

CRIMEREPORT

5 drug peddlers arrested; contraband recovered

SRINAGAR: Continuing its efforts to eradicate the menace of drugs from the society, police on Monday arrested 05 drug peddlers in various instances and recovered contraband/psychotropic substances from their possession.

As per details, a party of Police Station Kreeri at a checkpoint established at Wanigam Kreeri arrested two drug peddlers identified as Mohd Shafi Hajam son of Nazir Ahmad Hajam & Shabir Ahmad Khan son of Samunder Khan, both residents of Wanigam Kreeri. During search, 18 Kgs of Poppy Straw was recovered from their possession.

Meanwhile, a party of Police Post Delina at a checkpoint established at Janbazpora Baramulla arrested a drug peddler identified as Zubair Ahmad Shah son of Ali Mohammad Shah resident of Janbazpora. During search, 81 tablets of SpasmoProxyvon were recovered from his possession.

Moreover, in Kulgam, a party of Police Station Devsar at a checkpoint established at Tankipora arrested a drug peddler identified as Mohd Ashraf Malik resident of Hablshii. During search, 80 grams of Charas was recovered from his possession.

Similarly, in Awantipora, a party of Police Post Reshipora headed by IC PP Reshipora at a checkpoint established at Panzgam Oudipora Crossing, arrested a drug peddler identified as Muzaffar Ahmad Wagay son of Gh Ahmad Wagay resident of Oudipora Panzgam Awantipora. During search, 13.5 Kgs of Poppy Straw was recovered from his possession.

All the arrested drug peddlers have been shifted to respective police stations and cases under relevant sections of law have been registered & investigation has been taken up.

6 arrested, as many vehicles seized for illegal extraction & transportation of minerals

Baramulla: Acting tough against the persons involved in illegal extraction and transportation of minerals, police have arrested 6 persons and seized as many vehicles in Baramulla.

As per details, a party of Police Station Kunzer under the supervision of SDPO Tangnarg seized 03 vehicles (tippers) and arrested 03 persons for illegal extraction and transportation of minerals at Bungam Kunzer. They have been identified as Nisar Ahmad Malik son of Ab Hamid resident of Pariswani, Shabir Ahmad Ganie son of Gh Qadir resident of Ratnipora & Firdous Ahmad Magray son of Gh Rasool resident of Chandil Wanigam.

Moreover, a party of Police Post Mirgund seized 03 vehicles (tippers) and arrested 03 persons for illegal extraction and transportation of minerals at Khanpeth. They have been identified as Parvaiz Ahmad Reshi son of Gh Ahmad Reshi resident of Hanjiwera, Umar Nabi Parray son of Gh Nabi Parray resident of Gokhama Kunzer & Jahangir Ahmad Shah son of Gh Hassan Shah resident of Batpora Kunzer.

Accordingly, cases under relevant sections of law have been registered in respective police stations and further investigations have been initiated.

SPO restores cash, ATM card to owner; people appreciates move

59 bovines rescued, 7 smugglers arrested

REASI: Police on Monday arrested 7 bovine smugglers and rescued 59 bovines being illegally carried by them.

Team of Police Station Mahore laid a surprise naka at Khatazi, Mahore Area during checking, intercepted one person namely Shamas din, son of Ghulam Din, resident of Lar Mahore Tehsil Mahore District Reasi and rescued 30 bovines from his possession. FIR No. 60/2023 under sections 188 IPC has been registered at Police Station Mahore and investigation initiated.

In another incident, a team of Police Post Thanole rescued 12 Bovines at Jij Top from the clutches of Bovine Smuggler namely Mohd. Latif, son of Suba, resident of Chakalsata Tehsil Thakrakote Distt - Reasi who was carrying bovines by foot towards Srinagar without DM permission. In FIR No. 60/2023 under section 188 IPC has been registered at Police Station Arnas and accused arrested.

While foiling another incident of bovines smuggling, a team of SPP Chillad res-

cued 9 bovines at Lapri Top from the clutches of Bovine Smuggler namely Gulzar Ahmed, son of Abdul Aziz, resident of Hunder Tehsil Arnas who was carrying bovines by foot towards Srinagar without DM permission. Accused was arrested and FIR No 59/2023 under section 188 IPC has been registered against him at Police Station Arnas.

In another incident, a team of Police Post Dera Baba rescued 4 bovines at Chappanoo from the clutches of bovine smuggler Alaf Hussain, son of Ghulam Hussain, resident of Chapanoo Tehsil and District Reasi and Co-driver namely Hem Raj, son of Bhagat Ram, resident of Chub Tehsil And District Ramban who was carrying bovines by Mahindra Load Carrier (JK02CK/4650) without DM's permission. Duo was arrested and FIR No. 127/2023 under section 188 IPC was registered against them at Police Station Reasi.

In another incident, team of Police Post Dera Baba rescued 4 bovines at Naka Chappanoo from the clutches of bovine smuggler Abdul Majid, son of Ahmed Khan, resident of Chapanoo and Co Driver Jeevan Singh, son of Kunj Lal, resident of Ganote Tehsil And Distt Ramban who was carrying bovines by vehicle bearing (JK02CG-9989) without DM's permission. Duo was arrested and FIR No 128/2023 under section 188 IPC has been registered at Police Station Reasi.

South Jammu police recovers 40 stolen phones, handed over to owners

Girl among two found hanging

3 person arrested, 3.8 Kg Charas recovered

RAJOURI: Police on Monday arrested three local people recovering a consignment of Charas like substance from their possession which was being smuggled in Rajouri town.

Senior Superintendent of Police Rajouri, Amritpal Singh said that on the basis of a specific information regarding possible drugs smuggling attempt, a team of police headed by Deputy SP Headquarter Rajouri Mudassar Hussain alongwith SHO Rajouri Mohammad Showket Chowdhary and officials of anti drugs squad laid nakas at multiple places. During a similar naka at Darhali bridge, an Ecco vehicle JK11E 2798 was intercepted which was put to frisking but the behaviour of three passengers travelling in the vehicle became suspicious on police frisking which raised suspicion.

Over this, SSP Rajouri said, thorough search of vehicle was conducted in presence of Executive Magistrate during which a hidden portion was found in the co-drive seat window of vehicle and a consignment of drugs was found in it.

He said that a total of 3.8 KGs of Charas like substance has been recovered from the vehicle and three travellers of the vehicle have been arrested.

They have been identified as Ghulam Jeelani son of Mohd Bashir resident of Chowdhary Nar, Anjad Iqbal son of Mohd Azam resident of Rehtal and Wajid Mehmood son of Mohd Razaq resident of Dhanore Loharan.

A case under relevant sections of law have been registered in Rajouri police station while the recovered consignment was being smuggled towards Rajouri from Kashmir valley.

2 injured as ex-serviceman opens fire over land dispute

KATHUA: Two people were injured when an ex-serviceman allegedly opened fire from his licensed 12-bore gun during a land dispute in Kathua district on Monday, police said. The accused, Ranjit Singh, fled the scene after the incident reported from Pattan Barrian village and efforts are on to nab him, they added.

Police said Rishi Sharma and Sumit Sharma, both residents of Patel Nagar in Kathua, were injured in the firing and hospitalised.

A case under the relevant sections of law was registered against the accused, police said.

Woman critically injured in bear attack

UDHAMPUR: A 40-year-old woman was critically injured on Monday after being attacked by a wild bear in the Udhampur district, a police official said.

Identified as Mori Devi, the woman was attacked by the animal near her house in Kulyar village of the Panchari area early this morning, the official said.

Devi has suffered serious injuries in the face and arms. She was rushed to hospital by the villagers who came to her rescue after hearing her cries.

The wildlife protection department has fanned out its teams in the nearby forest to capture the bear, the official said.

Old mortar shell recovered

Uttarakhand tourist dies in fire incident in Pahalgam

SRINAGAR: An elderly tourist from Uttarakhand died while four others were injured after a fire broke out at a hotel in Pahalgam in Anantnag district on Monday, officials said. She has been identified as Bhupinder Gill (75), a resident of Dehradun, they said. Four employees of the hotel received injuries while dousing off the flames. The cause of the fire is being ascertained, the officials said.

23 injured as vehicle overturns in Kathua

KATHUA/JAMMU: At least 23 people were injured on Sunday when their vehicle overturned in Kathua district, police said. The injured were rushed to sub-district hospital Basohli where the condition of five of them is stated to be "serious", police officials said. The victims were returning home from a temple in a load carrier when the accident took place near Kashid village in the Basohli area in the evening, they said. The driver lost control while negotiating a curve and as a result the vehicle overturned, the officials said.

2 Kg heroin recovered on accused's disclosure

POONCH: In continuation with the investigation of FIR No. 77/2023 under sections 13/18/UAPA 4/5 ESA was registered at Police Station Poonch, whereas during the sustained Questioning, the accused Mohd Rashid, son of Badar Din disclosed that two packets containing approximately 02 kgs heroin like substance kept hidden in open forest area near his village house at Bagyaladara. As per disclosure IO DySp Mohd Shafiq DySp Dar Poonch along with party, alongwith army and Executive Magistrate Ist Class Poonch recovered 02 packets approximately 02 Kg Herion like substance on the identification of place in Bagyaladara Kalsian forest area. Offences under 8/21/22/29 NDPS Act added in the instant Case. The investigation of the case is going on. The recovery was made under the overall supervision of SSP Poonch Vinay Sharma. Pertinent to mention here that two grenades and Rs 7 lakh cash was also recovered in the same case.
