few aspects as to why they are happening. Either it is to provoke the security forces or bring a fear factor among the people that their (terrorists') writ still runs large or because they are soft targets," he said.

Attacks on soft targets, especially Kashmiri Pandits, shakes up the entire country, the Centre and the state administration, the officer said.

"They (terrorists) also know, in terms of their capacity, which is the weakest link as they (Kashmiri Pandits) are working in the society, roaming around in the society and it is easy to target them," he said.

The officer, however, said protecting every individual or providing round-the-clock security cover to them was not possible.

Sadhus upbeat over...

the cave shrine to thwart any terror attack and ensure peaceful yatra.

Staying in small groups inside a large hall at the temple complex and chanting praises of the Lord Shiva like Bham Bham Bhole' and Har Har Mahadev', the sadhus who have renounced the worldly life are least bothered about the terror threat and said it is a non-issue for us .

We only know dharma (religion) and our dharma is Sanatana which teaches us to love everyone. We are on a religious journey to meet our lord and we are only concerned about it and nothing else, Shri Raja Giri, a mahant from Assam, said.

Accompanied by 12 disciples including women, he said religion is above politics and it is politics which is dividing the people.

We have nothing to do with politics, Azan' (Muslim call for prayer) controversy or terror threat (to Amarnath pilgrims). We are all one and should respect and love each other, he said.

Another Sadhu Suraj Khuria, who had come from Indore about two weeks ago, said they have come for darshan' and do not fear terrorists.

We only fear our lord and pray to him that we do the right things on his earth till our last breath this is my only concern, he said.

Expressing similar views, Sadhvi Sapna Dass from Siliguri in West Bengal said she is going to meet the baba' and seek his blessings for the entire world.

I need nothing for myself but will seek blessings for the countrymen and the people around the globe. We will also pray for good sense to the terrorists who are taking innocent lives, she said.

Full of enthusiasm, Mahant Ram Giri Raj Rajashree Naga from Rajasthan said it was for the first time he was visiting the cave shrine.

We are happy to be going there and are satisfied with the security and other arrangements. We are hopeful of completing the pilgrimage without any trouble, he said.

For Shergiri Maharaj from Sukhdev Ashram in Uttar Pradesh, he has missed the darshan' for the past two years and is dying to reach the cave shrine in the first batch.

Most of the sadhus and sadhvis have performed the yatra over 15 times and they all are eagerly waiting for the day to be part of the yatra. However, many of them suggested that the government should run special trains to facilitate sadhus to reach Jammu from different parts of the country.

Mahant Rameshwar Dass, the head of the temple having a capacity to accommodate over 4,000 sadhus, said all necessary arrangements are in place to ensure that there is no inconvenience to the holy men.

My whole team is busy in making arrangements for food, shelter, registration and medical facilities for the sadhus, in active coordination with the district administration, Dass said.

Expressing satisfaction over the arrangements made by the Lieutenant Governor administration, the Mahant said the yatra is an example of Hindu-Muslim unity for centuries but there are certain anti-national elements who are trying to weaken the communal harmony and brotherhood by disturbing the yatra.

Facilitating peaceful yatra is our responsibility. Let us join hands to thwart any attempt by anti-national elements to disturb the yatra, he said.

Meanwhile, the main transit camp of Bhagwati Nagar in Jammu was completely sealed by police and paramilitary forces as part of the heightened security arrangements for the yatra.

Only people with special identity cards are allowed inside the complex, an official said, adding bomb disposal squads, sniffer dogs and surveillance drones were also deployed in and around the areas to maintain tight vigil.

Jammu Municipal Corporation (JMC) Commissioner Rahul Yadav said they are working to ensure that the yatra is made litter and garbage free this year.

All arrangements are in place with adequate manpower for sanitation and hygiene. Our focus this time is to make the yatra litter and garbage free, he said.

He said the JMC will also ensure the implementation of single-use plastic ban during the yatra.

Traffic movement resumes...

late Friday evening, the officials said.

"Fresh traffic was allowed from both sides (Jammu and Srinagar) this morning and is moving smoothly," a traffic department official said.

The highway was blocked at nearly three dozen places by landslides and mudslides, mostly in Ramban and Udhampur districts, on Tuesday evening following incessant rains, leaving over 2,000 vehicles, mostly trucks, stranded.

All stranded vehicles were cleared during the night hours, paving the way for resumption of normal traffic movement, the official said, adding that road clearance work is in progress at many places.

He said the National Highway Authority of India (NHAI) was also undertaking repair work of the steel tunnel at Panthiyal which was damaged by shooting stones from the hillock overlooking the highway.

"The repair work, necessary to safeguard the lives of commuters from shooting stones, is being done between 0430 hours and 0800 hours daily," the official said.

The official further said the Mughal Road, connecting the twin districts of Poonch and Rajouri in Jammu region with south Kashmir's Shopian district, was blocked by a landslide at Mansar Morh near Peer Ki Gali in the early hours of Saturday.

Men and machinery have been moved to the landslide-hit area, and efforts are on to make the road traffic-worthy, he said.

Several officers including Jammu based officers participated in the meeting through video conferencing.

Dr Mehta impressed upon the officers to adopt prescribed level of random testing of those traveling from outside . He directed the health authorities to issue the advisories to people so that the people remains safe and cautious. He asked them to encourage people to adhere to the Covid-19 protocols.

He advised them to remain vigilant and use social and other media to create awareness among people so that no rumor mongering occurs. He asked them to create digital health records of patients visiting hospitals and integrate the same with Rapid Assessment System (RAS) for quality feedback of public.

The Chief Secretary also maintained that the health infrastructure of the UT was upgraded to a larger extent during past few years. He reminded them it is for this reason that in the past the UT faced no major problem dealing with the pandemic. He sug-

gested them to work for promotion of medical tourism here as the UT is set to establish medical cities in both the divisions here.

The MD, NHM briefed the CS about the current scenario of the Covid-19 in the UT. He gave out that there is no major reason of concern for the people. He revealed that the health infrastructure available throughout J&K including isolation beds, oxygen supply and medicines are enough to deal with any situation and J&K faced no uneven occupancy of beds in recent times.

It was further made out that the positivity rate in J&K in the past 24 hours is just 0.5% as compared to 1.2% at national level. It was stated that the overall recovery rate of patients in J&K is 98.9% as compared to 98.6% at the national level. It was also mentioned that the infections are less severe than in the past due to full vaccination of the whole population of J&K.

It was said that gene sequencing of hospitalized cases and assessment of bed occupancy is monitored continuously. Further the testing of travelers and checking their vaccination certificates would also be carried out to weed out chances of spread of the infection, the meeting was informed.

During the meeting suggestions from participants were taken and the preparations made at their end were also taken note of. It was ascertained during the meeting that there is no threat currently but following of precautions like wearing face masks and frequent hand washing needs to be adopted strictly to be safe and avoid any loss of life.

J&K reports 65...

294 are Active Positive (188in Jammu Division and 106 in Kashmir Division), 449693 have recovered and 4755 have died; 2330 in Jammu division and 2425 in the Kashmir division.

Providing district-wise breakup for positive cases during the past 24 hours, the Bulletin stated that Jammu reported 38 cases, Srinagar 18, Samba five, Udhampur reported two cases, Budgam and Poonch reported one case each, while as no other district across the Union Territory of Jammu and Kashmir reported any fresh case.

Meanwhile, Ladakh reported nine fresh Covid cases that took the infection tally to 28,348, officials said. All the new cases were detected in Leh district, they said.

So far, 228 people have succumbed to COVID-19 in Ladakh. Of these, 168 deaths were reported from Leh and 60 from Kargil, according to officials. Officials said the number of active cases stands at 41 40 in Leh and one in Kargil. A total of 4,260 people, including 2,145 air passengers, were screened for COVID-19 in Leh and Kargil districts on Saturday, they said. Three people were discharged from hospitals in Leh after recovering from the disease, taking the overall recoveries to 28,079, officials added.

Powers under preventive...

vacation bench of Justices C T Ravikumar and Sudhanshu Dhulia noted that although according to the authority, the detenus were involved in more than 30 cases but only four cases of chain snatching were considered as ground for detention, as the other cases were reported to be behind the proximity period and out of the jurisdiction of the commission-erate.

The top court also noted that offences in these four cases were allegedly committed within a span of two months between May 6 and July 26 last year and both the detenus were granted bail by the magistrate in these cases.

"The powers to be exercised under the preventive detention law are exceptional powers which have been given to the government for its exercise in an exceptional situation as it strikes hard on the freedom and liberty of an individual, and thus cannot be exercised in a routine manner; the bench said.

The apex court passed the orders on June 22 on two separate petitions filed by the wives of the detenus.

The petitioners had challenged the Telangana High Court's order on March 25 this year dismissing their pleas against the preventive detention.

In its order, the top court noted that one of reasons assigned by the authority justifying the invocation of the provisions of detention law was that the detenus were granted bail in all the four cases and were likely to indulge in similar crime.

"The reason why bail was granted in all four cases, however, has not been given. Bail was granted in all the four cases due to the inability of the prosecution, which did not complete its investigation in time. The bail had to be given as the charge sheet was not filed by the police in all the cases within the stipulated period of 60 days. The fault thus lies with the prosecution, the bench said.

It observed that the facts and circumstances of the case, as alleged in the detention order; does reflect a law and order situation which can be dealt with under the ordinary law of land and there was absolutely no occasion for invoking the extraordinary powers under the law of preventive detention. The apex court said invocation of the preventive detention law in this case against the two persons was not justified .

It said the distinction between law and order situation and a public order situation has been dealt with by the apex court in a catena of decisions. "In fact, in a recent decision of this court, the court had to make an observation regarding the routine and unjustified use of the preventive detention law in the state of Telangana, the bench noted. It said the state is not without a remedy, as in case the detenu is so much a menace to the society as is being alleged, then the prosecution should seek cancellation of bail or move an appeal to the higher court. "But definitely seeking shelter under the preventive detention law is not the proper remedy under the facts and circumstances of the case," it said. The bench noted that the detention order said that crimes were committed in broad daylight and have thus resulted in creation of fear and panic in the minds of public, especially women, and hence, the government had to interfere in order to maintain public order.

Timber smuggler booked...

"His dossier was prepared and sent to Deputy Commissioner Doda on 22nd June for taking a final call. On June 24, the DC passed orders for his detention under the stringent J&K Public Safety Act 1978."

Chander Shekhar said that some other persons from Tanta area of Chirala range and Bhalessa Range of Forest Division were also indulging in timber and MFP smuggling. We have prepared half a dozen dossiers and strict action against them too was on the cards. "PSA was introduced in Jammu Kashmir in 1978, primarily to tame timber smugglers but it took 44 years to book any one under this law from Jammu Province," said DFO adding, "This will create a lot of deterrence and surely go a long way in tightening the noose against habitual offenders."

Masood was subsequently arrested and lodged in District Jail Bhadarvah.

This is the first PSA against any timber smuggler in Jammu Province.

Meanwhile in another operation 3 timber smugglers along with banned mechanical cutters were arrested from Thathri early morning by a team headed by Range officer Chirala Shaifar Iqbal. The arrested smugglers have been identified as Babar Ali, Khursheed Ahmed and Akhter Hussain all residents of Kahara tehsil.

"After the news of crackdown, smugglers are trying to sneak in to neighbouring Chamba district of Himachal Pradesh to evade the arrest but we have activated our intelligence and arrested three of them from Thathri, while we have recieved inputs that a group of 12 smugglers is on its way towards Chamba via Padri Dhar but they will be also nabbed soon," DFO said.

Earlier District Magistrate Doda Vikas Sharma has imposed a ban under section 144 CrPC on sale, purchase and use of portable chain saw (Mechanical Cutters) in District Doda on 05 - 05 - 2022 under order number 215 - 2/DM /Doda.

After the ban, 45 mechanical cutters have been seized and two dozen offenders booked, informed DFO.
