HC sets-aside conviction of Patwari in trap case

JAMMU: J&K High Court set-aside conviction of Patwari Mangat Ram, who was convicted by Special Judge Anti-Corruption Jammu in a trap case.

The decision was passed in an appeal filed by Mangat Ram against the judgment and order dated 18-12-2015 rendered by Court of Special Judge Anti-Corruption Jammu in file No. 222/Challan titled State through Police Station Vigilance Organization Jammu V/s Mangat Ram Sharma, whereby, appellant was held guilty, convicted and sentenced to undergo one year imprisonment for commission of offence under section 161 of RPC and one year imprisonment for commission of offence under section 5(1) (d) read with section 5(2) of PC Act.

Justice Mohan Lal, after hearing senior Advs Abhinav Sharma and Rahul Pant for appellant, observed that corruption in a civilized society is like cancer; which, if not detected in time, will led to disastrous consequences. "Corruption is termed as a plague. It is also termed as a royal thievery and the socio-political system exposed to such a communicable disease is likely to crumble in its own weight. The evil of corruption has persistently crept into various levels despite the stringent history of the Act since 1947 and this hydra-headed dragon of corruption has to be lynched at the earliest or it is likely to cause turbulence shaking the socio-economic fabric. But at the same time, equally important is that an individual, who is booked in Corruption Act case, should not be punished without testing his case on the touchstone of judicial scrutiny, as it is not only the

accused who goes to jail with the stigma of being a corrupt official, it has its far reaching effect on the entire family. The person does not only lose his livelihood but earns ignominy also. Therefore, the court is expected to be very careful and circumspect keeping in view that a corrupt does not go scott-free and innocent is not taken to task at the whims of someone. These cases are to be judged on a very sensitive platform of judicial scrutiny. The said exercise has been done by me in the case in hand, and thereafter, only I have come to the conclusion that the prosecution case is not proved to the hilt against appellant/convict/accused," the Court observed.

Court further observed that that prosecution has miserably failed to prove the guilt of the appellant/convict beyond reasonable doubt for commission of offences under section 5(1) (d) read with Section 5(2) read with Section 161 of RPC. The criminal conviction appeal, therefore, deserves to be allowed and the same is allowed. Resultantly, impugned judgment of conviction and order of sentence dated 18-12-2015 rendered by the court of Special Judge Anti-Corruption Jammu based on surmises, assumptions and presumptions is unsustainable in eyes of law and is set aside/quashed. Appellant/convict Mangat Ram Sharma, son of Swami Dass, resident of village Nor-Jagir Tehsil Akhnoor District Jammu, who is presently on bail, is therefore, clearly acquitted of charges leveled against him for commission of offences under sections 5(1) (d) read with Section 5(2) read with Section 161 of RPC, the Court directed.

Bail application of accused defrauding Jammu Bar rejected

JAMMU: City Judge/JMIC Jammu Manjeet Rai rejected the bail application of Rajinder Kumar, son of Des Raj submitted through his cousin Sachin Verma, son of Romesh Sharma, in the case of CNR JKJM030050152022.

According to the case, the complainant who is an Advocate used to invest money with the applicant and in turn the applicant used to give him heavy interest. The complainant further said that in order to harass the applicant and his family projected some person who was assured by the applicant to get him a Govt.job, and filed a false complaint against the applicant before the Sub Registrar Jammu which took cognizance of the case .

The applicant assailed the said cognizance before the High Court and the High Court stayed the proceedings before the Sub Registrar Jammu. When the complainant could not achieve the motive, he concocted another story of Air Ticket Booking from the applicant and got the false and frivolous case registered against the applicant.

The applicant said that he has not committed any offence nor concerned with the offence and sought bail on the grounds that offence involved is neither punishable to death sentence or life imprisonment and as such he is entitled to bail. He further said that applicant is a respectable citizen and has no intention either to flee away or to avoid his appearance in the court.

The prosecution filed its objections through APP Arvind Rathore and said that as per report accused has been found involved in FIR 60/2022 of PS Janipur under section 420.467,468,406,506 and 34 IPC. The Police said that the accused been arrested after much efforts while other accused are absconding and have caused a wrongful loss to the tune of Rs 8 lakh. The Police further said that investigation is at infancy stage, other accused are still absconding and defrauded amount is yet to be recovered. The Police also said that the accused is a prime perpetrator and master mind behind all the fraudulent activities.

The City Judge after hearing both the sides and perusal of

the record and CD File, held that the accused is allegedly involved in the offences under sections 406,429,506,467,468 and 34 IPC and the offences under 406,420,467,468 IPC are non-bailable and serious in nature as such accused cannot claim bail as a matter of right, moreover it would be premature to comment on the evidence collected till date.

He also held that there is apprehension that if the accused/applicant is released on bail, he will try to win over the prosecution witnesses and temper with the prosecution evidence. The judge ordered that for the above said reasons this court is not inclined to grant the concession of bail and the application is thus rejected.
