### Amarnath Yatra: Unfazed...

Lauding the authorities for the best possible arrangements , Kumar, said, We have full faith in Lord Shiva and our security forces .

The group members have completed their registration and got tokens from Vaishnavi Dham near railway station for their journey to cave shrine in the first batch.

"Facilities are very good and the registration process is also smooth. We are very happy with the arrangements," Kumar said. A Bengalmu resident, Upnita, who is here with seven other members of her family, said their fear disappeared soon after reaching the base camp.

Shri Amarnath Shrine Board (SASB) is pulling out all the stops to ensure smooth pilgrim-age, scheduled to begin on June 30 from Kashmir; to the holy cave shrine housing the naturally formed ice-lingam in south Kashmir Himalayas.

Over 3,000 pilgrims have arrived in Jammu and have been housed in base camp and various lodging centres, the officials said, adding that about 400 sadhus' have also arrived in Ram Mandir camp for the yatra.

The first batch of pilgrims, including sadhus, will leave for the twin base camps of Kashmir a day ahead of the official commencement of the yatra which will culminate, according to tradition, on the day of Raksha Bandhan' festival on August 11.

The yatra will commence on June 30 from twin routes - traditional 48-km Numwan in south Kashmir's Pahalgam and 14-km shorter Baltal in central Kashmir's Ganderbal.

The scene in and around the base camp, lodging centres, registration and token counters was upbeat on Tuesday.

Around three lakh pilgrims have registered so far for the annual Amarnath Yatra, the officials said. The government, this year, has introduced a Radio Frequency Identification (RFID) system for pilgrims to track their movement en-route to ensure their well-being.

"Adequate security has been put in place for the base camps and lodging places in the Jammu city. Security is a major challenge," Jammu Senior Superintendent of Police (SSP) Chandan Kohli said.

As many as 5,000 security personnel have been deployed in the Jammu city as part of the multi-tier security arrangement for the Amarnath Yatra, he said.

He said that security measures have also been put in place around five registration centres, three token centres, and 32 lodging centres.

Pointing to major challenges, he said there are new security threats of sticky bombs, hybrid terrorists and IEDs dropped by drones.

The Yatri Niwas has a cluster of 17 dormitories in G+2 dimensions with all modern facilities and features including barrier free environment, modern toilets, fire extinguisher equipments, signages, LED down lighters etc. in all dormitories.

Acknowledging the commitment of all those engaged with the construction of Yatri Niwas, tackling various constraints owing to geography and terrain, the Lt Governor congratulated the engineers, workers, and officials for their tremendous efforts.

The Lt Governor also expressed his gratitude to IIT Roorkee for making a significant contribution in the completion of this project.

"I have been personally monitoring all the arrangements. This year, facilities have been developed for accommodation of passengers at 8 places in the Yatra Holding Area", he said. The Lt Governor said improvements have been made across the board to enhance the holding capacities, provide best-in-class medical, sanitation, and lodging facilities, and in many firsts, offering pilgrims the convenience of performing Yatra in a single day by starting helicopter services on new routes.

For the convenience of the Yatris reaching Jammu, camps have been set up at the airport, railway station and bus stand, which will issue RFID tags on the basis of travel slip and identity card. Further, new shelter sheds have been built on Baltal and Pahalgam Axis. Enhanced medical facilities have been made operational to cater emergency needs of Yatris.

The facility of battery car will be provided to the passengers for the distance of 2.3 kms of Baltal and Donel and optical fiber cable has been laid on the entire route of the Yatra to provide dedicated telecom connectivity to the pilgrims.

The Lt Governor said that the Anamathji Shrine Board Android mobile app has been revamped and launched in 5 languages- Hindi, English, Punjabi, Gujarati and Telugu to facilitate Yatris with up to date information, advisories etc.

It was informed that the duty officers deputed have been given training about the SoFs of all services related to covid, health, cleanliness, waste management, monitoring of travel, food and prasad. Further, disaster related facilities have also been duly planned and mock drills have been conducted regularly to tackle any eventuality.

## NIA arrests two...

They have been identified as Tanveer Ahmad Wani, son of Ghulam Ahmad Wani, resident of Achagoza, PS Rajpora, Distt. Pulwama and Peer Arshad Iqbal alias Ashu, son of Peer Gayasuddin, resident of Khwaja Bagh, Baramulla in case RC-17/2016/NIA/DLI.

The cross LoC trade was started in 2008 via two Trade Facilitation Centres (TFCs) located at Salamabad, Uri in Baramulla District and Chakan-da-Bagh in Poonch District. As per the SOP of the trade mechanism, 21 articles were allowed to be traded between POK and J&K and was based on barter system. During investigation, it has been revealed that extra profit was generated by over-invoicing of export articles and under-invoicing of import articles by the traders.

The arrested accused are cross-border LoC traders and were handling several crossLoC trade firms registered in their own names or in the names of their friends, family members, relatives etc. They used to provide funds to the members of various terrorist organisations, OGWs, Stone-pelters etc.

Further investigation in the case continues, NIA handout stated.

## Centre treating Udaipur...

thoroughly investigate the case and carry out a background check of the two accused arrested.

"Prima-facie it seems to be a terror case and needs a thorough investigation which includes browsing through their social media profiles," a senior official said on condition of anonymity.

The case is likely to be handed over to the National Investigation Agency (NIA) for probe after registration of a case under the stringent Unlawful Activities Prevention Act.

Two men slit the throat of the tailor, Kanhaiya Lal, and posted a video on social media where they claimed that they are avenging an insult to Islam. This triggered communal tension in the Rajasthan city with curfew being imposed.

In a video clip, one of the purported assailants declared that they had "beheaded" the man and then threatened Prime Minister Narendra Modi, saying their knife will get him as well. Indirectly, the assailants referred to Nupur Sharma, the BJP leader suspended from the party over a remark on Prophet Mohammad.

The men who allegedly carried out the daylight murder posted videos online admitting to the crime and were taken into custody by police. One of them identified himself as Riaz Akhtari. Akhtari's links have been traced to the Pakistan-based Dawaat-e-Islami which has its branches in India as well.

making efforts to revive militancy in Pir Panjal districts of Rajouri and Poonch.

This is a big achievement for police and security forces as the blasts had triggered panic in the area and these accused were also planning more such incidents to target security forces. The arrest of two associates of Shah is a big blow to the terror outfit (LeT), the ADGP said.

During preliminary questioning, he said, the arrested accused disclosed that they had hidden some explosive materials at Draaj forest and subsequently a joint search operation was carried out by police and 60 Rashtriya Rifles, which led to the recovery of five IEDs, five remote controls, 10 fuses and 19 battery cells.

The accused are also suspected to be involved in some more criminal and subversive activities for which they are being subjected to sustained interrogation. Arrest of Shah is very crucial in solving many militancy and criminal cases that have occurred during the past few years in the Pir Panjal area, Singh said.

"Reward anyone sharing credible information leading to arrest, apprehension, ops of Talib shall be suitably rewarded", a police spokesperson said.

## SIA books SIM...

to prepare multiple SIM cards with different names and identities. It is being investigated if this is the only method or other ways and means have been adopted for forging required documents for obtaining SIM cards.

Investigation have been initiated to find out who all have used these fraudulently prepared Sim cards and how many of them have been used by terrorists, their associates, drug smugglers, arms and ammunition smugglers and also those who have been dealing with terror funding especially dumping the proceeds of sale of narcotics in different bank accounts.

During searches conducted today, incriminating materials such as digital devices, SIM cards, SD cards, Compact disks, bank transaction slips and documents having a bearing on the investigation have been recovered and seized.

CID is also coordinating similar investigations by various police stations across J&K pertaining to as many as 14000 SIM cards that have been fraudulently issued by stealing identities and forging records. Out of about 28 thousand SIM card vendors, more than a thousand vendors are under scanner for issuing these fraud SIM cards to fictitious persons. While the SIM cards have been deactivated, their subscribers on papers are being identified on the basis of available truncated particulars. They would be questioned to reach to the actual users, revealed sources within SIA. Technology and call records would also be used to pinpoint the actual users. Competent courts of law are being approached with prayers to summon records that would facilitate in finding out if a SIM card was ever used by a listed terrorist or a known OGW or a drug smuggler or inside a jail. Those SIM card sellers and subscribers who would voluntarily cooperate would be entitled to benefitts available under law.

PoS vendors selling SIM cards, said a senior officer in SIA, have no option but to tighten their belts and cannot escape liability especially when it's proved that the SIM card they have prepared against forged documents has been used by terrorists and cross border criminals. Similarly subscribers also would come under legal liability of aiding and abetting crime especially if their cards have been used inside jails or used to communicate to terrorist handlers sitting across in Pakistan, said a senior SIA investigator.

CID Is also planning to request Department of telecommunication to extend the facility (TAF COP) to J&K that has been made available by DoT to many states wherein a subscriber can check online through a special portal if SIM cards are being used by unknown persons against his name and without his knowledge.

did not yield any result as he neither answered his phone nor replied to WhatsApp messages.

Rath, who will be completing two years of his suspension next month, had announced his resignation through his social media accounts on June 25 hinting that he would join politics to contest elections from Kashmir:

"Politics is a noble profession," he had posted on Twitter as well as WhatsApp status and Instagram.

In his purported resignation letter addressed to Jammu and Kashmir Chief Secretary Arun Kumar Mehta and marked to Director General of Police Dilbag Singh and Commandant General Home Guard H K Lohia, Rath said, "I wish to resign from the Indian Police Service in order to be able to participate in electoral politics.

"Please consider this letter as my request for resignation/voluntary retirement and process it accordingly..." he had said in his letter dated June 25.

Known for his controversial style of functioning, Rath was posted as Inspector General (Traffic) in 2018.

However, he ran into controversies and was often seen chasing offenders on the streets and indulging in heated arguments prompting the authorities to shift him to a nondescript post in Home Guards.

The action against the officer came a fortnight after he lodged a complaint with police against DGP Dilbag Singh citing "apprehensions about my life, liberty and bald head."

However, nearly two years after a court had restrained him from publishing defamatory material against six private individuals, known to the police chief, Rath tweeted on Tuesday, "Dear friends, if anything bad happens to my reputation and safety, Dilbag Singh (son of Balbir Singh), the IPS officer who has been the police chief in J and K since 31.10.2018 (Present Pay Scale - Level - 17), will be responsible."

**Rath hints at fighting poll against Omar, Mehbooba**

Meanwhile, Suspended IPS officer Basant Rath on Tuesday dropped another hint about joining the BJP and expressed his willingness to contest against Omar Abdullah and Mehbooba Mufti, two former chief ministers of Jammu and Kashmir, but the saffron party feigned complete ignorance about his plans.

Rath, who had claimed to have resigned from the police service through a social media post on June 25, said in a fresh tweet, "If the BJP high-command allows me, I'll contest against Omar Abdullah who was my chief minister when I was the police chief in Jammu (SSP), and Mehbooba Mufti who was my chief minister when I was the chief of traffic police in Jammu and Kashmir."

Rath has been at the centre of controversies on multiple occasions in the past and has issued contentious tweets through his unverified handle, 'KangriCarrier'.

He had earlier tweeted, "If I ever join a political party, it will be BJP. If I ever contest an election, it will be from Kashmir. If I ever join politics, it will be before March 6, 2024."

When contacted, Jammu and Kashmir BJP president Ravinder Raina said he has no knowledge about Rath planning to join the BJP.

"He is popular among the youth in the valley but he did not contact us (JK BJP unit) till date," Raina, who is currently on a tour of Kashmir, told PTI over phone.

He said it would be premature to make any comment on the subject at the moment. In July 2000, Rath was suspended by the Ministry of Home Affairs for "repeated instances of gross misconduct and misbehavior".

## India committed to...

Goal 14: Stocktaking, Partnerships and Solutions", Dr Jitendra reiterated that India will take all possible measures to achieve the Sustainable Development Goal-14, which addresses some of the challenges faced by the life under water. He informed that the Government headed by PM Modi has taken up several initiatives, programmes and policy interventions through different Ministries and Departments to protect the marine and coastal ecosystems, mangroves and coral reefs.

Dr Jitendra said, India is committed to the "Coastal Clean Seas Campaign" and has declared that India will soon achieve a complete ban on single use plastics. One of the best examples is in phasing out of plastic/polyethylene bags and promoting the alternatives such as usage of cotton/jute cloth bags, he said. The research to gather scientific data and information on Marine Litter in different matrices viz., coastal waters, sediments, biota and beaches as a part of formulating a National Policy has already begun, the Minister added.

Dr Singh said, India has unveiled its vision for the next decade, listing thereby the ten most important dimensions of India's growth till 2030. He said, led by PM Narendra Modi, Govt of India is in the process of unveiling the "Blue Economic Policy of India". Deep Ocean Mission is being implemented by Ministry of Earth Sciences with six thematic areas, which includes development of Ocean Climate Change Advisory Services to address climate resilience, exploration and conservation of deep-sea biodiversity, development of technologies for harnessing ocean resources and capacity building.

Dr Jitendra told the member States that India has well established collaboration and partnerships with UN Agencies and Research Institutions for bridging the methodology and data gaps on SDG indicators and working towards UN Decade of Ocean Science for Sustainable Development, 2021-2030, for clean, healthy, productive, predictive, safe and accessible ocean.

## GST Council removes....

was discussed, officials said. It also accepted most of the recommendations of a group of ministers which suggested the withdrawal of GST exemption on some services among others.

The Council is likely to discuss on Wednesday the demand for an extension to the compensation paid to states for revenue loss from their taxes such as sales tax (VAT) being subsumed into a national GST besides a 28 per cent tax on casinos, online gaming and horse racing.

Non-BJP ruled states such as Chhattisgarh want the compensation regime to be extended or the share of states in the GST revenues be increased to 70-80 per cent from the current 50 per cent.

The Goods and Services Tax (GST) was introduced on July 1, 2017, and states were assured of compensation for the revenue loss till June 2022, arising on account of the GST rollout.

To drive their point, the states cited a recent Supreme Court ruling that decisions made by the Council are not binding on states and any decision not taken unanimously could potentially lead to unraveling of the landmark economic reform.

The Council in its Tuesday meeting cleared a report of the group of state finance ministers which suggested a 5 per cent GST on 'pre-packaged and labelled' curd, lassi, puffed rice and wheat flour, which are usually produced by large manufacturers.

Currently, a 5 per cent GST is levied on branded and packaged food items, while unpacked and unlabelled are tax exempt.

It also recommended correction in inverted duty structure for a host of items, including edible oil, coal, LED lamps, printing/drawing ink, finished leather and solar water heater.

The report of the state finance ministers on GST systems reforms, which recommended biometric authentication of high-risk taxpayers and real-time validation of bank accounts too was cleared by the Council. Besides, a 12 per cent tax on hotel rooms below Rs 1,000/day will be levied, as against tax-exempt currently.

Rate rationalisation is important to boost the weighted average GST rate that has fallen to 11.6 per cent against 14.4 per cent at the time of the launch.

As per the data on revenue growth collated for the Council meeting, only five out of 31 states/UTs -- Arunachal Pradesh, Manipur, Mizoram, Nagaland, and Sikkim -- registered a revenue growth higher than the protected revenue rate for states under GST in 2021-22.

With regard to e-way bill on intra-state movement of gold, gold jewellery and precious stones to check evasion, the Council recommended that states can decide on the threshold above which the electronic bill is to be made mandatory.

A panel of state ministers had recommended the threshold to be Rs 2 lakh and above.

## HC refuses to...

appointment of one Anjum and one more girl from Bandipora in Rohama Branch of J&K Bank Ltd. The investigating agency, while investigating FIR, has concentrated itself on modus operandi of appointment of aforementioned individuals and has not travelled to investigate the larger conspiracy.

Justice Sanjay Dhar further observed that as far as the impugned FIR is concerned, the same relates to the larger conspiracy of appointments of all Banking Attendants and Assistant Banking Associates that have been made during 2011 to 2019. As per preliminary verification, 1003 backdoor appointments have been made during the tenure of accused Sheikh Mushtaq Ahmad whereas 1256 illegal appointments have been made during the tenure of the petitioner herein. It is not the case of the petitioner that all the illegal appointments have been made through a single order at one and the same time. As is clearly revealed from the material on record, these appointments have been made from time to time over a period of about eight years by issuing a number of appointment orders in violation of the set norms. Thus, it is a case of distinct incidents having occurred which do not form part of the same transaction though the modus operandi for these illegal appointments may have been similar. "Each appointment order alleged to have been made by the petitioner and the co-accused constitutes a separate offence and, as such, the instant case does not satisfy the test of sameness. Even the consequence test is not applicable to the instant case, inasmuch as it cannot be said that the second FIR pertains to an incident which may be a consequence of an incident covered by the first FIR. The incidents/occurrences mentioned in the two FIRs being distinct. Thus, I am unable to persuade myself to hold that the second FIR would form part of the same transaction," the Court observed, adding that it is not a fit case where this Court should exercise its jurisdiction under Section 482 of CrPC and dismissed the petition.

## Remove B.K Singh as Secretary Education, save Education Deptt: Harsh Dev

JAMMU: Alleging prevalence of anarchy and rule of whim in Education Deptt, Harsh Dev Singh, former Education Minister and senior AAP leader on Tuesday maintained that this most significant Deptt stood devastated and completely ruined under the present regime "centralization of powers of transfers and postings of teaching staff by the administrative Deptt, whimsical transfers, favouritism, nepotism, corruption and violation of norms have brought the Education Deptt on the brink of breakdown.

While the Directors of School Education and CEOs of all districts have been divested of powers of transfers and adjustments of all teaching staff right from Teachers to Masters and Lecturers, the Principal Secretary has assumed all such powers to himself thereby making a mockery of the powers decentralization policy that remained in vogue for the last more than seven decades. Having hardly any idea about the ground situation, the transfer orders were being issued from the secretariat in the most clandestine manner without having any regard for the requirements of the educational institutions or in the interests of the deptt. Personal interests seemed to be getting precedence over the pupils' interests thereby causing immense damage to the academic activity particularly in the rural area schools. Several remote area schools had become defunct due to extreme paucity of staff with the concerned CEOs and DSEs expressing helplessness in the wake of withdrawal of powers from them. Whatever be the reason, the fact remains that the Education Deptt has gone to dogs with urban area schools flooded due to prime postings and attachments and rural area schools deprived of even minimum needed staff thereby completely jeopardising the careers of rural poor students". He was addressing a press conference in Jammu on Monday. Pointing towards the criminal apathy, incompetence and insensitivities of the higher authorities in Education Deptt, Singh said that several IAS, IPS and other bureaucrats including an SSP, Directors, Joint Directors, ACRs etc had been shown in the sonority lists of lectures which were agreed to be rectified by the Deptt only after the matter was brought in public domain by the media and teachers' representatives.
