One of the victim was Rahul Bhat. Bhat was a Kashmiri Pandit migrant who was employed under a prime minister's package. He who was shot dead by terrorists on May 12 at his office in Chadoora of Budgam in central Kashmir.

JAMMU: Several Kashmiri Pandits, who have got jobs in the valley under Prime Minister's employment package, have reached here along with their families and said an environment of apprehension is prevalent in the valley owing to the recent spate in the targeted killings by terrorists.

The Pandits said they have heaved a sigh of relief on reaching their township at Jagti in the outskirts of Jammu after spending sleepless nights in their rented accommodations in the Kashmir over the past few weeks.

Nearly 4000 displaced Kashmiri Pandits are working in different departments in the valley after their selection under Prime Minister's employment package which was announced in 2008 having two major components one pertaining to the provision of 6000 jobs for youth and another pertaining to the provision of 6000 accommodation units for the recruited employees. The process of filling the remaining 2000 odd jobs is in progress along with construction

His brutal killing sparked demonstration by around 6,000 employees at various places who demanded their relocation outside the Valley. But officials Friday argued that the Jammu and Kashmir administration cannot be a party to any "ethnic-cleansing" scripted from across the border by agreeing

They also asserted the killing of soft targets by terror groups won't deter them from holding the annual Amarnath Yatra.

KANPUR: Prime Minister Narendra Modi Friday said he favours a strong opposition in the country but slammed dynastic politics, saying it kills talent.

He also said his statements on dynastic politics are often misunderstood by people, and added his criticism of "parivarwad" was not aimed at any party or individual.

"I am not talking about any political party or individual. I see that the people who fit my definition of parivarwad are angry with me. These dynasts are uniting against me across the country. They are angry why the youth in the country are taking Modi seriously," he said.

"I must tell you that people misunderstand my statement. I want that there must

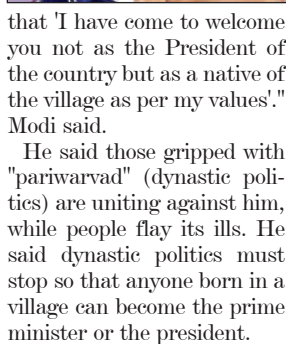
be a strong opposition in the country and that political parties must come out of dynastic politics," he said.

It will strengthen the democracy in the country and youths will get more opportunities in politics, he said, but wondered if "I am expecting a lot from dynastic political parties".

He was addressing an event at President Ram Nath Kovind's ancestral Paraunkh village in Kanpur Dehat district.

President Kovind, who is on a visit to his village, came to the Kanpur airport to welcome PM Modi.

"I felt ashamed that President Ram Nath Kovind came to the airport to welcome me. We work under his guidance. When I asked about it, the president replied



"We must be alert to the challenges of democracy like pariwarvad. Pariwarvad kintu talant not just in politics but in every sphere," he said.

Earlier in his address, the PM shared his experience of visiting the Paraunkh village and interaction with locals.

The PM said the country is working for the development of farmers, women and youth.

Today in rural India, roads are being made, fibre optic cables are being laid and houses being constructed for the poor, he said. "Our villages are capable, have manpower and are well to do. Empowerment of villages is the primary objective of our government."

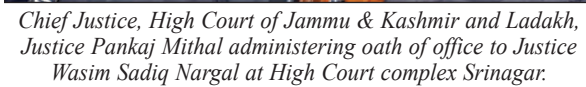
He said that his government's aim is to ensure that benefits of schemes reach to all intended beneficiaries, which means "cent percent empowerment without discrimination".

"By doing so we are fulfilling the dream of equality of Babasaheb Bhimrao Ambedkar, he said.

NEW DELHI: Four men were arrested for allegedly duping people on the pretext of providing them helicopter service to the Vaishno Devi shrine, police said on Friday.  
The accused have been identified as Deepak Thakur, a resident of Firozabad in UP, Jeki Prasad Kahar, Pannu Singh and Vikash

Vaishno Devi temple shrine in Jammu.

During enquiry via National Cyber Crime Reporting Portal, around 112 complaints were found linked to the same syndicate in which people were cheated by the alleged persons through the same modus operandi, a senior police officer said.

On technical analysis, suspected persons were found to be located in Bihar, West Bengal and Firozabad. Police conducted raids at their respective locations and arrested the four. Deputy Commissioner of Police (IFS) KPS Malhotra said.

During interrogation, the accused revealed that they all were a part of an
