



# CRIME REPORT

## 9 more vehicles seized for illegal mining

SAMBHA: Police on Friday seized 9 more vehicles which were being used for illegal mining in district Samba.

As per details, police teams comprising of SHO Police Station Samba Rajeshwar Singh, SHO Police Station Purmandal Vijay Verma and Incharge Police Post SIDCO Samba Deepika Jalotra seized 9 vehicles being used for illegal mining at different locations in Samba district.

The seized vehicles were a tractor trolley (JK21B-1279) and 8 Tractor Trolleys without registration No.

## 2 drug peddlers arrested; contraband recovered

KULGAM/AWANTIPORA: Continuing its efforts to eradicate the menace of drugs from the society, Police on Friday arrested 2 drug peddlers in Kulgam & Awantipora and recovered contraband substance from their possession.

In Kulgam, a police party headed by SHO Police Station Devsar at a checkpoint established at Gund Tankipora intercepted a suspicious person identified as Umer Nazir Lone son of Nazir Ahmad Lone resident of Sonigam. During checking, 3 grams of Heroin like contraband substance was recovered from his possession. He has been arrested and shifted to police station where he remains in custody.

In Awantipora, a police party headed by Incharge Police Post Reshipora under the supervision of Incharge SDPO Awantipora at a checkpoint established at Panzgam Astampora Crossing intercepted a suspicious person identified as Ashik Hussain Dar son of Mohd Ashraf Dar resident of Panzgam Awantipora. During checking, 1 kg of Poppy Straw like contraband substance was recovered from his possession. He has been arrested and shifted to police station where he remains in custody.

Regarding the incidents, cases under relevant sections of law have been registered at respective police stations and investigations have been initiated.

## 12 theft cases solved; 5 arrested, stolen gold ornaments, other property over 15 lakhs recovered

NOWSHERA: In a major success, Police in Sub-division Nowshera of District Rajouri worked out twelve burglaries incidents / cases recovering stolen property and gold ornaments among others worth over 15 lakhs.

In an official statement, Rajouri police said that from 19th May to 23 May, 5 different complaints regarding burglaries were received at Nowshera police station and theft incidents were reported from villages of sub division including Bareri, Nonial, Chowki Handan and Nowshera Town PS Nowshera.

Later one more such complaint was received from village Thandapani of police station Sundarbarani.

In all these incidents, it was found during investigation that burglaries were committed while the owners were either attending some marriage functions or were out due to their social or religious commitments.

Following all this, different FIRs 110, 113, 114, 116, 117 of 2023 U/Ss 457/380 IPC were registered at Police Station Nowshera and a case in FIR 35/2023 U/Ss 457, 380 was registered at Police Station Sundarbarani.

The investigation of these cases was carried by different investigation officers of these police stations who include PSIs Vishal Sharma, Anis Choudhary and Vikas Khullar.

The Investigation team did strenuous efforts and after connecting various technical leads zeroed upon one suspect namely Rajesh Kumar and interestingly while investigating these cases technical evidences regarding the suspect Rajesh Kumar's involvement in previous burglaries reported at Police Station Nowshera came to fore.

Subsequently the suspect was picked by a team of Police Station Nowshera and put under sustained questioning during which he confessed his involvement in commission of different burglaries.

Upon his confessional disclosure recovery valuing around 10

Lakhs has been made by Police; solving 08 burglaries in Nowshera.

Presently the accused is in Police Custody and under questioning with expectations of more recoveries in future.

Mentionable that Nowshera Police during the month May also worked out 02 burglaries committed on National Highway 144-A in village Lambari wherein Stolen Properties of Groceries, Batteries among others valuing around 1 Lakh has been recovered upon confessional disclosure of 03 accused persons.

Moreover 02 Motor Vehicle Theft Cases too have been solved with recoveries valuing around 4 Lakhs and arrest of additional 2 accused persons.

SSP Rajouri; Amritpal Singh further stated that just a week ago, District Police Rajouri detained one notorious offender/Criminal/burglar namely Mohd Ashraf Khan, son of Mohd Hussain, resident of Kakora Tehsil Manjakote at present Nerajal Tehsil Thanamandi District Rajouri under Public Safety Act in District Jail Dhangri Rajouri under the Order of District Magistrate Rajouri.SSP said that District Police Rajouri, is committed to serve the general public upto their desires to ensure sense of security among them and to maintain peace in the District.

He further added that in future more efforts are on to solve all burglaries & theft cases.

## Three bovines smuggling attempts foiled, 49 bovines rescued, 3 smugglers arrested

REASI: Drive against bovines smuggling in District Reasi continues, teams of District Police Reasi laid special nakas, arrested 03 bovine smugglers while rescuing 49 bovines being illegally carried by them.

Team of Police Station laid a surprise naka at Bhal, Mahore Area during checking, intercepted one person namely Abdul Hamied, son of Sharief Shah, resident of Kanthi Tehsil Arnas District Reasi and rescued 08 bovines from his possession. In this regard, FIR No. 54/2023 U/S 188 IPC has been registered at Police Station Mahore and investigation initiated.

In another incident Team of Police Station Mahore during surprise naka checking foiled bovines smuggling attempt at Banda Nar, Mahore area during checking, intercepted a person namely Javaid Shah, son of Mohd Shaffi, resident of Bharnali Thuroo who is going towards Kashmir along with 10 Bovines animals, during enquiries DM permission was not found. In this regards, a case FIR No. 55/2023 U/S 188 IPC has been registered at Police Station Mahore and investigation initiated.

While foiling another incident of bovines smuggling, Police team of SPP Khour intercepted one bovine smuggler namely Anjad Ali, son of Haji Mohd Sadiq, resident of Anantnag and rescued 31 bovines from his possession. In this regard, FIR No. 56/2023 U/S 188 IPC stands registered at Police Station Mahore and accused got arrested in the said case.

## ARTO Reasi challans 115 vehicles

REASI: A Team led by ARTO Reasi today conducted an enforcement drive on the Moori route. During the drive the team checked 115 vehicles.

As many as 62 vehicles were found to be operating in contravention of various provisions of the Motor Vehicles Act and were issued challans.

An amount of Rs 1,47,000 fine was realized on the spot and Rs 2,76,000 is expected to be realised out of challan imposed. 56/193, 194 (1), 194A, 194B, 66/192, 177, 192A, 181 and 03 sleeper coaches and 01 mini bus were seized.

The drive specifically targeted overloading and overcharging in vehicles and aimed to raise awareness among vehicle operators.

## Mentally disturbed person handed over family

On this, team of Border Police Post Chakrohi brought the person to Border Police Post Chakrohi and offered him meals.

After this special police teams of Border Police Post Chakrohi led

by SDPO R.S Pura Nikhil Gogna assisted by SHO R. S Pura Inspr Pawan Kumar and In-Charge Border Police Post Chakrohi PSI Ishaq Ahmed Kasana did strenuous efforts and finally found out that the person belongs to West Bengal. After this concerned Police Station Bagnan West Bengal was contacted officially for his verification and family of the said person was contacted. The family of the person disclosed that the above mentioned person is mentally unsound and had gone missing from his home.

Finally his mother Ashta Bhounik came at BPP Chakrohi and he was handed over to his mother after completing all the legal formalities.

## Missing person traced, reunited with family

Subsequently family of the missing person was informed and he was handed over to his family members after completing all the legal formalities.

## 15 vehicles involved in illegal mining seized

JAMMU: In a quest to stem the menace of illegal mining, a multi-pronged strategy was devised by Jammu Police in which a team of Police Stations Bishnah, Nagrota, Police Posts Phallain Mandal and Chatha acted stringently on the specific inputs and raided at a location in their respective area and seized 15 vehicles involved in illegal mining.

The vehicle seized include one dumper (JK02CW-1030) by Bishnah Police; one tractor trolley without registration No by Nagrota Police; 8 tractor trolleys bearing Chassis Nos. MBNBG55AAKCP75777, MBNBG55AAKCP87625, JK02CH-7585, JK02DA-6458, VAD550019943, JZCDJ120826283, AZCDRI04765983 and MBNALALIT-BLRLX00777, by Phallain Mandal police and 5 vehicles i.e Four Tractor Trolleys one bearing Engine No 008009402, two bearing Registration No JK02DC-4744, JK02DQ-5447 and Two Tractor Trolleys bearing Chassis no MBNAKK49AHPTE00809 and MBNBEB-BAZNN04258, by PP Chatha

The recoveries were made by SHO Bishnah Inspr Vikram Sharma, SHO Nagrota Inspr Vishav Partap Singh, In-Charge Police Posts Phallain Mandal PSI Ajesh Singh Jamwal and Chatha-PSI Harjinder Paul Singh in their respective jurisdiction.

## Misappropriated property valuing around Rs 25,000 recovered; accused arrested

NOWSHERA: Police on Friday arrested a person alongwith misappropriated property of a Government department.

Police said that a written application was received at Police Station Nowshera from Incharge of GREFF DETT Lam in which it was complained that one of the employee of DETT namely Manzoor Hussain son of Mir Hussain resident of Jagote Kandoh, Tehsil Qila Darhal, who has been working as Chowkidaar at Thandikassi location of department, has deliberately committed breach of trust and illegally sold 59 bags of cement to Mohd Riaz son of Mohd Khan resident of Pukharni of Tehsil Qila Darhal.

Upon receipt of this complaint, a criminal case in FIR 130/2023 U/Ss 409, 411 IPC was registered at Police Station Nowshera and investigation was taken up by Incharge Police Post Lam PSI Kimal Bhargav.

During investigation one of the accused namely Mohd Riaz son of Mohd Khan resident of Pukharni was arrested and misappropriated received stolen property was recovered and a vehicle Tractor bearing registration Number JK11F 7953 used for commission of crime was seized in the instant case.

Efforts are on to nab the nominated another accused person in the case.

There is likelihood of more arrests in the instant case as investigation moves on, said police.

## Four killed in separate mishaps

JAMMU: Four persons were killed in separate road mishaps on Friday.

According to the information, an eco van (HP74-5358) collided with a motorcycle (JK14F-0810) coming from the opposite direction in Dhaima area of Majalra tehsil late last night, as a result two youths riding the motorcycle got injured. They were immediately brought to the nearest hospital, where they were declared dead. The deceased were identified as Vinod Kumar, son of Sumak Ram, resident of Bilaspur and Prakash Kumar, son of Kaka Ram, resident of Pathwar. After the post-mortem of the dead body, the bodies were handed over to the families for the last rites. Majalra police have registered a case and started investigation.

In another instance, a vehicle hit a Rajasthan resident Banveer Singh in Greater Kailash area in which he got injured. He was taken to the hospital where doctors declared him brought dead.

Similarly, in Vijaypur area, Suresh Verma, son of Shiv Ram, resident of Uttar Pradesh who was living in Vijaypur these days received burn injuries in his house. He was admitted to the hospital, but he has died during treatment.

## Sex racket busted, four arrested
