

Weekly Block Diwas: DC Rajouri listens to public grievances; assures early redressal

RAJOURI: As a part of the weekly Block Diwas, Deputy Commissioner Rajouri, Vikas Kundal on Wednesday presided over a public outreach camp at Gurdan Bala in block Rajouri to redress the public grievances at their doorsteps.

He assured them that their problems would be addressed on a priority basis and directed the concerned officials to take necessary action. Among others, DDC member Rajouri, sain Abdul Rashid; BDC chairperson Darbar Choudahary; CPO, Mohammad Khurshed; ACP, Sheraz Chowhan; DSWO, Wakeel Ahmed Bhat; Tehsildar Rajouri, Varinder Sharma; EXEN STD Kalakote, Hasan Mohd were present on the occasion.

The camp witnessed a good turnout, with people from various parts of the block

coming forward to voice their concerns. The issues raised by the locals included the macadamization of roads, upgradation of Govt. Institutions, shortage of staff and augmentation of health infrastructure, shortage of electricity poles, boundary wall of HS Gurdan Bala, dilapidated condition of MS Dhanore, compensation for the BGSBU road, non-functioning of borewell at Chawwa besides others.

The Deputy Commissioner assured time bound redressal of issues. For shortage of electricity poles, DC assured

that the same would be provided under the RDSS scheme of the PDD sector. Regarding scarcity of water, he assured that all households of the district would be provided with tapped water connection with the implementation of JJM in the district. Officers from the Horticulture Department were directed to organise special camps in the area to educate the public about their schemes. Public also appreciated District Administration for taking prompt measures for the redressal of their genuine concerns in a time bound

manner. Officers also educated the public about various schemes of their departments and motivated them to avail the benefits of the same.

The DC appreciated the Health Department for institutional deliveries under Kaya Kalp Schemes. He also mentioned that JJM schemes are progressing well. Entrance test for EMRs Gurdhan Balla was conducted last week with massive participation of students.

EMRs would be a milestone in the development of the area. Services are being provided through online mode & efforts are being made to provide benefits of these schemes to all deserving beneficiaries. Several Connectivity projects have been completed and many are under execution. Public participation is a must in the development process. Several initiatives are being taken for the tribal people welfare, meeting paucity of staff in Government institutions and augmentation of health infrastructure etc.

Issue of construction of approach road to bridge in Dehote Panchayat, posting of doctor and installation of Ultrasound & X-Ray machine at PHC Ransoo, posting of

staff in NTPHC Dheote were also raised by the PRIs and general public. Demand regarding early start of work of Water Supply Scheme Ransoo sanctioned and allotted for 300 households was also projected.

The issues regarding Road from Ransoo to Kanda were also highlighted and the DC directed the executing agency to start repair and

restoration of the road. Issue regarding incomplete boundary wall and old structure of the Government High school Dehote was also projected during the block Diwas and on spot directions were issued to the execution agency complete the boundary wall as projected under DDC Grant, while the Executive Engineer, PWD(R&B) was asked to furnish a

report on the condition of the old structure. Demand of Mobile toilets at Ransoo, provision of water tankers on a weekly basis for Sangar area and release of pending land compensation were also projected during the block Diwas.

Earlier, the DC also inspected ongoing works of Jal Jeevan Mission (JJM) schemes in far-flung Panchayat Allya and Dehote of Pouni Tehsil bordering Rajouri District. The scheme envisages retrofitting and Augmentation of Water Supply Scheme Allya FHTC 157 & Retrofitting and Augmentation of Water Supply Scheme Theru Sujanpur FHTC 480. The DC directed the executing agencies to expedite the completion of the work.
