STATE TIMES NEWS JAMMU: Jammu Kashmir Sharnarthi Action Committee (JKSAC) urged upon Manoi K. Sinha Lt. Governor UT of J&K to advise Principal Secy. Revenue to initiate the process for issuance of notification to provide legal rights to DPs of 1947 from POJK over the plot/lands under their dwellings in different regularized colonies across the Jammu region as announced by him on 9th Oct. 2022 and on 6th March 2023 during inauguration of LG Governance Camp at Bhour Camp Jammu.

The DPs who are settled in different govt. recognized colonies are demanding legal rights over the lands under their dwellings from the past several decades.

Addressing DPs in a meeting held at village Rohi Jammu, Gurdev Singh President expressed his anguish for inordinate delay in issuance of Notification as per above said announcement made by LG. It is pertinent

to mention here that even the Revenue administration has also expressed its ignorance for any such direction. He said that it is most unfortunate that even in today's time hollow slogans are being made to keep the DPs in humor. He warned the govt. that mere sloganeering will not serve any purpose until and unless concrete steps are not taken on ground. He apprised the partici-

pants in the meeting that JKSAC is consistently raising the issue with Govt. and its administration from the past several years to mutate the land individually under their dwellings. He questioned the govt. that if the legal rights have been granted to DPs over their allotted Evacuee as well as State land under Section 3-A and 254-C of 1965, then why the small pieces of land under their houses having the same sta-

tus are not being regular-

ized/mutated in their names

and the issue has been kept

hanging unnecessarily.

He further said that after disbursal of the camps they were resettled on different locations across Jammu region over the evacuee lands as well as state lands. With the passage of time by dint of their hard work they raised Pacca houses on such lands. He said that DPs have faced and are facing many difficulties in the absence of legal rights over the land under dwellings as they cannot mortgage their lands/houses from financial institutions to obtain loan as per their

He appealed to the Governor to give due consideration to this burning issue of DPs and direct the authorities for issuance of notification granting legal rights to DPsrepeatedly announced.
