JKPCC conducts public hearing

■ STATE TIMES NEWS JAMMU: A Public Hearing was organized on Monday at Panchayat Ghar, Dhok Khalsa, Akhnour for 5/22, 5/23, 5/24 and 5/26 minor mineral Blocks situated at Jad Khud in terms of Environment Impact Assessment (EIA) Notification, 2006 of Ministry of Environment, Forest and Climate Change, Government of India for eliciting view-points and suggestions of the locals and other stakeholders for renewal of environmental clearance of minor mineral mining project for above mentioned blocks. The panel of Public Hearing was headed by Harvinder Singh, Additional DC Jammu and comprised Dr. Gulshan Kumar, District Mineral Officer, Geology and Mining department Jammu, Bader Hussain, Divisional Officer JK PCC Udhampur representing Regional Director JKPC Jammu and Anil Sharma, Divisional Officer, JKPC Jammu North. The Additional DC Jammu gave a patient hearing to the issues raised during the public hearing and assured the gathering that mining will be carried out in legal, scientific and transparent manner. He also assured that all the important points raised by the people during the public hearing are recorded and sent to Competent Authority i.e. JKELAA for consideration so that those issues are appropriately addressed before the grant of Environmental Clearance. Anil Sharma, Divisional officer, PCC Jammu North in his opening address apprised the general public that the purpose of conducting public hearing was to hear the views of the people of surrounding areas regarding the mining block for renewal of Environmental Clearance. Dr. Gulshan Kumar, DMO Jammu informed that the current public hearing is for the grant of renewal of EC for above blocks and replied to the queries raised by the public during the proceedings. Bader Hussain, Divisional Officer, Pollution Control Committee, Udhampur represented on behalf of Regional Office, JKPC Jammu also briefed the participants during the public hearing. The public representatives including Vice Chairman DDC Jammu, Suraj Singh Bhanu and DDC Member Bharat Bhushan Baral, Sarpanches, Naib Sarpanch, Ex-Sarpanches and other prominent citizens also presented their viewpoints and suggestions before the panel. Project Consultant of M/s Vitasta Enviro Services Pvt Ltd Jaipur, gave the details about salient features of the EIA and mining project for block no. 22/5 whereas M/s P and M Solutions Noida, UP for block no. 5/23, 5/24 and 5/26. Vote of thanks to the chair was presented by Dimple Sharma, FI Divisional Officer PCC Jammu North. In addition to the Public Hearing programme, a pledge was taken to promote Mission Life Campaign 2023.

DC Doda reviews status of routine immunization

■ STATE TIMES NEWS It was reported that from 1st April 2022 to 31 March this year, 7552 live births were reported in the district and are being followed for 100% routine immunization. He said that efforts are being made to cover the dropouts in the process. The Deputy Commissioner enjoined upon the CMO and all the concerned to work in close coordination to make the Routine Immunization programme successful in the District. He asked to put in extra measures to ensure that no measles case appears among children in the district and all the left out children are immunized. He further asked the field staff including Anganwadi Workers, ASHAs, Health workers, Teachers and other stakeholders to synergise their efforts to create awareness about measles and other such diseases & to reduce dropout to 0% under the routine immunization in the district. The DC directed the stakeholders and those present in the meeting to conduct special immunization sessions in the left out areas to cover all drop out children in a time bound manner.

■ STATE TIMES NEWS DODA: Reaching out to the people at their door steps to provide them better healthcare facilities, the Health Department organized a day long free AYUSH and NCD screening camp at Government Primary Health Centre Gundna. The camp was organised as a part of Azadi Ka Amrit Mahotsav and Adhbt Doda initiative of District Administration. Around 110 patients were examined for different ailments with NCD screening by the health team. Medicines were also provided to the people free of cost.
