Two LeT terrorists eliminated in Kulgam encounter

Pak intruder killed along IB in Jammu

SRINAGAR/JAMMU: Two Lashkar-e-Toiba (LeT terrorists were killed on Monday in an encounter with security forces in Kulgam district, police said.

Security forces launched a cordon and search operation at Nowpora-Kherpora in the Trubii area of the district following information about the presence of terrorists there, a police official said.

During the search operation, as the joint search party approached towards the suspected spot, the hiding terrorists fired indiscriminately upon the joint search party which was retaliated effectively leading to an encounter. However in order to evacuate the civilians trapped around encounter site, the joint team ensured the evacuation of all civilians to the safer places.

" In the ensuing encounter, two local terrorists of prowere killed and their bodies were retrieved from the site of encounter. They have been identified as Zubair Ahmad Mir resident of Qaimoh Kulgam and Idrees Ahmad Dar resident of Kulpora Kulgam', a police spokesperson said.

As per police records, both the killed terrorists were categorized and involved in several terror crime cases including attacks on Police and Security Forces and killing of PRIs. The eliminat ed terrorist Zubair Ahmad Mir, active since August-2021, was trying to revive the terror folds by recruiting and motivating the gullible youth including terrorist Idrees Ahmad to join terror

Incriminating materials, arms and ammunition have been recovered from the site of encounter. All the recovered materials have been taken into case records



The failure on part of detaining authority, to supply the material, renders detention order illegal and unsustainable; the Court observed and quashed the orders.

AGENCY ELMAU (GERMANY): Asserting that India's dedication to climate commitments is evident from its performance. Prime Minister Narendra Modi on Monday hoped that rich countries of G-7 will support India's efforts in combating climate change and invited them to tap the huge market for clean energy technologies emerging in the country.

In his remarks at the session on Investing in a better Future: Climate, Energy, Health' at G7 Summit, Modi highlighted India's track record and said it has achieved the target of 40 per cent energy-capacity from non-fossil sources nine years before time.

"The target of 10 per cent ethanolblending in petrol has been achieved 5 months before time. India has the



world's first fully solar power operated airport. India's huge railway system will become net zero in this decade," he said.

"When a large country like India shows such ambition, other developing countries also get inspiration. We hope that the rich countries of G-7 will support India's efforts. Today, a huge market for clean energy technologies is emerging in India," the prime minister said.

G-7 countries can invest in research. innovation, and manufacturing in this field, he said.

The scale that India can provide for every new technology can make that technology affordable for the whole world, he asserted.

The core theories of the circular economy have been an integral part of Indian culture and lifestyle, Modi said.

Journalist Zubair arrested in Delhi for 'hurting religious sentiments' Commissioner of Police

NEW DELHI: Fact-checking website Alt News cofounder Mohammad Zubair was arrested by the Delhi Police on Monday for allegedly hurting religious sentiments through one of his tweets, officials said.

Earlier this month, a case against Zubair was registered under sections 153A (promoting enmity between different groups on grounds of religion, race, place of birth, language etc.) and 295A (deliberate and malicious act intended to outrage religious feelings) of the Indian Penal Code (IPC), K P S Malhotra, Deputy

(Cyber Cell), said.

Zubair was arrested in connection with one of his recent tweets that had a questionable image with a purpose to deliberately insult the god of particular religion, the DCP said.

Police said the case was registered on the complaint of a Twitter user who accused Zubair of hurting religious sentiments.

Alt News co-founder Pratik Sinha alleged that Zubair was arrested in a case for which no notice was given by the police, which is mandatory under law for the
