
















WORLD ENVIRONMENT DAY - 5th June 2023



Globally about 300 million tonnes of plastic is produced annually, and half of which is thrown away. Only 10% to 13% of plastic products are recycled globally. According to official estimates, Jammu & Kashmir produces about 23,000 MT of plastic waste annually, out of which almost 40% is non-recyclable waste. The collection and disposal of plastic waste is a challenge and, in many towns, almost 25% of the plastic waste remains uncollected. Jammu & Kashmir is known for its natural beauty which translates into bigger tourist footfall supporting local livelihood. The conservation of the natural environs and the reduction of pollution especially plastic pollution are crucial for the long-term sustainability of the ecosystem and economy. The theme for this year thus holds immense significance in the local context. The government has launched Mission LiFE, under the guidance of the Hon'ole Prime Minister, which emphasizes on reducing the usage of plastics by the people.

In this context, I would also like to highlight the impact of climate change that we are witnessing even in this part of the country, manifesting as unseasonal rainfall. Message

Today as we celebrate World Environment Day, let us all peuse for a moment and reflect on the ramifications of our collective action and inaction on the fate of our planet. Consumed by our daily workloads, we chose to disregard the impact of our actions on the ability of Earth to sustain life. Considering that there is no other alternative for life to exist, what we do today will go on to define the fate of our future generations. Every year, the United Nations, through the theme of World Environment Day, draws the attention of people to an issue of environmental importance, and this year's theme - "Solutions to Plastic Pollution" laws emphasis on plastic pollution.

Plastics have become an integral part of our daily life. However, the use of plastics, particularly the single use plastics, has created a culture of trash. This culture is contrary to our tradition of living in harmony with nature. Resultantly, today a whopping 35 takh tonnes of plastic waste is generated annually in the country, of which approximately only 50 per cent is recycled. It is important to appreciate that not all plastics can be recycled. The multi-layered plastics used as packets for consumer goods are not recycledic and hence mostly burnt, causing air pollution. Likewise, Single-use plastics, like plastic bags, straws, coffee stimers, water bottles and most food packaging constitute approximately half of all plastic waste. This is the major menace that afficis us collectively. The silver living however is that our per-capita plastic consumption is low at 13.6 kg, as compared to 108 kg in the U.S., 56 kg in China, and 30 kg globally.

The UT of Jammu and Kashmir is blessed with unparalleled scenic beauty. Littering of landscape and waterscape by plastic waste deteriorates the quality of these natural assets. While the government has enacted a ban on single-use plastics from July 1, 2022, the effective implementation of this ban would not be possible without the cooperation of people. It thus, not only requires our collective effort but also our collective resolve. We have to consciously endeavor to bring about change in our behavior to reverse this habit of use and throw. Honoring our commitment to the future generations, I request and urge one and all to go from "Free Plastic to Plastic Free".
