CRIME REPORT

2 held with 10 Kg cannabis

JAMMU: Police has arrested two men and recovered 10 Kg cannabis from their possession here, officials said on Monday. The accused were identified as Bihar-resident Dharvinder Kumar and Raj Kumar, natives of Chhattisgarh, police said, adding that they were nabbed near Rajeev Nagar area.

The accused are being questioned and some more arrests and recoveries are expected based on their disclosure as police is working to break drugs supply chain in the city, a police official said.

In another incident, police arrested a man named Yasir Hussain, a resident of Bhatindi area, with 10 gm heroin on Sunday. Accused was arrested from Suketar area in Jhajjar Kotli on outskirts of Jammu, he said, adding that all three peddlers were booked under Narcotic Drugs and Psychotropic Substances (NDPS) Act.

Brick-Kiln owner arrested for negligence & non-compliance of administrative orders

BUDGAM: Police on Monday arrested a brick kiln owner namely Mohammed Yousuf Mir, son of Mohammad Akbar Mir, resident of Chattergam, whose brick Kiln is located at Magraypora Chadoora for negligence and non-compliance of administrative orders, thereby endangering life and safety of labourers.

Accordingly, FIR number 102/2022 under relevant sections of law was registered against him at Police Station Chadoora and investigation started. Pertinent to mention here that on June 2, 2022, terrorists fired on labourers in Brick Kiln resulting in death of a labourer namely Dilkhus Kumar, son of Narayan Rishidev, resident of Gaon Ladugarh, Purina and causing injuries to other. All Brick kiln owners and managers are once again advised to strictly follow the guidelines issued by administration to ensure safety of labourers working in their respective units.

Illicit timber seized, driver arrested

HANDWARA: Police on Monday seized illicit timber and arrested driver of the vehicle. As per details, during intervening night of June 5-6, 2022, a party from Police Post Zachaldara at a checkpoint established at Main Bazar Zachaldara, intercepted a vehicle (JK05C-4553). During checking, illicit timber was recovered from the vehicle and driver of vehicle, identified as Sonaulah Wani, son of Gh Rasool, resident of Badkoot was arrested on spot. Besides, vehicle used in commission of crime was also seized. He was shifted to Police Station where he remained in custody. Accordingly, FIR No 153/2022 under relevant sections of law was registered at Police Station Handwara and investigation started.

Woman among 2 drug peddlers arrested; narcotics recovered

KUPWARA: Police along with army on Monday arrested 2 drug peddlers including a woman in Kupwara and recovered narcotics from their possession.

As per details, acting on a specific information that a woman drug smuggler namely Razia Begum, wife of Zakir Hussain Shah and her associate Aftab Ahmad Shah, son of late Altaf Ahmad Shah, both residents of Takiya Bahadurkote are on way in Cheterkote area to sell narcotics, a joint Naka was established by Incharge Police Post Teetwal ASI G M Bhat including woman Police officials & local Army unit of 6 JAK RIF in presence of local Executive Magistrate Chamkote. During checking, duo was apprehended and heroin like substances weighing 35 gm & 43 gm respectively was recovered from their possession. Accordingly, case relevant sections of law was registered at Police Station Karnah and investigation started.

Pertinent to mention here that husband of woman drug smuggler and her two brothers are already lodged in jail for their involvement in cross-border narcotics smuggling. The arrest of the woman is a major success for Police as she is suspected to be deeply involved in cross LoC smuggling of narcotics in Karnah area.

Man kills wife, mother-in-law; arrested

RAJOURI: A man was arrested for killing his wife and mother-in-law at Rajouri district on Monday.

In incident which took place in Gadyog village of Rajouri district; a man identified as Kashmir Singh, son of Balwant Singh, resident of Gadyog attacked his wife Priyanka Devi (22) and mother-in-law Shanti Devi (52) in his house when a scuffle broke over prevailing matrimonial dispute between Kashmir Singh and his wife Priyanka Devi (victim). Both mother-daughter duo was attacked with an iron rod by Kashmir Singh due to which Priyanka died on spot while Shanti died while being shifted to hospital. Police has arrested accused and a case of murder under relevant sections of law was registered in Police Station Budhal.

Stolen bike recovered, notorious lifter arrested

JAMMU: Police on Monday nabbed a bike-lifter and recovered stolen bike from his possession.

As per details, based on complaint lodged by one Mohd Rafiq, son of Miran, resident of Darsoo that some unknown miscreants have stolen his bike (JK 14G 0961) from outside his house, FIR No. 98/22 under section 379 of IPC was registered at

Police Station Udhampur and investigation started.

A team of Police Post Roun Domail led by PSI Akhilesh Khajuria Incharge Police Post Roundomail under the supervision of Sahil Mahajan DySP Hqrs Udhampur conducted raids at different locations and after putting in strenuous efforts zeroed-in some suspects, one of which during sustained interrogation broke down and confessed his crime. He was identified as Manzoor Hussain, son of Abdullah, resident of Palai, Hiranagar. On his disclosure, Udhampur Police recovered stolen bike and further legal proceeding are underway.

50 stolen mobile phones recovered, handed-over to rightful owners

JAMMU: Police recovered 50 stolen mobile phones worth more than 5 lakh and handed over to its rightful owners. As per details, several complaints were lodged at different police stations of District Jammu regarding theft/missing of mobile phones. On this, a special police team under the supervision of SDPO City East Zaheer Abass Jaffri and SDPO South Sachit Sharma led by SHOs/Incharge Police Posts of concerned police stations recovered 50 stolen/missing mobile phones worth more than Rs 5 lakh.

4 theft cases solved; 2 arrested, gold/silver ornaments worth Rs 10.40 lakh recovered

JAMMU: Police on Monday solved four theft cases by arresting two accused and recovered gold/silver ornaments worth 10.40 lakh from their possession.

As per details, on May 27, 2022, one Suresh Kumar, son of Darshan Kumar, resident of Sehora, Bishnah Jammu lodged a report that on May 24, some unknown thieves struck his home at daytime and after breaking locks of Almirah, decamped with gold ornaments. On this, FIR No 60/2022 under section 454/380 of IPC was registered and investigation started.

During investigation, two accused namely Ayoub Ahmed (32), son of Late Shamas Din, resident of Koti Chandyar Bani, Kathua and Shah Nawaz, son of Mohd Shafi, resident of Chalag Bani, Kathua were arrested, who confessed their crime in theft cases registered vide FIR No 37/21 under sections 457/380 of IPC, FIR No 03/22 under sections 457/380 of IPC, FIR No 39/22 under sections 454/380 of IPC and FIR No 60/22 under sections 454/380 of IPC. Further on their disclosure 2 ear rings, 2 chains silver, Katori Chain, 2 Kadha gold; 2 gold necklaces, 1 gold Nath, 2 pair Jhumke gold, 3 gold rings; 1 gold Kada, gold ear ring-1 pair; 1 gold Tikka, 1 gold ring, 1 ring gents, 1 necklace gold, all worth Rs 10.40 lakh and two motorcycles without registration number were recovered. The arrest and recovery was made by Insp Joginder Singh Chib SHO Gangyal under the close supervision of SDPO City South Dy SP Sachit Sharma, Mamta Sharma (KPS) SP South, Jammu and overall supervision of SSP Jammu Chandan Kohli.

Two drug peddlers arrested with Ganja

JAMMU: Continuing its drive against drug trafficking and substance abuse, Gharota Police arrested two drug peddlers and recovered 113 gm Ganja from their possession. Police destroys 90 lts illicit Lahan

RAMBAN: To tighten noose on illegal preparation and illegal sale of illicit liquor under Operation Sanjeevani, Ramban police foiled manufacturing and illegal sale of illicit liquor by destroying 90 lts of Lahan and seized 4 lts of prepared illicit liquor and Desi Bathi at Brinji Chachwa.

As per details, Police Post Ind received an information through reliable source that one Thakar Dass, son of Jhoru, resident of Brinji, Chachwa is indulged in preparation of illicit liquor and is preparing illicit liquor by installing a Desi Bathi in a Nallah near his house. On this, a police party raided the spot and recovered 90 lts Lahan in 8 gallons, which was destroyed on the spot and seized 4 lts of prepared liquor along with items of still. FIR No 01/2022 under sections 48 (A,B,E,F) Excise Act was registered in Police Station Gool and investigation was entrusted to Incharge Police Post Ind. The overall recovery was made by PSI Khemraj Incharge Police Post Ind under supervision of Insp Mushtaq Ahmed SHO Gool & Nihar Ranjan, SDPO Gool and under overall supervision of Mohita Sharma, SSP Ramban.

Tourism Deptt recovers fine from erring hoteliers

20 bovines rescued, smuggler arrested

Transformer catches fire with explosion

Snatcher arrested, mobile recovered

As per details, a woman namely Parkasho Devi, wife of Bhagat Singh, resident of New Plot lodged a complaint with Bagh-e-Bahu Police that somebody had snatched mobile from her. Acting on the complaint, police lodged a case and during investigation nabbed a youth, identified as Goutam Mehra, resident of Rehari. Two mobile phones were also recovered from his possession.

Pre-arrest bail denied to fraudster who duped Rs 67 lakh

JAMMU: Additional Sessions Judge Kathua, Kamlesh Pandit rejected pre-arrest bail plea of Vijay Kumar, son of Jia Lal, resident of Salalpur, Kotpunnu Tehsil Marheen, District Kathua, who duped Rs 67 lakh on pretext of sale of land.

According to police case, complainants lodged a complaint with the concerned police station for registration of case against accused for fraudulently cheating them with regard to purchase of land tuning to Rs 67 lakh. Police report further revealed that complainants had purchased 66 Kanals land at village Chhaba Chak from accused @ 1.5 lakh per kanal regarding which an amount of Rs 67 lakh was paid in advance. It was further disclosed that 10 Kanals of land was got registered in favour of complainants but possession was not handed over to them and thereafter accused agreed to repay the submitted amount, but in this connection cheques issued in name of complainants were bounced as accused had no amount in bank. Accordingly, FIR No 103/2022 was registered for commission of offence under section 420 of IPC and investigation started.

The Court after hearing both the sides observed that accused has agreed to sell the land, which he was not possessing for a hefty consideration and had therefore guilty mind from very inception. "The exceptional jurisdiction of the court for grant of pre-arrest bail is for those who have regards for law and not for those, who disregard law and take it into their own hands, like in instant case at hand. More so, as investigation is in its initial stage and release of accused at this stage would definitely cause dent in investigation and also there is every apprehension that accused/applicant may repeat offence," the Court observed and rejected pre-arrest bail application.
