The industrial visit presented the students with an opportunity to underthe procedures involved during manufacturing processes of pesticides and PGR, the technology and

equipments/machinery, production unit, packaging unit, Safety unit, waste disposal methods and quality control department in the industry. The students also witnessed various processes
