JAMMU: Lieutenant Governor Manoj Sinha on Wednesday inaugurated the State Data Centre at Civil Secretariat, Jammu.




The State Data Centre also provides flawless support for prominent e-Governance applications like e-Office, National Generic Document Registration System (NGDRS) etc.

Keep vigil on suspicious elements along Jammu-Srinagar NH: DGP to officers

JAMMU: Jammu and Kashmir Director General of Police (DGP) Dilbag Singh directed officers on Wednesday to beef up the security arrangements and keep a vigil on suspicious elements along the Jammu-Srinagar national highway.

Singh passed the directions during his visit to the Amarnath Yatra camps along the highway, ahead of the upcoming pilgrimage to the 3,880-metre-high holy cave shrine of Amarnath in the south Kashmir Himalayas.

The 43-day-long yatra is scheduled to start on June 30 from the twin routes -- the traditional 48-km Nunwan route in south Kashmir's Pahalgam and the 14-km short Baltal route in central Kashmir's Ganderbal -- after a gap of two years due to the coronavirus pandemic.

The police chief visited the yatra transit camps at Mir Bazaar, Walnut Factory and Lamber in Qazigund district of south Kashmir and Ramban district of the Jammu region and took stock of the security arrangements put in place for the pilgrims, according to a police spokesperson.

He said the DGP reviewed the security arrangements at the

the Navyug tunnel, connecting Qazigund and Banihal towns, and sought reports from the security deployments regarding arrangements and area domination along the national highway.

Interacting with the officers at different places, Singh directed for beefing up the security arrangements to ensure a smooth conduct of the annual pilgrimage.

He also directed the officers to further augment the security arrangements and keep a strict vigil on suspicious elements and movement along the highway and areas surrounding the yatra transit camps.

The DGP emphasised on increased coordination and communication among the forces for a quick response to the requirements for the

security and assistance of the pilgrims, the police spokesperson said.

Singh said the security grid needs to be strengthened and all important locations along the yatra route should be kept under round-the-clock surveillance.

He said all important places, including the "langars" (community kitchens) and parking lots, should be brought under the security cover and stressed on sharing of inputs among the agencies for preventive measures.

The DGP also directed for area domination and joint patrolling along the highway.

He discussed the traffic management on the highway, the only all-weather road linking Kashmir with the rest of the country, with the officers.

JAMMU: Coming down heavily on the BJP-led NDA government at the Centre for its failure to handle the situation in J&K, JKPCC Working President Raman Bhalla on Wednesday said alienation among people has increased manifold during eight years of BJP rule.

Addressing party workers at Model Town of Gandhi Nagar constituency, Bhalla said worst-ever misgovernance and misrule left the people of J&K in the lurch and the overall situation deteriorated in the Kashmir valley. Speaking on the occasion, Bhalla said BJP remained engaged in a tug of war during their entire period in office so far, which caused great harm to the secular and social fabric of J&K, he said, adding that the BJP has mastery of falsehood

and fake slogans and pursued destructive and divisive politics in the country. He said the Congress always strengthened democracy and countered the anti-national and anti-democracy forces at the cost of sacrifices. He said BJP, which targeted Congress and other parties over the displacement of Kashmiri Pandits in the 1990s, is in power at the Centre and is now answerable for the series of

killings in Kashmir under its rule.

While attacking BJP government at the centre, Bhalla said that since the change of guard happened in New Delhi, the prices of essential commodities have increased manifold. He claimed that after mirror shown to BJP in DDC elections where it could win only 75 out of 280 seats, it is day

dreaming and befooling people and BJP can never come to power in J&K again.

Taking a dig at LG Administration, Bhalla said, it is acting as the agent of the central government. He said, "The union government's policies are putting common people into trouble. He also said that the Prime Minister is not ready to address public issues, instead, keeps speaking in 'Mann ki Baat' programme.

He said that we are able to present our real inclusive face to the world of humanity.

"For lasting peace in J&K, we need to restore the communal harmony of our society which reflect the real inclusive face of Jammu & Kashmir."

"Kashmiri Hindus are the equal stakeholders of everything and those who are trying to create a vicious atmosphere to sabotage the rehabilitation & return of the displaced community are the enemies of humanity and don't belong to our inclusive cultural traditions. We cannot afford to let them succeed in their divisive terrorist mindset. Protection of minorities is not the responsibility of the government only but of the common majority community members too," said Waqf Board Chairperson.

Dr Darakhshan Andrabi assured the community leaders & representatives that everything will be done by the government to ensure their safety and their resettlement in Kashmir valley.

He appealed to the civil society groups and the religious preachers to emphasize on creating an atmosphere wherein the designs of subversive and communal & divisive elements are defeated and they are thrown out of our society so
