JAMMU: Principal Secretary, Skill Development Department, Dr. Asgar Hassan Samoon, on Thursday visited Food Craft Institute, Jammu.

On the occasion, Dr. Samoon inaugurated online admission portal of the institute where students can enrol themselves online with the institute besides generating E-certificate on completion of course. This is a big step towards providing better facilities to citizens towards ease of doing business in the citizens' charter. He also inspected the ongoing works being executed in the institute.

Principal Secretary also distributed

certificates among student trainees of one month Skill Development programmes, trained in the field of bakery and patisserie.

Principal Secretary suggested the youth to utilize their valuable time on add-on courses to up skill themselves as per industrial requirement. He directed the concerned officers to promote various government loan schemes for unemployed youth so they start their own business unit. While interacting with the trainees, Dr. Samoon appreciated the efforts of Principal FCI and other faculty members of the institute for imparting quality skills to the trainees.

Principal briefed that the institute has

signed an MoU with Directorate of Industries and Commerce under which every pass out trainee in the entrepreneur programme (one month) gets facilitated in early registration and commissioning of their units so as to become entrepreneurs. This not only enables them to earn their livelihood but makes them job providers as well, he added.

He elaborated that the institute is conducting one and half year diploma courses in various trades of Hotel Management besides Short Term Skill Development Programmes ranging from one month to four months for creating employment opportunities for unemployed youth. Meanwhile, in order to encourage the passing out students of one and half year diploma courses in Food Production trade, the final preparations were displayed in the form of various dishes. Most of the trainees have already been short listed for six month Industrial Training in various 5 star properties and chain properties across the country.

Later, Principal Secretary also visited the Migrant Camp Jagati Nagrota and enquired about the facilities being provided by the Skill Development Department to the migrated youth.

Parmar inspects lift irrigation schemes, Khuls of Ranbir Canal

JAMMU: Principal Secretary, Jal Shakti, Ashok Kumar Parmar, on Thursday conducted an extensive inspection visit of various lift irrigation schemes and khuls of Ranbir Canal in Jammu.

Principal Secretary inspected lift pumping stations at Bathera, Manjal Brahama, Malpur, Gurha Pattan and Ranjan which provide water supply to various irrigation channels around Jammu.

He was accompanied by DDC Chairman, Bharat Bhushan, Chief Engineer I&FC Jammu, Hamesh Manchanda, Chief Engineer

Jal Shakti Jammu, Manish Bhat and Executive Engineer Ground Water Drilling Division, Jammu among other senior officers.

BDC Chairperson, Kuldeep Raj, Sarpanch, Neetu Verma, Jaswant Singh, Anjali Sharma and Partap Singh Rana; and Panch, Shakti Mehra were present on the occasion.

Principal Secretary took stock of damages caused to irrigation channels and canals due to ongoing Jammu-Akhnoor four-laning project. He directed the respective officers to prepare estimates for their immediate reconstruction besides asking them to restore the electro-mechanical infrastructure to ensure that the irrigation water reaches up to the tail end.

Later, a brief meeting with officers and local PRI members was also held at Lift Irrigation Scheme Ranjan, in which the

Principal Secretary was apprised of the working condition of the pumping station. While taking cognizance of projected issues, Principal Secretary directed the officers to ensure speedy redressal of issues like lack of manpower, machinery and other supplies. He also sought a report with regard to alleged tapping of power supply from a dedicated power feeder. Meanwhile, Principal Secretary visited PHE Station Old Amb, wherein he discussed issue of drinking water supply in surrounding areas. He directed the officers to identify land by consulting local PRI members and prepare a detailed project report for setting up of a tube well in the area. He also visited Panchayats Lower Amb, Rajpura, Malpur, Dooni, Jandial, Gharota, Ghaink, Seri Pantan and Kot.

Mehta reviews construction of vital road projects in J&K

Srinagar: Chief Secretary, Dr Arun Kumar Mehta on Thursday reviewed the status of different road projects including national highways being laid out here in the UT.

The meeting was attended by the Principal Secretary, PWD; Divisional Commissioners; Commissioner Secretary, Forest; Commissioner Secretary Revenue; Secretary, PD&MD; Deputy Commissioners; MD, KPDCL; Chief Engineers of PWD, Jal Shakti, PDD; Representatives of BRO, NHIDCL and other officers of the concerned Departments.

Dr Mehta enquired about the status of five tunnels (T1-T5) being constructed on Srinagar-Jammu National Highway that are going to drastically reduce the travel time between these cities besides making the road more reliable. He asked them to expedite the work on these tunnels so that all of them are timely dedicated to public.

He enjoined upon them to move extra men and machinery for mainte-

lines. He asked them that the erecting of crash barriers, sign boards, parapets on National Highways for the safety of travelers should be done before 15th of this month. He also advised the district administration to look into the availability of utilities like Eateries, Washrooms, etc on the National Highways for enjoyable ride over them.

Dr Mehta enquired about the status of five tunnels (T1-T5) being constructed on Srinagar-Jammu National Highway that are going to drastically reduce the travel time between these cities besides making the road more reliable. He asked them to expedite the work on these tunnels so that all of them are timely dedicated to public.

He enjoined upon them to move extra men and machinery for mainte-

nce of this road till the works are completed. He also directed for minimizing the waiting time at toll plazas by opening all the lanes for vehicles and using updated RFID readers over there. He made it clear to all the DCs that there should be least traffic disruptions on Srinagar-Jammu National Highway with focus on clearing the route within an hour or two. Regarding the availability of material for construction of new roads the Chief Secretary asked the concerned departments to provide online permissions for mining of minerals besides exploring the possibility of allowing them to transport the same beyond daylight hours. The CS also directed the departments of PDD and Jal Shakti to immediately shift their utilities wherever required

so that both the construction and providing of services to general public do not get affected. He also reiterated that the land acquisition process needs to be completed at an earliest. He directed both the district and divisional administration to resolve all the issues at their level and ensure the land is transferred to the departments without any further delay. The Chief Secretary reviewed the status of roads like Jammu, Srinagar semi-ring road projects, Delhi-Amritsar-Katra Highway, Shopian-Qazigund Bypass, Kathua-Banshali-BaniRoad, Srinagar-Sonamarg Road, Z-Morh tunnel project, Chenani-Sudhmahadev Road, Srinagar-Baramulla-Uri Road and many other internal city roads in Jammu and Srinagar cities. The meeting deliberated upon the issues pertaining to these road projects and their relevant resolutions. It also discussed the expected deadlines for each of them. These road projects were termed as highly significant for the people of the UT and the work needs to be expedited to complete them as soon as possible for the general good of public, as was discussed in the meeting.

"He shall also hold charge of the posts of Mission Director, Swachh Bharat Mission Urban 2.0 and Mission Director, DAY-NULM, in addition to his own duties," it added.
